well good evening and welcome to another Wednesday night Bible study we are up to Psalm chapter a Psalm 24 this evening and we'll just cover the one Psalm probably take us about maybe about half an hour or so so we'll have more time for Q&A and pastor Marie will be joining us for the chat at CGI church online org so we'll be able to answer your questions and talk with you there actually no I apologize he'll dial in and we'll be able to talk live answer any questions live so any questions that you do pose on the chat we'll be able to Marie and I will discuss them together so let's open with a word of Prayer and we'll get into tonight's Psalm our Heavenly Father we paused again to acknowledge you to praise you - thank you Father we thank you for these beautiful Psalms we thank you for King David and then the other psalmist's who've been able to take their love for you their praise for you and to articulate it in this beautiful Hebrew poetry and we thank you Father that thousands of years later we have access to these beautiful words and we can learn how to praise you how to pray to you and how to remain faithful regardless of outward circumstances we thank you lord we ask that you bless our

study that you'll bless all those who tune in life as well as those who are tuned into the archive are not only you know now but maybe years from now as the world changes that these studies will become a useful resource to those who access them in the future we praise you Lord we thank you and we ask this blessing in Jesus Most Holy Name Amen so we're up to Psalm 24 and let me just sorry I just thought a note here give me one moment and hopefully you can hear me okay and let me just see here maybe I'll just wait for confirmation that my volume is good I'm just going to turn it up a little bit

I don't want it distort it but I'll just look for some confirmation that the volume is good and in the meantime I'll just continue so last time I just want to remind you of a structure that we looked at last time and it's here in some 19 to 23 and I was just emphasizing at the time the position of some 23 in the psaltery and we call the way back to Psalm 1 but we just picked it up from Psalm 19 where Psalm 19 is all about the Creator the creator of heavens and earth and aligning ourselves with the true god of this massive universe that that praises him and that all is in alignment with him we want to align ourselves with that God not false gods and then we saw in Psalms 20 and 21 these royal Psalms that were really emphasizing the the might of God and the true God and and that this God will save and act on behalf of the king and that the king must be saved in order for God to confirm his promises to Israel and God not to go back on his covenant this covenant keeping God will not go back on his covenant and therefore the key

answers to prayer or the the prayers for the king must be heard and that the king really is a proxy for the true king of Israel that King David as much as the Psalms center around his life that he really is a proxy for the king of Israel the true king of Israel and then we saw that in Psalm 22 was really a prophetic Psalm as much as again as it was about King David's life it was a prophetic that ultimately pointed to the sacrifice of Christ and that that sacrifice was how he would conquer the enemies of Israel and how he would at the same time restore Israel and and be able to fulfill his covenant with Israel and then we said you know Psalm 23 is strategically positioned and coupled with Psalm 22 Psalm 2021 and also Psalm 19 that it really tells a narrative that this God of the universe comes through in his creation and acts on behalf mightily on behalf of Israel and then Psalm 23 shows the inner workings of the Messiah his inner thoughts that just like David never ever ever did he doubt his father that he knew that the father would not forsake him that the father would be with him that when he was on the cross and he says my God my God why have you forsaken me he wasn't thinking at the moment of his victory when he and God the Father decided that this was the mission and this is the only way the Covenant mission could be carried out and they decided that Christ would go that at the moment of his triumph when he conquered all the hatred in the world and all the hatred of the devil through his his covenant love for Israel and that he went to slaughter without saying a word as a lamb taken to the slaughter that in that moment of victory the mission is accomplished that at that

very moment God the Father would turn his back on him and forsake him that this know this doesn't make sense what does make sense is he was saying my God my God why have you forsaken me in order to basically say take your Bibles and turn to the Book of Psalms chapter 22 and begin at verse 1 and so that's what the disciples would have done when they hear him say that they would know okay we've got to go to that Psalm and they would look at that Psalm and look at everything that they just witnessed Jesus Christ go through and see it's all right there pre-recorded in the psalm and they would realize truly this is the Messiah for Israel so now we come to some twenty four and what I want to argue is that Psalm 24 is is the conclusion of this narrative that really begins in Psalm 19 and we can now conclude it in Psalm 24 so let's read Psalm 24 in this view of it being strategically placed in the psaltery so that it goes from the god of creation the the king the royalty of the royal Psalms the sacrifice of the the Messiah the confidence the Messiah had that even in that moment of deep deep darkness that he would fear no evil knowing that the father is with him and that he would he God will set a table before him in the presence of his enemies so while he's there on the cross God is setting a table before him in the presence of his enemies that at the height of Satan's hatred God's love conquers that God's love is manifested at that very point that that low point on the cross when he's being crucified when all of the hatred of the devil and the devil's puppets are being railed at him and he is being faithful even unto death because of his covenant love this is the

most this is this is triumph this is victory and this is the moment of triumph of love over evil love over hate and so now we come to this final passage or final song of final Psalm in this strategically placed structure and so we'll go ahead and read that together and just sorry give me a moment I need to I was just rushing here and I didn't get a chance to structure my so I'm just gonna put this up for you for now so you can just familiarize yourself with the structure cause Psalm 24 goes at the end of this and while you're looking at that what I'm going to be doing is cleaning up the scriptural reference so that is clean just give me a moment to take a look at that while I just cleaned this up and again just if you do have questions for a pastor Marie and I will be able to entertain those at the end of the study so please think about any questions or comments or concerns that you might have and will be able to answer them or we'll attempt to answer them at the end of this study so let me just get this working properly I'm almost there give me one more minute here so many moving pieces to make this all work but we will get it to work okay so I want to before going to Psalm 24 actually want to go back to the very beginning and that is in Genesis 1 so in Genesis 1 verse 1 we see that in the beginning God created the heavens and the earth and the earth was toha wopo whoo it was chaotic and just with avoidant and chaos that's how it was or it became really it's the earth became Tohu Wabo whoo and darkness was upon the face of the deep or the waters and the Spirit of God moved upon the face of the waters so basically what we see here is for some

