[Music] [Music] well greetings brethren and welcome back to another wednesday night bible study and uh tonight god willing we are going to cover psalms 108 and 109 and as you know our whole emphasis is to study the scripture line by line line upon line let's open with the word of prayer and then we can begin the study of psalms 108 and 109 our loving heavenly father we come before you father to praise you we thank you so much for your scripture we thank you for the different uh authors that you worked through and inspired and we thought thank you also father for the different genres and we've spent a lot of time uh studying the prophets and now we're returning to the psalms and the the understanding of the psalms father we pray that you'll help us to deepen our understanding to deepen our appreciation to put it in the context of what we have learned from the prophets but to also help us to better understand the prophets and even see the prophecies that are in the psalms father these are very very difficult days as you know and they are getting worse and your people father are being targeted and are coming just into increasing persecution and we know it's going to be severe we are praying right now father in

particular for our brethren in australia as uh many of them are being forced to go against their conscience and we know that whatever is not of faith is sin they're being forced to sin we pray father that you'll give them conviction and that you'll help them father to keep the big picture in mind so that whatever sacrifices we have to make in order to honor and glorify christ we will make them help us also father to turn to the psalms to to receive the solace and the comfort and the wisdom that we need in times of personal but also community persecution we thank you lord god and we praise you for your for your will and for your loving kindness we pray in the most holy name of jesus christ amen brethren we're up to psalm 108 and just before we go into psalm 108 uh what i'll do is i'll open up my scripture here and i just want to go back to psalm 57 i just want you to notice something here in psalm 57 and verse 7 david writes my heart is fixed oh god my heart is fixed i will sing and give praise awake up my glory awake sultry and harp i myself will awake early i will praise you o lord among the

people i will sing unto you among the nations for your mercy is great unto the heavens and your truth unto the clouds be thou exalted o god above the heavens let your glory be above all the earth and i just wanted to read that uh psalm 57 which we covered some time ago because this exact passage is the first part of psalm 108 so this psalm that david wrote or this song that david wrote for some reason and now in this fifth of the sultry which is really a post-exile post-exilic this is after they have been exiled that maybe david himself thought to use the same words he wrote earlier or maybe the person who's putting the sultry together just thought that it would be worthwhile to take the poetry of david and put it to maybe a different topic but also combine it with other lyrics and we'll see that in a moment i should have just checked to make sure that my that i'm coming through loudly and clearly i'm knowing anything oh yes i see here that uh thank you mr murray that the audio and video are good great i should always check that before i get too far so uh so here we go so this is um psalm 57 you saw the verse is there verses 7 to 11. now let's come into psalm 108. it's a song or psalm of david

they're crediting the whole psalm to david but you're going to see that this psalm is actually taking two different psalms psalm 57 and psalm 60 and putting them together so in that sense it is the psalm of david because he wrote these lyrics but um it doesn't necessarily mean that he put these two psalms he configured this particular psalm in this way just that he certainly is the author of the words now we just read psalm 57 now let's read psalm 108 verse 1 oh god my heart is fixed so there's some trouble and for all of us i think this is a great way that we should be able to pray oh god my heart is fixed i we understand your covenant we understand your covenant love we understand your covenant commitment and despite what is going on around us we walk by faith and not by sight so yes it's very discouraging what we see by sight but because we are so intimately familiar with your covenant love our heart is fixed oh god my heart is fixed i will sing and give praise even with my glory so despite again the hardship we're going to sing and give praise because we know how the story ends awake sultry and harp i myself will

SO

awake early so let's get my instruments up and i'm going to be up very i'm going to praise god i'll be up early again despite the terrible circumstances we find ourselves in i will praise you o lord among the people and i will sing praises unto you among the nations to me this is a again this this cassette this understanding that we're going to sing among the gentiles these gentile powers who have no understanding who are adversarial to god's will that in the end we're going to praise god in front of them and all the world will know that jesus is lord he says the reason he'll do this for your hasset this is the whole theme this is the the bible really centers around this understanding of cassette that the wicked will not have any understanding daniel says the wise will understand the wicked will have no idea so as everything is just falling apart and that the beast is gaining in power and is given victory over the saints the wicked will have no idea what's going on but the wise the wise will understand and that understanding is going to come around this this this concept of god's covenant love and his covenant commitment for your hasset is great above the heavens and your truth reaches unto the clouds be thou exalted o god above the heavens and your glory

above all the earth so everything's going on on the earth some very very powerful people are exerting their their strength and their muscle and their might and we say with the psalmist the psalmist has given us the words sometimes we don't know how to pray as we ought but we can read the psalms and and get the words from the psalmist be thou exalted o god above the heavens and your glory above all the earth our heart is fixed because god is in control when we read the book of revelation and chapter four and we see the throne room of god be thou exalted oh god above the heavens and your glory above the earth verse 6 that your beloved may be delivered so there is serious persecution here and and god's power over all the affairs of men will lead to our deliverance be that your beloved may be delivered save with your right hand and answer me god has spoken in his holiness i will rejoice i will divide shechem and meet out the valley of sakat now here we're seeing another psalm this is psalm 60 we'll go to it in a moment so there's this concatenation of psalm 57 the first part of psalm 57 and psalm 60. we're putting these two psalms together and and and for some purpose and and maybe they were whoever this is who's put this together maybe the nation was about to go to war with shechem

in the valley of sacrath and and maybe that's why this psalm just kicked in and it just had to be combined with psalm 57. i will divide shechem and meet out the valley of sukhov god has spoken this is this is god's cassette his commitment he's the landowner and he decides who will who will inherit the land and who will have the land he decides how to apportion the land and so he's quoting god in his holiness gilead is mine manasseh is mine ephraim also is the strength of my head judah is my law giver as for moab is my wash pot over edom will i cast out my shoe over philistia will i triumph so these gentile nations today these are all muslim nations that surround and want to invade and take over the promised land god says no i i you know jude is my lawgiver ephraim is my strength manasseh is mine gilead is mine these are the people that i'm going to give the land to as for these people who are making claims i'm always my wash pot i i take my filth and i wash it in moab and eat them i cast my shoe to eat them and say clean that up servant and i'm gonna triumph over philistia this is god's perspective of the gentile nations that do not acknowledge his covenant with israel who will bring me into the strong city who will lead me into edom again maybe there's this is a particular time where

this battle is is fresh and they're bringing this the words of david together to to reinforce their confidence so the question is who's going to lead me into edom will not you o god who has cast us off will not you o god go forth with our hosts again an understanding of cassette we have earned being cast out of the land we have earned being despised because of the covenant clauses that we have activated we have been punished yet because of because of god's covenant commitment who can help us who who will save us who will deliver us the very god who who behaves according to cassette that there's two parts to cassette there is the covenant punishment but there's also the covenant commitment so god who who has cast us off he's the one that's going to lead us into edom that your beloved may be delivered save with your right hand and hear me so that was actually sorry um this is now let me just go back so psalm 108 verse 6 that your beloved may be delivered save with your right hand and answer me now let's go to psalm 60. he says that your beloved may be delivered save with your right hand this is verse 5 and hear me verse 6 god has spoken in his holiness i will rejoice i will divide shechem and meet out the valley of sakhat

gilead is mine and manasseh is mine ephraim also is the strength of my head judah is my law giver moab is my wash pot over edom while i cast out my shoe philistia triumph you because of me who will bring me into the strong city who will lead me into edom will not you o god which which had cast us off and you o god which did not go out with our armies give us help from trouble for vain is the help of man let's now return to psalm 108 give us help verse 12 give us help from trouble for vain is the help of man so clearly uh this psalm 108 was just airlifted taking a part of psalm 57 combining with a part of psalm 60 putting that together for a particular need in this post-exilic period and and putting perhaps new music to it and and bringing that together for a specific message around god's god's help in time of god's cassette help in time of need through god we shall do valiantly for he it is that shall tread down our enemies and again as we enter into a very very difficult period and what is prophesied to be the most intense period in the story of humankind we need these psalms we need this understanding that through god we shall do valiantly in fact the prophecy the end time prophecy in daniel he says those who know their god shall do exploits those who know their god shall do exploits through daniel he also says the wicked will do wickedly but the wise shall understand