reason and we understand this the world became chaotic and the world was just vain it was door that the whole area though the heavens and the earth were Tohu and bohu and then this god of creation stepped in and imposed order on the chaos and so we go through the six days of creation followed by the Sabbath and everything is restoral everything is restored into a state of order from disorder and from chaos so that's the context that we come into Psalm 24 with and we see here in Psalm 24 a psalm of David so we know that David wrote this one the earth is the Lord's and the fullness thereof it's a statement of affirmation and it comes after the chaos of Psalm 22 that in Psalm 22 we have evil at its height the very same evil be could be in the beginning in Genesis 1 when the earth became Tohu waboku chaos and void that that was the work of the devil and then God restored order and then the devil has been working working working and reintroducing chaos into the creation and that climaxed in the crucifixion of the Messiah and so the Messiah came to earth and Satan thought this is this is the Messiah I have the upper hand I'm now going to to slay the son of God and I will be triumphant and as he rallied all of his power and slew the Messiah and thought that he was victorious in fact it was his slaying of the Messiah that made the Messiah victorious that proved that love conquers evil that the light conquers the darkness and at that moment the chaos is declared over and God now moves on the heels of this triumph resurrected from the grave he now moves to restore order so the same process that we see in the beginning when the heavens and the

earth were Tohu waboku and now the earth again has returned to Tahoe boohoo however from the resurrection we now have the process of order being imposed on the chaos and light conquering the darkness and so there's this very confident statement of affirmation that the earth is the Lord's we may have been fooled to think it belonged to the beasts powers because they were certainly acting like it behaved belong to them and now through the conquest of the Sun we can make this very strong affirmation and declaration that the earth is the Lord's and the fullness thereof the world and they that dwell therein now we have no doubt that all of this belongs to God and this Psalm again we say Psalms were very heavily quoted in the New Testament and Paul quotes this very Psalm in first Corinthians 10 26 that the earth is the lord's and the fullness thereof and he uses that Psalm

support an argument that he's making there to the Corinthians but the psalm actually is quoting the Torah and in Deuteronomy 10 and verse 14 we see in the Torah behold the heaven and the heaven of heavens is the Lord your God so your God the God of Jacob owns the heavens the earth also and all that therein is so we must never be fooled we must never doubt no matter what glory we see the the kings of the earth demonstrate we must be crystal clear the earth is the Lord's now we know that the Lord is Jesus that Jesus Christ is the creator of the universe and John brings that out in his gospel in John 1:1 where he says in the beginning that very beginning that we just looked at in Genesis 1 when the earth was tofua bohu and the Lord moved

to impose order in that beginning was the word and the Word was with God and the Word was God so we have God and we have the word and the Word was with God and the Word was God the same was in the beginning with God so before all of the creation that Moses writes up in Genesis 1 there was God and from the very beginning the Word was with God and the Word was God all things listen to this all things were made by him so everything that we see and again we when when we were studying Psalm 19 we looked at the vastness of the observable universe and the scientists themselves when we when we get to that full grasp of how big in 93 billion light years in diameter how big the the observable universe is what the scientists are saying is they believe that this is a space in the actual universe it's just that that the light of the stars and the planets that go beyond the observable universe it will never reach earth light light doesn't travel fast enough to get to the earth for us to be able to observe it the creator of this vast universe is Jesus Christ and John tells us that nothing was made that he did not create so so God the Father delegated the act of creation to Jesus Christ everything was made by him and without him was not anything made that was made so nothing was made without Jesus Christ this is the power of the Lord back to Psalm 24 for he has founded it upon the Seas and established it upon the floods so again he imposed order upon the chaos and and as much as this speaks to Genesis 1 we could also look further in Genesis I believe is chapter 6 with the introduction of the flood and of the chaos of the flood and that the the

basically the wholesale slaughter of the earth through the flood waters and again he this world he imposed order the power of water and he just pushes back the water and he imposes order and so this is the God that we worship and he is the true Lord the the the pagan gods the false gods cannot do this they cannot impose order over chaos but this God does it he says now he asks now that we know who is the true God and the other thing we know from Psalm 22 is he has been victorious he has conquered darkness and now that he has conquered the darkness now he can move into the next phase of his plan of salvation for Israel and ultimately all mankind and so now the god of this universe is going to move to earth and he's going to dwell on earth and so now it begs the question now that Satan has been conquered

now that the enemies of Israel have been put down and now that God will move to establish his tabernacle his dwelling place on earth

now the psalmist asked the question who shall ascend into the hill of the Lord who shall stand in his holy place and in Luke 9 what we see here in Luke 9 is this Exodus that he was planning he says here in Luke 9 when he appeared in glory and spoke of his Exodus so when they saw Christ transfigured and they saw Moses and Elijah brought up into glory the the top priority that the Lord had on his mind as he was heading into Jerusalem was his Exodus and what was his a so Moses had an exodus that was the first Exodus but Christ has an exodus and this is the second Exodus and then Christ Exodus is going to be of such orders of magnitude greater than Moses as Exodus but but there's a way that he has to