understand what understand god's covenant commitment covenant covenant covenant covenant covenant covenant that is the only way we shall stand that we understand what god is doing we understand his commitment matthew 24 christ says to his disciples after cursing jerusalem he turns to his disciples and says don't be deceived in other words it's going to appear as if i have forsaken jerusalem it's going to appear as if i have forsaken the covenant people don't be deceived the wise will understand what will they understand cassette cassette covenant covenant covenant covenant covenant covenant covenant covenant god is a god of covenant and with that understanding through god the god of covenant we shall do valiantly for he it is that shall tread down our enemies not because of us as we saw in the psalm he he uh forsook us and then he saved us he forsook us because of covenant and he saved us because of covenant because he does everything according to his eternal commitment to his covenant promise now we're going to go to psalm 109 an extremely difficult psalm it's in the category of what's called an impregatory psalm so here we just came from a psalm that is very personal a very personal psalm that there's

personal suffering and we see the personal experience of a man of god a man of faith we see king david's reliance and his perception of god his reliance on in his perception of god now we're going to come to another psalm of david which is an imprecatory psalm which means it's a psalm of cursing he is he is in fact [Music] he's going to curse his enemies and i think what makes this psalm as i was studying it what makes it particularly difficult is he's going to curse his enemies but his enemies are within the covenant community he's going to be cursing men who are within the covenant community and it's these curses are quite severe so so let's go through this but as we go through it i think as a sort of establish a frame of reference let's go to torah and we'll go to deuteronomy 19 and verse 16. if a false witness rise up against any man to testify against him that which is wrong a person's false witness and there this is a legal case now and they're saying of of somebody within the community something which isn't true then both the men between whom the controversy is shall stand before the lord okay you've been accused of something which you know isn't true and there are witnesses saying it is true

okay let's all come before the lord and let's hear the accusation and and let's hear the controversy and have both men stand before the lord before the priests and the judges which shall be in those days and the judges shall make diligent inquisition so so the purpose of the judges now is to find out what is the truth here does this do these accusations hold water is is this a fair statement let's dig into this and find out what the truth of the matter is that's the purpose of the judges and behold if the witness be a false witness this is a this is some pretty serious material you've got to be very very serious when we make accusations so if the witness be a false witness and has testified falsely against his brother then shall you do unto him as he had thought to have done unto his brother so shall you put the evil away from among you so this is how we're going to take care of it whatever this false witness was and the consequences of this accusation let them be upon the head of the false witness and those which remain shall hear and fear and shall henceforth commit no more any such evil among you so this sort of evil of these false accusations and we see it a lot um let's let's be real here

uh christians can be vicious when i say christians i mean brethren can be vicious and can come up with some vicious accusations and character assassination and it can go viral but god doesn't want that and in order to prevent that when a false accusation comes to light it should be dealt with so that people realize wow okay gossip false witness character assassination this is not really a good thing to do look how look how it might end up and those which remain shall hear and fear that's what god wants and shall henceforth commit no more any such evil among you and your eyes shall not pity but life shall go for life eye for eye tooth for tooth hand for hand foot for foot god this is this is the god of covenant don't mess around i don't want this evil of false accusations within the covenant community so when it comes to light the judges will make diligent inquiry and find out is this accusation true or false and if it's false the consequences of the accusation will be upon the false accuser and don't back down so with that torah understanding let's now hear the words of the sweet psalmist king david

to the chief musician a psalm of david so this is an imprecatory psalm it's a psalm of cursings but it's a psalm it's put to music so think of some very perhaps dramatic music but it's a song it's meant to be sung with instruments he begins hold not your peace o god of my praise this is you get the sense of emergency there's no kind of uh on ramp to the to the discussion with god no acknowledgment of um all the great things that god has done for israel and and the history of the covenant hold not thy peace oh god of my praise this is urgent for the mouth of the wicked and the mouth of the deceitful are opened against me they have spoken against me with a lying tongue and it's out there and and people are believing it and i am being i am facing the consequences of their lying tongues hold not thy peace o god of my praise for the mouth of the wicked and the mouth of the deceitful are opened against me they have spoken against me with a lying tongue they surrounded me about also with words of hatred this is the covenant community brethren you'll see it as we go through this it's going to be crystal clear these are not gentile pagan idolaters these are brethren in the covenant community they have surrounded me about also

words of hatred and fought against me without a cause you know many of us say oh i love king david i love the apostle paul i love isaiah i love jesus i love when if we lived in the time of these men we might be in the company of those who bring vicious accusations against them and this was king david a man after god's own heart and yet despite being after god's own heart within the covenant community they surround him also with words of hatred and fought against him without a cause for my love are my adversaries so so david had this heart for god he had love for the community he wanted to move the community forward wanted to move them closer to god and for his love they are my adversaries this word adversaries in the hebrew satan for my love they are satans but i give myself unto prayer this this is david's response hold not thy east o god of my praise they've become sins to me but i'm going to give myself unto prayer now we can hear christ's a plight when he was on earth with his love he came he came to deliver judah and israel judah specifically israel but through extension and ultimately the whole world and he's a god of love but they became satan to him tools of satan here in john 11 53 and

those of us in burlington were studying the the book of john and he came to his own but his own received him not here in john 11 53 then from that day forth they that is the pharisees took counsel together for to put him to death this is the god of love and they're planning to put him to death this is the reward for his covenant love for judah verse 57 now both the chief priests and the pharisees had given a commandment this is a commandment you better obey us that if any man knew where he was that is jesus he should show it that they might take him take him to do what to kill him so so david is articulating his plight but he's actually prophesying the plight of the lord and the plight of many of us who serve the lord verse 5 psalm 109 and they have rewarded me evil for good and hatred for my love so he's loving the community doing all he can to do god's will within the community and move the community closer to conform with god's will and he says they've rewarded me evil for good and hatred for my love here in 1st samuel 19 and verse 4 and jonathan spoke good of david unto saul his father so we know the story of david and saul

how david loved saul was happy to serve saul did all he could to bless saul and saul sought to kill him because of his envy envy is a terrible terrible addictive drug and satan uses envy oh why is that happening to him that should be you and once envy gets in he can twist and and make the heart go evil turn evil here saul's heart became evil because of envy that it was clear that david was blessed by god in ways that saul was not and he became envious but jonathan is trying to speak reasonably to him to reason with him and jonathan spoke good of david unto saul his father and said unto him let not the king sin against his servant against david because he has not sinned against you and because his have been to you toward you very good david has been very good to you saul don't do this don't sin against him he hasn't sinned against you he's done nothing but good for you he's loved you he's tried to bless you and now you're going to sin against him back to psalm 109 set you so here's here's now the curse so that we've we've had the context of what how david is suffering as a result of these wicked people and now he's bringing curses upon those in the covenant community he's asking god this is his prayer and it's now set to music set you a wicked man over him and let satan stand at his right hand

so they become like satan to me let him be this is like a legal matter now false accusations let's go now to the to the court and and let satan be there accusing him bring everything all the wicked he has done let it be brought out they're accusing me let's have their accusations brought to light real not false but true accusations now when he shall and with my new detail let's all expose it all when he shall be judged let him be condemned like this is painful you can you can actually feel the pain of david that that he is in turmoil but rather than take matters into his own hands he's praying intensely and turning this all over to god god says vengeance is mine and david is saying okay lord vengeance is yours here's the case please act when he shall be judged let him be condemned and let his prayer become sin don't hear it reject it and this is proof that we're talking of the covenant community that this is someone in the covenant community that is praying to jehovah and david is saying don't hear this prayer because of what how he's treating me who has loved him and done everything i can to bless him and look how he's treating me let his prayer to you become sin let his days be few and let another take his office and this uh