bring it about because with Moses the people were enslaved simply because they were very fertile in Egypt and the Pharaoh was afraid of them and so he moved to make sure that they do not overwhelm the Egyptians and so through no fault of their own they were enslaved Israel now however is enslaved very much because of their own fault and very much because of their breaking of the Covenant and so because of their breaking of the Covenant this is why they're enslaved and so how can a righteous God now release them from the captivity that he himself said they must endure because of their disobedience and so this is why he is now the top of priority on his mind is how he's going to solve this conundrum how he's going to resolve the fact that he must be a God of his word he must be a God of righteousness he must be a covenant-keeping god and yet he has promised to his his friend Abraham that he will rescue these people if they fall into trouble and all families of the earth will be blessed through them and so the way that he resolves this is that he the Creator will come to earth as an Israelite and he will live perfectly by the Covenant and in so doing he will rightfully and lawfully earn all the blessings of the Covenant but in so doing and living this perfect Torah life he will actually then sacrifice himself for Israel for his bride for the love of his life and he will sacrifice his innocent life for her so that should she accept him as her personal Savior she can now inherit the blessings through the Holy One of Israel and so he's discussing this with Moses and Elijah and he says that he should accomplish this at Jerusalem and that's

what we see in Psalm 22 in Psalm 22 he accomplishes the Exodus he becomes the innocent life that is slain that his blood can now atone for Israel and so the the exodus is accomplished and so now that the Exodus is accomplished he can gather Israel and bring Israel to dwell with him well now we have to ask the question who shall ascend into the mountain of the Lord so we know he's going to establish his government on the Mount on the Mount of Olives and who at the heart are away who shall ascend into the mountain of the law or who shall stand in his holy place so God is now looking to make Israel a kingdom of priests and they need to administer righteousness for the rest of the world for the Gentile world so that the Gentiles can also ascend into the hill of the Lord and the Gentiles can also have come into the presence of the Lord but he needs to establish this priesthood and so the question is asked who who if the God the creator of the universe comes to earth which human beings can actually relate to him and have a relationship with him and this the same question was asked or the same question but a similar question was asked in Psalm 15 when he says Lord who shall abide in your tabernacle who shall dwell in your holy hill and then he answers he that walks uprightly and works righteousness and speaks the truth in his heart so these are the Torah conditions that God is looking for for anyone to dwell in his presence now in addition to Israel the Gentiles will also be able to dwell in God's presence and here we see in the prophet Micah chapter 4 verse 1 but in the last days it shall come to pass guaranteed take this to the bank it shall come to

pass in the last days that the mountain of the house of the Lord shall be established in the top of the mountains and it shall be exalted above the hills and Gentile people the people's shall flow unto it and so who can who can come into God's presence these people have to be converted these people have to be converted these people have to become Torah compliant in order to come before God and he says in many nations shall come and say come and let us go up to the mountain of the Lord so God gathers Israel

first and Israel is already in the mountain of the Lord and now the Gentiles who have the the deceptive veil lifted from them lifted from their eyes they now have sense they now acknowledge the God of Jacob and they are saying come and let us go up to the mountain of the Lord and to the house of the God of Jacob our gods are false gods

we were worshipping vanity we were deceived we did abominable acts in the name of our gods and now we recognize our gods our vanity there is only one God and that is the God of Jacob and let us go up to the mountain of the Lord in Jerusalem and to the house of the God of Jacob and Jacob will be all around him and he will teach us of his ways and he will use Jacob to teach the Gentiles and he will teach us of his ways and we will walk in his paths

no more Sharia no more Buda no more Hare Krishna we're gonna throw all that away and we're gonna walk in the paths of the Lord for the law shall go forth the true law the Torah shall go forth of Zion and the word of the Lord from Jerusalem the whole world will acknowledge that truth comes out of Jerusalem and it comes out of the people who dwell in Jerusalem so then the psalm 24 David now in the answered in Psalm 15 but he answers it here again in Psalm 24 verse 4 who will dwell in the hill of the Lord who will dwell in his presence he that has clean hands clean hands we can't be shedding blood we can't be stealing we can't be involved in all kinds of iniquity and think that we can come into God's presence he that has clean hands and a pure heart David God God says of David he's a man after my own heart and so we can go through a process of repentance go through a process

of daily renewal through the holy spirit and come to a place where God can say of us he or she is a man or a woman after my own heart a pure heart who has not lifted up his soul unto vanity nor sworn deceitfully and I want to emphasize here they're swearing deceitfully we are living in in the end time and hopefully it's obvious to us but from the scriptures from all the prophets that the end time is going to be a conflict between the children of Isaac and the children of Ishmael between the children of Jacob and the children of Esau and as we put all the prophecies together it becomes clear that Edom or Esau will have the upper hand and so the world right before our eyes is being reconfigured and all of the nations of Jacob are being subjugated they're being diluted they're being infiltrated they're being brought down by the Marxists but when we search the scriptures no prophet speaks of the Marxists even though the Marxists are very instrumental in destroying the nations of Jacob and and enervating them and diluting them but what we see in this in the prophecies is Edom has the

upper hand and God comes to conquer Edom he comes to conquer Esau he comes to put down Esau and to exalt Jacob and so we see all around the world this rush to the religion of Esau where everybody that runs to this religion has to swear deceitfully they have to swear the Shahada that they bear witness this is a legal term you need to know what you're saying when you say you bear witness otherwise you're bearing false witness and you're swearing deceitfully and God makes it very very clear that if you swear deceitfully you cannot come into the presence of God and so these folks who are

sparing witness this is again a legal term I bear witness and you were not there you don't know the man you don't know anything about the man and you bear witness God is going to hold us into account for every word that comes out of our mouths and so we must let our yeah be yeah and our may be may and we need to speak truth because we will be held to account for everything that comes out of our mouths and so these folks who swear deceitfully and and even swear to the beast power deceitfully they cannot dwell in the presence of God now all of this goes back to the very key note that was set for the Psalms in Psalm 1 where it says blessed is the man that walketh not in the counsel of the ungodly nor stand in the way of sinners nor sits in the seat of the scornful and so the psalm 1 tells us from the very beginning that the theme of the psalms is we must be torah compliant that God is a covenant God and he expects us to be covenant keepers as well and he gives us his word and he expects us to be compliant to his word he says here that this person he shall receive the

blessing from the Lord oh yes so the creator of the universe having conquered evil is now returning to the earth and the Torah compliant will receive blessing from the Lord and righteousness

Zadok from the god of his salvation God will give us this righteousness that this Israel is a rebellious people but God is going to give his righteousness to Israel and he will purge sin from Jacob he says this is the generation of them that seek Him so there's a generation that is going to turn and zechariah 12 shows us this generation that is going to turn wholeheartedly to god and as he returns they're going to say blessed is he that comes in the name of the lord this is the generation of them that seek him so so someone must be preaching the gospel the true gospel to them to wake them up and to get them to turn you know Zion behold your God somebody is taking up the prophecies of his Isaiah and and declaring and proclaiming the true gospel and saying to Zion behold your God and so there is a generation that seeks him and then he says that seeks your face o Jacob Selah so there's a generation that seeks God and this generation seeks the face of Jacob in other words there's a recognition that the God of the universe is the God of Jacob and so they're going to seek Jacob knowing that truth is only in Israel there is no other truth and here in Isaiah 60 we read this before when we studied Isaiah as the prophet writes for behold the darkness shall cover the earth and gross darkness the people but the Lord shall arise upon you and his glory shall be seen upon you Jacob and so there'll be darkness everywhere but

they'll be light on Jacob and anybody who wants anything to do with God must seek Jacob because God is the God of Jacob and the Gentiles shall come to your light so it's very clear that they thought they had something but they're going to realize they have absolutely nothing so the Gentiles shall come to your light and Kings to the brightness of your rising so Jacob will be elevated and mighty Kings will come to Jacob in verse 11 therefore your gates shall be opened continually they shall not be shut day nor night that men may bring unto you the wealth of the Gentiles that their kings may be brought for the nation and Kingdom the Gentile nation or the Gentile kingdom that will not serve Jacob Shall Perish yea those nations shall be utterly wasted so there's going to be a generation that seeks Jacob and if they don't seek Jacob it's because they're

are hateful and they're not interested in truth and therefore they will perish because the god of the universe will be dwelling on earth and the only people that can dwell with him are those that have a pure heart clean hands who seek Jacob and the God of Jacob the sons also of those Gentile peoples that persecuted you and afflicted you shall come bending unto you and all they that despise you shall bow themselves down at the soles of your feet and they shall call you the City of the Lord the Zion of the Holy One of Israel so the Holy One having accomplished his Exodus in Psalm 22 is now going to return and gather and carry out and execute the Exodus and gather Israel from the four corners of the earth and establish them with him in Jerusalem and in Judah and in the

deceitful

promised land and the light will only be on Israel and all these Gentiles will seek for Jacob Psalm 24 verse 7 lift up your heads o you gates we just read that in in Zion I'm sorry in Isaiah where these give the gates of Zion will be open continually so that the the Gentiles can come with their offerings to the God of Jacob lift up your heads now that Psalm 22 has been accomplished now that the creator has come to earth and vanquished evil that that at that at the climax of evil it were it was it was concomitant with the climax of love that as evil climax so did love that that everything that Satan threw at Christ it just caused love to be that much more exalted and manifest and because of that covenant love now everything else there's no there's no stopping there's no interference now with the plan of God lift up your heads o you gates and be you lifted up you everlasting doors so despite Satan's agenda to destroy Jerusalem these are everlasting doors and the King of glory shall come in and and there's evidence that this Psalm was written by David when the Ark of the Covenant returned to Jerusalem so we see here in 2nd Samuel 6:15 so David and all the house of Israel brought up the Ark of the Lord with shouting and with the sound of the trumpet and as the Ark of the Lord came into the City of David McHale Saul's daughter looked through a window and saw King David leaping and dancing before the Lord and she despised him in her heart so you can imagine he is pinning these Psalms in this time of triumph and joy that the Ark of the Covenant is being returned and they brought in the Ark of the Lord and set it in its place in the midst of the tabernacle that