verse here when we studied the book of acts we quoted this because this is quoted in acts 1 and verse 20 when peter says for it is written in the book of psalms let his habitation be desolate and let no man dwell therein let his office and his office let another take verse 25 that he may that he may take part of this ministry an apostleship the new person who they're going to select from which judas by transgression fell that he might go to his own place so so judas came under this uh davidic curse this davidic condemnation because god loved him christ loved him and for that love he rewarded him with evil and so this curse this imprecatory psalm the the activation of this curse came down upon judas and god saw to it that that happened let his children be fatherless and his wife a widow so take him off this earth take him take him from the earth notice this in verse 10 i thought this was interesting let his children be continually vagabonds and beg don't don't allow them to get any traction to get any foothold in society let them always be marginalized this is quite the curse let his children be continually vagabonds and beg and let them seek their bread also out of their desolate places now it's interesting that in in acts 19 i didn't see this before in acts 19 and verse 13 that there were vagabond jews so this is and i think we know this story about the

vagabond jews they were exorcists and they took upon them to call over them which had evil spirits in the name of the lord jesus saying we adjure you by jesus whom paul preaches and so we know we know that story that didn't go well for them but it never uh the the fact that they were vagabonds i just kind of read over that now i'm asking the question could they be the children of these cursed individuals who violated the covenant and and did evil rewarded good with evil is this is this the fulfillment within the covenant community of this imprecatory this curse this impregnatory psalm back to psalm 109 let this be the reward of my adversaries from you lord let let this be the consequence of their their adversarial actions and words against me and let it come from you not from me let it come from you and of them that speak evil against my soul here in matthew 18 now this this does that sounds very harsh but when jesus was on earth he was no less harsh we're very familiar with this listen to matthew 18. but let's put it in the context of david's prayer what what david is praying jesus is saying yeah i'm going to take care of it when i see this sort of vicious conduct within the covenant community i don't take it lightly

so so as david is praying within the covenant community that let this be the reward of my adversaries that have sought to destroy me with their viciousness god says here in matthew 18 and verse 6 but whoso shall offend one of these little ones think of david which believe in me it were better for him that a millstone were hung about his neck and that he were drowned in the depth of the sea in other words there is going to be a psalm 109 type response to anybody in the covenant community that is reckless like this that seeks to destroy deliberately those who are seeking to do good those who are seeking to love those who are seeking to uh help the covenant community conform to the will of god and then for that they're being rewarded with evil god is saying i i won't take that lightly back to psalm 109 but do thou for me o god the lord for your name's sake do this for your namesake so they be saying look i represent you and look how they're acting act o lord for your namesake because your cassette is good deliver you me deliver me why because of your cassette that everything that they're doing cassette has remember cassette has two parts there is the love of the cassette the commitment that's side a but side b is the

punishment so here within the covenant community really what david is saying is exercise both sides of your cassette because it's good let me experience your loving commitment your loving kindness and let them experience the severity of your covenant wrath because your cassette is good for i am poor and needy and my heart is wounded within me that whatever it is they were doing it's not just about physical pain this is about deep discouragement deep psychological infliction of pain have you experienced that you know if you've been around god's church or god's people i'm sorry to have to say this but if you've been around god's people for any length of time unfortunately there's a lot of carnal human beings within the covenant community there's a lot of envious human beings within the covenant community some i think they have the holy spirit but they have human weakness others are terrorists they're in the community they learn the right words the right actions the how to dress how to show up vocabulary but they're really not with the program and they can be very very vicious as satan gets a hold of them and begins to use them but they don't understand the pain that they're causing here david is saying my heart is wounded that is quite something my heart is

wounded within me from people within the community i am gone like the shadow when it declines i am tossed up and down as the locust and we know david actually had to run for his physical life my knees are weak through fasting and my flesh fails of fatness you see his deep dependence on god that despite all this trouble he just keeps turning to god he says to to to make haste o god of my praise i became also a reproach unto them when they looked upon me they shook their heads and and that's you know you can find yourself in such a situation and and it's hard some people will look and see that you're in despair maybe you've lost your job maybe you've lost your family you're trying to be faithful to god but things are not going well and people just come and just look at you you're obviously being cursed they just look at you and they just despise you this is what david's situation is running for his life he had to give up everything they look upon him and they shake their heads oh you're obviously cursed by god not realizing no god is he has his eye on you god is watching over you and this is just a season that you're going through but he's going to bring you through it he's going to bring you through it job went through something similar in fact job had to go through this as a cleansing process so sometimes we have to embrace these periods of suffering as a purification process

here in job 16 and verse 4 he says i also could speak as you do so they're inflicting these words of pain upon him and he said look i could speak like you if your soul were in my soul's position i could heap up words against you and i could shake my head at you so you can see when something it's like kicking a man when he's down so job is down and they come shaking his their head at him and just despising him and and just telling him how how horrible he is and job is saying look the situation could be reversed and i could do this to you so this is what's happening to david they're shaking their head at him david turns to god verse 26 says help me o lord my god oh save me according to your cassette and again we've got to understand this cassette is is it it's two-dimensional there's the loving commitment and there's the severe punishment and he's saying these people are within the covenant community they're violating the covenant oh god they're violating the torah they're not they're not having any respect for your word they act as if they don't answer to anybody that requires the activation of the covenant curses david's saying i'm being faithful to you oh lord i'm believing in your mercy i'm relying on you and and you said in your covenant that if we do these things we'll be blessed

in these ways but if we do these things we'll be cursed in this way in these ways so they're doing the things that require cursing i'm doing those things that require blessing so please save me destroy them and save me according to your mercy it's quite quite some powerful you you can just see these words are coming from a place of deep pain and and had we not studied torah i think i would just have to read this psalm and say you know brethren we're going to skip over psalm 109 and i don't think it really applies today and let's just go to psalm 110 because this is difficult for us as christians where christ encourages us to pray for our enemies to forgive those who abuse us well christ is telling us we've got to operate at a much much higher level but at the same time when we apply our torah understanding to psalm 109 we can appreciate where david is coming from when we look at how god advises us in matthew 18 we can see that this is a prayer that god will answer and and and you know we have to commend david that despite all of this pain he does not take matters into his own hands he takes the whole situation to god and just unburdens himself before god and so if you're facing this type of

persecution which is not impossible if you're facing this type of persecution within the covenant community it's okay to be vulnerable before god it's okay to be transparent before god it's okay to pour out your heart and your troubles before god and what i would say is woe unto that brother or sister that has caused you caused your your soul this much pain but cry out and and let god take you through this process and ultimately you know if you see i think there's two things again right there's there's the uh person who can be led to repentance and we want to pray for them but there's also the incorrigible and there's a point where you begin to realize this person is incorrigible and i think we have to these these scriptures are here for a reason and so a cassette is real because said never goes away it's eternal it never goes away and so david is praying according to cassette and that there's an understanding there as well help me o lord my god or save me according to your mercy that they may know that this is your hand that you lord have done this that is an amazing verse that that all of this cursing that this very wise man this

prophet this king of israel this man after god's own heart all of these cursing that he's calling down upon members of israel of the covenant community he's calling them within the context of this that when they come down upon the head of the wicked within the covenant community that these men within the covenant community will know that all of this came directly from god and again i think i go to matthew 18 here that that this is god doing this he's not joking when you harm somebody within the covenant community when you falsely accuse when you destroy when you assassinate their character god doesn't take that lightly and david knows this and so he's saying act activate the covenant curses so that they will know that this came from you this is not david saying oh god turn them into apes and pigs because i'm just so angry with them and then they turn into apes and pigs and they can't figure out why this has happened some things are so ridiculous it's not funny but what david wants is that whatever these curses are that come upon them they'll be able to open up the torah and say this is from god and we we brought this upon ourselves we we knew he was innocent.

and we did this and now look where we are because god is faithful to his covenant do this o lord that they may know that this is your hand that you jehovah have done it let them curse but you bless so they're cursing me but i'm keeping covenant so god please you let them do what they're doing but you bless when they arise let them be ashamed but let your servant rejoice let my adversaries be clothed with shame and let them cover themselves with their own confusion as with a mantle so poetic but again this intensity we can only imagine the pain that these men caused king david for him to pray like this for him to express himself like this and not just to express him like himself like this and then okay i got that off my chest for him to express himself like this in poetry for him to take time to to capture these emotions and preserve them and put them to music so that thousands of years later they would still be sung and the thousands of years later when people find themselves in a very similar circumstance to david and they don't know how to pray