David had pitched for it and David offered burnt offerings and peace offerings before the Lord and as soon as David had made an end of offering burnt offerings and peace offerings he blessed the people in the name of the Lord of hosts and so this is a sort of a triumphal entry of the ark into Jerusalem and and this Psalm is an entrance psalm an entrance liturgy and many believe that it was written at this time when when the ark returned to Jerusalem there's also another a triumphal entry and that's when Christ Himself came into Jerusalem says on the next day John writes in 1212 much people that were come to the feast when they heard that Jesus was coming to Jerusalem they took branches of palm trees acknowledging that he is the Messiah he is the king took branches of palm trees and went forth to meet him and cried Hosanna blessed is the king of Israel that comes in the name of the Lord and so these are all pointing to the ultimate triumphal entry when the Messiah returns to earth and he will enter Jerusalem as the king of Israel and this Psalm is pointing to this this King of glory entering Jerusalem verse 8 who again he asked the question who is this King of glory who is this King of glory

the Lord strong and mighty
the Lord mighty in battle and oh yes he
is coming now in battle he is enraged he
is going to put down the enemies of
Israel and all the curses that the
enemies of Israel put on Israel the
Messiah is going to take them and then
we reverse the curses and put them on
Israel's enemies who is this King of
glory the Lord strong and mighty the
Lord mighty in battle you can you can

imagine the congregation singing this especially as the Ark of the Covenant is coming in and and the the energy and the power that they would be singing with in unison about their king that he is the king of glory the Lord strong and mighty the Lord mighty in battle lift up your heads so there was this the enemies of Israel and perhaps they were downcast somewhat but now as a result of Psalm 22 we can lift up our heads in victory lift up your heads o you gates even lift them up you everlasting doors and the King of glory shall come in the King of glory shall come in verse 10 again who is this King of glory

the Lord of Hosts the Lord of Hosts he is the king of glory Selah and I just I can only imagine what it would be like as they perform this Psalm and they just have such it's a triumph and exhilaration over their King but he asked three times who is this King of glory and then he answers finally the Lord of Hosts he's mighty in battle and he's the Lord of Hosts and so we must ask the question who are these hosts well certainly he's coming with the Angels the angels are an army for him also in Zechariah 12 he says that the nation of Judah he's going to empower them so that they will be able to fight their enemies and they'll be able to put their enemies to flight so so Judah will be part of the army but also the firstfruits and Jude writes in Jude 14 and Enoch also the seventh from Adam prophesied of these saying behold the Lord comes who is this King of glory he's the Lord of Hosts who are these hopes

the Lord comes with ten thousands of his Saints these are the firstfruits and so the Lord is coming mighty and power mighty to save he's coming to save his people

but the firstfruits will be caught up with him and he'll be returning with these hosts and we will fight with him the Lord comes with ten thousands of his Saints to do what will we be doing when we return with him to execute judgment upon all and to convince all that are ungodly among them of their ungodly deeds which they have ungodly committed and of all their hard speeches which ungodly sinners have spoken against him so that is Psalm 24 and what I'll do now and I'll just put this up again just in case you might have some questions about this but I'm just gonna pause for a moment and get customers on the line and we'll be right we'll be right back to answer any questions that you might have oh here we go I think we should have audio now so just give them maybe 30 seconds and they can confirm that we do that was my fault that we didn't have audio okay what was interesting as you speak to to that point just yesterday a Nike pulled back special edition shoes displaying the Old Glory the initial flag in 1776 because for some reason the American flag is isn't is offensive amazing that isn't that amazing it's just it's a shame when you see these big corporations being so political and that's like these Marxists have infiltrated big business politics entertainment media everywhere and they're they have one agenda and it's to bring down the golden prize is America but they want to bring down all the Western democracies yeah absolutely makes no sense it was the North that freed slaves of course but it used to be that it was the lone star flag that was or these the Confederate state flag

that was that was racist now the Confederate the Union Flag is now racist I can't imagine and you know today right as we speak black slaves are being sold on auction blocks in Libya that you know the previous president went in and destroyed Gaddafi and allowed now these Islamic terrorists to run wild there and we have because the Quran is a book that endorses slavery we have slavery in 2019 we have black men being castrated and being auctioned off and it's silence but everybody's all about America and America had slaves but America had the Bible and because of America had the Bible white men and women read the Bible and saw that men are created in God's image and likeness and they said this is wrong and and they they risked life and limb and shed blood to put an end to slavery and and so in these Western nations primarily America and Britain we have we've never seen this before slavery was practiced all around the world the whole economy ran on slavery and nobody ever ended it it is only these Christian nations having read the Word of God that then they lost their lives they lost property they sacrificed everything because they believed that it was immoral to Huck to have to treat human beings fellow human beings this way and and so the Marxists don't teach this and nor do they highlight that today in 2019 black men are being castrated and sold as slaves and auctioned today right now as we're speaking silence let's just beat up on America's past it's terrible yeah definitely again that is not educating our children so that they then become it just believe what the media hears and they have no they have no reference point to challenge that right

on and this is why it's so important as well to tear down all the monuments and to rob people just what you said don't teach history and remove any icons that may point people back you know in Genesis we see where I think was Jacob or anyway the Israelites they would establish monuments so that people would remember that children would look back and say well why is this here why is that there and and history would be taught but what these Marxists are doing they're very intelligent people they are robbing the Western nations of their heritage and of their history and of their identity so that we have people you know on Canada Day we were walking around here and there's quite a quite a big celebration here and and I saw this young lady Marie with a t-shirt that said o Canada our home on native land our home on native land so there's this self-loathing there's this despising and and there's just that I you know if I'm a white male heterosexual I hate myself and I'm no good and we had slaves and we we conquered than the natives and Indians and we did nothing right and and this is just this agenda is non-stop non-stop to tear down the Western nations and they're creating a vacuum and guess what the savage will move into the vacuum and and when you have if two nations go to war and one is self-loathing and and then doubts itself and the other has no morals whatsoever and will do anything for power who's gonna win that's right yeah of course yeah yeah the wild and savage war yeah veah I see actually I see we're on Facebook this week last week we didn't broad we weren't able to broadcast live to Facebook okay so we're on Facebook

questions on the chat so far no I just looked here they might have been but the way that Facebook works if I don't see it when it comes up then I'll miss it but they're just technology I thought the volume is good yeah so maybe your thoughts on Psalm 24 sure very interesting how it sort of you've highlighted that it is the concluding part to it a and installment within the salt that began back at the Psalms 19 and obviously I don't think David fully grasped what he was writing assuming that these songs were written individually by him based on certain circumstances so it is it is even more testament to the inspiration of God in His Holy Word that these Psalms were put together in this fashion in this order yes I think so he under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit would have written the psalm

I think as he's writing it about his own circumstance and then the Holy Spirit inspires him to maybe write beyond his circumstance that maybe the psalm isn't one

percent completely about his circumstance he's now writing a poem or a song and and maybe you know through poetic license he goes a bit beyond his circumstance under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit so I think he would then know that this is prophecy and this is prophetic and this is looking forward but I think as you said he wouldn't necessarily understand the full import of what he was writing nor do I think it was him who put the psaltery together so I think others again under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit would have put this Psalm book together and would have structured it under the inspiration of the spirit into these

five books and in the particular order that they put it in and that would be part of the worship or whatever they're doing however it was utilized at the time so I think both the writers including David were writing under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit without fully understanding at all but I think knowing David knew he was a prophet he knew he was prophesying and then those who put the collections together and structured it into these books and put it in the order that they put it in I think they also would have been under the inspiration of the Spirit yeah completely agree for sure yeah wanted to to just surf back on one point and you brought up the Book of Enoch in Jude and I just wanted to perhaps just yes been 30 seconds are so clarifying for the listeners that there's no I I see I see if you agree with me okay based on on scholarly research the books that we have in the Apocrypha that would be known as the Book of Enoch and in fact there are one of the Apocrypha is really Enoch one and there's evidence that there are two other Enoch Enoch 2 and Enoch three none of those are what according to research what Judah was referencing that book if he knocks seems to be lost from the research now neither none of those three books would have been written by the

sixth great-grandson so just to be sure when they when we read Jude referring to the Book of Enoch we wouldn't be going to either of the any of the three books of Enoch that that are out there today as reference points yeah it's a good point I'm not familiar with these books I think I think there is I don't know if it's a book of Enoch but I have read

some of these extra biblical texts and some of them there's some interesting information and then but other of it I'm reading and I'm just like this is ridiculous you know it's uh there's no way this was written under inspiration so I would agree with you I have a question here sorry I have a question here from Facebook and it says it's from Blake silverstein you referred to King David dancing before the ark and his wife hating him in her heart clearly there is emotion being portrayed I feel most people in the Church of God are so stoic do you think we should allow ourselves to be more emotional when worshiping so oh and there's another question here I want to read this before it goes why do you think David's daughter despised the way David was worshipping God this is from Rhonda Holmes are there lessons for us and how to worship and show God adoration so maybe uh Murray I'll take a first crack at this and then you you can come and share all so first of all it's clear if we actually go to the text that was in second samuel 6 let me just go to the text second samuel 6 so go to the text and we go to so the art comes in to the and then it says here in verse five let me put it up on the screen here just give me a second or so it says here in Psalm five I'm sorry in verse five of second Samuel six and David and all the house of Israel played before the Lord on all manner of instruments made of fir wood even on harps and on psalteries and on timbrels and on cornets and on symbol so this is this is you know quite an orchestra going on here so this is this is not a half-hearted effort that they're pulling out all the stops to to

play and then it comes down here let me just come further down to where we see he was dancing so the Ark comes into Israel Thank You Jerusalem verse 10 10 10 so David wicks are 64 66 glasses thanks okay thanks okay verse 16 and as the Ark of the Lord came into the city of David McCall Saul's daughter looked through a window and saw King David leaping and dancing before the Lord and she despised him in her heart and they brought in the Ark of the Lord and said it in its place in the midst of the tabernacle that David had pitched for it and David offered burnt offerings and peace offerings before the Lord and then he finishes the offering so it's this first here that's in question that he was leaping and dancing' and she therefore despised him so it's almost like you know from her perspective he's making a fool of himself that she enjoys the status of being the King's wife and wants him to act in a noble manner and maybe he's dancing and there's other people he's maybe there's women they dancing as well and she wants to be somewhat aloof and set apart from the common people but he's right there with the people and she's despising him so I think part of it has to do with status but clearly that she has an issue with him leaping and dancing now you go into some Pentecostal churches and they do a whole lot of leaping and dancing and so you know should we adopt that practice and be slain by the spirit and do all this leaping and dancing and I clearly I think everybody would know I would say absolutely not that that is some satanic worship that's taking place there and I did do a if we if you go through the acts Bible study

that's in the archive and I believe it's in acts to Acts chapter 2 that I do a whole study on Pentecost Pentecostalism and that's sort of leaping and dancing' that they do that it's really a form of Voodoo and has nothing to do with godly worship but here obviously this has a lot to do with godly worship and David is leaping and dancing before the Lord but I think there's an exceptional situation here and that is that the Ark of the Covenant has been recovered it's been recovered and it's been brought in to Jerusalem and it's being put in its place and this is phenomenal this is an exceptional circumstance David being a man after God's own heart just he's just beyond himself in terms of sheer joy that the Ark of God has been returned now so so that's so there is an exceptional circumstance here having said that just the plain answer to the question and I think was Blake who asked it yeah we're way too stoic we are very very stoic and I think this has to do with the Quaker heritage of the Church of God particularly the Worldwide Church of God where they just didn't display emotion and felt that emotion is somehow sinful and there was also this point of differentiation that while the pentecost's are being slayed by the Spirit we want to be more intellectual and look at the Bible and and not be all emotional about it but look and understand what is actually saying and do that but I think we have gone to my opinion is we've gone too far and we you know we try to we should be singing hymns that it's not wrong to have emotion we are worshiping the God of the universe and we should be able to express the emotion in doing that but I think it needs to be balanced