that these words are there in accordance with matthew 18. and i think that you know actually that's sort of a if you're going to reconcile uh the old testament quote unquote with the new testament quote-unquote and particularly if we're going to reconcile psalm 109 with matthew 18. i think the the the sort of the integration of these two passages would be that matthew 18 the purpose of matthew 18 and i gave a sermon called your under arrest which is in the archives and that just shows in detail line by line what the purpose of matthew 18 is and the purpose of matthew 18 that process is a reconciliation process that you have been harmed and you've been harmed by sin someone has broken the covenant and you've been the victim of their faithlessness to the covenant although the sin was severe and you have severely suffered your mindset as a holy spirit-filled member of the covenant is to see them also as a member of the covenant and to act in ways to reconcile them so god actually gives us the formula a three-step process to seek and pursue reconciliation to to have the will of god to have to be a person a man a woman after god's heart go through the matthew 18 process but then you get to the third step [Music] of the matthew 18 process and

instead of repenting and reconciling they continue in their wickedness now it's clear they're incorrigible and god says let them be to you a a as a publican and a tax collector said no now you can dismiss them and so i think at that end as a you know person in the new covenant the review the renewed covenant when we get to that third stage when god says okay let them be to you like a a a a a publican a tax collector they're like pagans now they've revealed themselves now we can go to a prayer like psalm 109 because now we really no longer consider them as brethren let my adversaries be clothed with shame and let them cover themselves let's check one thing here just give me a moment brethren sorry okay so i did something i skipped from verse 10 to verse 20. uh thanks pastor murray um i skipped from verse 10 to verse 20. let me just quickly do this psalm 9 10 20. thanks uh pastor murray so let me just quickly read this let his children be continually vagabonds and beg let them seek their bread also out of their desolate places let the extortioner catch all that he has and let the stranger spoil his labor let there be none to extend mercy to him i'm actually glad that thanks pastor i'm actually glad that i skipped that because that thought of how to reconcile psalm 109 and psalm 18 uh matthew 18

came to me after and so now with that thought of how they reconcile now when we come to verse 12 we get it they've gone too far and they've exposed themselves as not truly being faithful members of the covenant let there be none to extend mercy to him neither let there be any to favor his fatherless children let his posterity be cut off and in the generation following let their name be blotted out let the iniquity of his fathers be remembered with the lord and let not the sin of his mother be blotted out let them be before the lord continually that is their sins that he may cut off the memory of them from the earth because he that remembered not to show mercy but persecuted the poor and needy man that he might even slay the broken in heart so there's a viciousness to these people and and there's no there's they're incorrigible there's no repentance here david's had it and he brings this up this uh plea to god again within the context of torah as he loved cursing so did come unto him as he delighted not in blessing so let it be far from him as he clothed himself with cursing like as with his garment he'd come into his bowels like water and like oil in his bones let it burn unto him as the garment which covers him and for a girdle wherewith he is girded

continually so david really wants him wrapped up in this card david's had it he's had it this guy this whoever this is gone too far let this be the reward of my adversaries from the lord and of them that speak evil against my soul and i just have to ask i don't think people who follow these bible studies would be included here but possibly sometimes people are just curious but that's the question do you speak evil against the soul of god's people are you adversarial to those who are faithful to the lord this is quite the curse and god says yes i will answer this curse i will answer this prayer if it's a matthew 18 situation that's gone too far it'd be better if uh if this person were never born and a millstone was hung around their neck and they drowned into the sea i thank you pastor murray for that catch and again brother and i do sometimes i'm moving too quickly and i can skip verses that's not my intent we want to go verse by you know chap book by book chapter by chapter paragraph by paragraph line by line and not miss anything so that we can really make sure we understand and there are these hidden gems in the passages and sometimes we just jump around and go to the familiar passages and we miss these gems and especially as these days are accelerating and we're moving into this this sunset on the history of