and the heart of Christianity the heart of Christianity is teaching and you see some churches where they forget that and they think that the heart of Christianity is emotion and so you read the text and there's no such thing as Christianity without teachers this is an intellectual a path that we're on that if you come into the church and you can read you better learn how to read use it there's no excuse if you're illiterate get lessons and learn how to read because you have to study to show yourself approved and and this is God wants intelligent people who can understand what he's saying and hurt the sense from the nonsense and follow him and he gives us teachers so when you see charm church congregations where the sermon is getting shorter and shorter and shorter and the praise music is getting longer and longer and longer this is a concern because the heart of Christianity is teaching but at the same time just flat-out from my perspective we are way too stoic and there should be joy and there should be expression not necessarily leaping and dancing I think when Christ returns there'll be a whole bunch of leaping and dancing but in exceptional in exceptional circumstances as this was yeah but in terms of the weekly worship we can express we can have more emotional expression not necessarily leaping and dancing sorry Maury I went on a bit but your thoughts no no no you you remember the study you did in Acts about it I know you covered it and weekly sermons as well which I agree with the other thing I would say too is if you are only doing it at services for public display and that same emotional outlay is not in your private life right then I would be

wondering right the intent let me see right like a Pharisee in the open in the open the open courts and that's a very good point because that that is a lot of people do things to be seen and you actually said to me something on the Raptors victory you had a point of around expression of emotion what you witnessed I think after the drama Raptors just won the NBA championship and it was it was three to two three million people in downtown Toronto for the parade I was out watching it with my son it was it was crazy the ecstasy that was everywhere and people hugging each other strangers hugging each other and you're right about the stoicism we have in the faith we don't we certainly don't get anywhere near as excited as the country got four or something some like sports yeah we do have a few questions here okay just before you go there just we go there Rondo home says he agrees with our answers and they just did a Bible study on worship with Mike Nolan and this scripture plays right into what they discussed with pasta Nolan Oh perfect yeah that's great from first one is from brother ray who says have any studies been done that show Americans and Canadians are returning to God I don't have that information that's already at my mouth you know I don't the other way yeah exactly I was gonna say I don't but I have seen the other way I think it's interesting what pastor Rama Kahn has done where there's a whole congregation in Pakistan that he is working with now and so we say in Kenya and so we're seeing these other nations searching and seeking God I have I see we're becoming more and more socialist more and more Marxist however having said that I think the younger generation

there's some indication that the next generation the sort of 16 to 25 year olds are fed up with all the materialism they're fed up with all the political correctness and then they seem to be I think I read a study somewhere where they seem to be developing an appetite for truth and what is this world all about

we can hope yeah another question this one from JB and it's a quote this is Jacob the generation of those who seek an end of quote

does this mean to us that we have to do more than enter into covenant with God we also have to pursue him with a continual seeking this seems to be something each generation must do afresh I'm not sure if I understand the question

can you Trevor yeah sure yes let me look through it again this is Jacob the generation of those who seek him so I think she's referencing the fact that God is specifying that each generation must stand on its own yeah let me just pull up the psalm the verse so that we're looking at the sort of thing so it's in Psalm 24 and verse 6 Psalm 24 verse 6 says this is the generation verse success this is the generation of them that seek Him that seek your face o Jacob Scylla I think that's the verse that she's referring correct that's correct so what's what's the question does this the question is does this mean to us that we have to be more than enter into covenant with God that we also have to pursue them with a continual seeking seems to be something each generation must do afresh yeah definitely I would say the entering into covenant with God means to seek him otherwise we become covenant breakers so then the whole

nature of the covenant means that we are in pursuit of each other it's like I'm in covenant with my wife and we're in pursuit of each other and we're not we're not negligent or not indifferent about the Covenant agreement we're in it's it is a path of pursuit and in the same way as we come into covenant with God it's a path of pursuit but I think here what the psalmist is speaking of is the generation that sees God return that when God returns there is this generation that is seeking Him and in seeking him they're seeking Jacob because the God of Israel is the God of Jacob and he will have people in Jacob representing him and so there's this acknowledgment that the truth is in Jacob and nowhere else what are your thoughts any referenced yeah and you reference that right at 12 specific to that generation I think JD's point is correct that each generation must itself choose to be part of the government and again to renew day by day you have the second generation of those relates the computer on amis the second generation of Israelites and even in first Corinthians 7 a child is has a relationship with God based on his based on his parent his or her parents relationship God only to the point they that they are part of the household they're underneath their authority in their household once they're beyond that authority they must then make that choice so generally speaking I agree with their state great very good one more here from riffle actually got a few more now IRA from rich fourth is Jesus blood covenant for Israel only and not for Gentiles great again is Jesus blood covenant for Israel only and not for Gentile yeah great question

do what you want to cover that one so I think this is the part and parcel of what we've been studying or a few of the books now only only Israelites can come into comment with God God's covenant is with Israel all the way back to his promise to Abraham what we're seeing in these studies now are Gentiles can come into right now there's a window open for Gentiles that can come into the Covenant and you've covered that off in places like Romans 11 where in order to make real Israel physical Israel jealous and have them open their eyes God allows some opportunities for Gentiles to come into that covenant so that Israel will eventually have the opportunity of the scales removed and be taught by the firstfruits some of which would be made up of former Gentiles but they do not remain Gentiles once you come into the covenant you are a full-blown Israelite whether by physical DNA or or by the acceptance of the blood of Jesus Christ right on yeah so God only has a relationship with Israel and from mankind to have a relationship with God they need to do that through Israel period absolutely one more down here from Margie are all those nations that go up to learn the way of God of Jacob still in human form and we'll be in the second resurrection just repeat the question right sure are all those nations that go up I think referencing Micah Micah for is what I think where you work are all those nations that go off to learn the way of the God of Jacob still in human form and we'll be in the second resurrection well they won't necessarily be in the second resurrection if they survived through the cataclysmic events that precede Christ's return remember there's a

portion of humanity that will live over into the Millennium so they are not necessarily those that will come up in the second resurrection but they will be in human form at that yes yeah definitely right believe that's it for America sister Marion didn't just make a statement that the Ark being recovered was something to rejoice over and that's Ramsey the special circumstance that you referenced Ruth David's dancing very good very good and I just like Silverstein's there's wonderful answer he thanks us for the answer and oh wait no that's something from a Rebecca cotton game she would love to see a movie of the knowledge and exuberance we have of Scripture until then thank you for sharing I see and share the emotion in your messages a very kind to sister yeah so all of us you know this is a bit by bit right if we I was just saying this the other day because I was at the library a couple of weeks ago and it just took me back to my youth when I was 16 and I really as I look back Marie I feel like it's not possible for somebody to know less about the true God then I did at age 16 I mean I just knew absolutely nothing and yet you know God calls us and bit by bit daily study daily study teaching sermons feast days and you know some 40 years later we actually begin to understand the Bible like it actually makes sense to us to the point where we can teach others and I think this is the process that all of us have to go through where it doesn't matter where we start as their kento JD's point we've got to be pursuing God and as we pursue him as we hunger and thirst for his righteousness he fills us and he fills us so that we can fill

others so it's just a wonderful wonderful process that we're involved in and again I want to just to reiterate this point that I made earlier you could come into the church and you're illiterate you can't stay there no no harm no foul that you don't know how to read and maybe as we go into the third world countries people come into the church they don't know how to read or they don't know English or you know whatever the case is we have to study to show ourselves approved and so we just have to have this daily discipline where we're just constantly pursuing and God blesses us we can't sit back and just say I you know I just want to be emotional about this I just I feel God in my heart and that's good enough for me yeah absolutely absolutely and we can't be satisfied with where we are in our studies we must constantly be digging into feeling that there's a line get back and seeing what's what's deeper meanings in the scriptures we thought we completely understood that's right yeah exactly and I think with when we get to the point where we think we've got it all figured out and there's nothing more to learn

we're in big big trouble because get your position this is the mind of God and I think what I find fascinating pastor Marie is that in the Millennium we will be teaching from the Bible and so this book is just it has all kinds of hidden gems in it and as time unfolds from one generation to the next from one decade to the next scriptures start popping it's like a Time released capsule and as time unfolds it releases new things and so I think if we just keep with this you know this I understand everything and I've got it

all figured out and this is the answer or these are the answers and I'm unwilling to learn anything new we're gonna be in big trouble I think we Christ says that anyone who's any every scribe that is skilled in the word he's like a householder that brings out of his treasure things new and things old so so Christ himself says if you're skilled in the word then you know you can bring out the old but you can also bring out things new and that's what that's that's because it's the mind of God and every generation there's new things to understand and hence the the I'm sure we could go back into the previous books that we've already studied

Philippians acts Luke and we could probably do them again and make the same way we did the last time and this is a very important point because you know we can never look at Philippians the same after we've gone through songs and and we can never look at Psalms the same after we've gone through isaiah and then we can never look at acts the same now that we've been through songs and so it's this constantly going back through it round and round and every time we go through it again it's deeper it's richer there's other texts that we can link to it that we didn't see before but now that I see this I can see that and now that they see that I can see this over here and so it's just this constant lifelong lifelong process absolutely one final comment here from sister Olivia in reference to the dancing Nitra makes a good point here that David's dancing was a celebratory occasion and it wasn't as service excellent exactly exactly very good yeah and that that still doesn't absolve us of the fact that you

know standing in service holding a hymnbook saying isn't it great and boring to know the God of Israel I wish I was at home watching the Raptors there's no excuse for that I think there should be some joy and some some elation in in our worship of God someone spread give us these emotions and they should be for him yeah absolutely I'm sorry I was just Margy couldn't was having trouble with her volume so we're just exchanging email addresses seriously that we can provide a written answer to what you already provided what we already discussed you're on the study great great yery thing else I hear so far all right yeah nothing else for me either very good really appreciate you taking the time pass the Mauryan just join you should you uh letting me support it in this way uh certainly enjoy it and enjoy the interaction likewise thank you for your life for your studies and just thank you for the partnership that we have I really appreciate you and just enjoy the collaborative work that we do together all right god bless you and God willing we'll choose see you one salad good night everyone remember Jesus Christ is Lord who is this King of glory it's Jesus the Lord amen the Church of God International would like to introduce the availability of a new app and design and download it now [Music]