mankind there's a lot of passages that are going to come to light and if we're not studying them line by line we're going to miss them verse 29 let my adversaries be clothed with shame and let them cover themselves with their own confusion as with a mantle now listen to jeremiah this is you know this is not just david david prophet of god man after god's own heart listen to jeremiah unless we're too harsh on david and think wow he's not really a follower of the lord to pray like that listen to jeremiah again that the difficulty that he had oh i love jeremiah if i lived in jeremiah's day i'd be his best friend jeremiah had a lot of trouble from the people of god jeremiah says give heed to me o lord and hearken to the voice to the to the voice of them that contend with me so listen to me and listen to them shall evil be recompensed for good same situation david was in he's doing his best to serve god he's doing his best to serve the people of god and he's being rewarded with evil same with jeremiah shall evil be recompensed for good for they have dug a pit for my soul these people mean business they want to destroy remember that i stood before you to speak good for them i was doing your work i stood before you to speak good for them and to turn away your wrath from them i understood your wrath i understood that you're a severe god

that it's not just oh i love everybody i want to give everybody a big hug and nothing matters and there's no such thing as evil no such thing as evil man i understood your wrath and i tried to warn them so that your wrath would pass over them so i tried to turn away your wrath from them therefore listen to jeremiah deliver up their children to the famine and pour out their blood by the force of the sword oh oh is this a man of god it you know personally it doesn't sound like it until we get into the covenant and we understand torah and we understand just how compliant or hyper-compliant these men were with god's word therefore deliver up their children to the famine and pour out their blood by the force of the sword these people have no idea what they're conjuring up they have no idea that they're siding with evil i'm saying they have no idea i think they know they're siding with evil but they have no idea of the consequences of this behavior they have no idea what they're bringing upon themselves what they're bringing upon their children it's like you're just like do you understand what you're doing do you understand the future that you are empowering and enabling and and what this future is going to do to your children do you understand

okay therefore deliver up their children to the famine and pour out their blood by the force of the sword and let their wives be bereaved of their children sounds just like david let their wives be bereaved of their children and be widows and let their men be put to death let their young men be slain by the sword in battle this is the prophet praying regarding members of the covenant community this this is not again let's be very clear he says to listen to me and listen to them and they're recompensing uh evil for good and he says here remember that i stood before you to speak good for them i was praying for them just like david was and to turn away your wrath from them so i understood and i was i was appealing to you for them and look how they treated me so this is this is not gentiles these are members of the covenant community and how does the prophet of god pray god destroy them that their young men be slain by the sword in battle let a cry be heard from their houses when you shall bring a troop suddenly upon them for they have dug a pit to take me and hit snares for my feet it's uh wow these are the this is the covenant community that

jeremiah was operating within the covenant community and he is shocked i'm what i'm i'm loving these people i'm trying to bless these people and now i find out they're trying to destroy me oh god act according to covenant vet lord you know all their counsel against me to slay me you know what they've said behind my back you know how they've sought to destroy me forgive not their iniquity neither blot out their sin from your sight now again unless we jump to conclusions and and think that jeremiah is not really fully converted i think of matthew 18 that these men david jeremiah these are mature highly spiritual highly uh uh scripturally compliant knowledgeable of the covenant uh i think you know there's a because they're holy spirit men filled men i think there's an there's a an element of matthew 18 where you don't just give up on somebody immediately that they would have appealed and and worked and really tried to make this work and then it became clear to them these men are unreasonable these men are evil and i think it would have gone to although they wouldn't have necessarily

gone through that formal matthew 18 process i think they would have gone through some process of forbearance and then their patience just ran out when they realized okay i'm dealing with evil here even though it's within the covenant community this is evil forgive you you know all their counsel against me to slay me forgive not their iniquity neither blot out their sin from your sight but let them be overthrown before you deal thus with them in the time of your anger again this is covenant insight it's better for them that a millstone were hung around their neck and they were cast into the depth of the sea then that they should offend one of these little ones that believe in me deal thus with them in the time of your anger and god says i will be i will unleash my fury upon those in the covenant community if they do not repent of this type of behavior and so it's not just david we see the very same attitude and prayer with this very advanced prophet jeremiah psalm 109 verse 30. so now he's concluding he unburdens himself with all of this and again i think to reconcile these two you don't i don't think you just jumped it to psalm 109. okay somebody hurt me i'm gonna quote psalm 109 and you know pray for god to curse them no i i think in matthew 18. assumed the best assumed that they were ignorant they

didn't understand you need to go to them privately share with them the harm that they've done and and with a heart of reconciliation oh they're not listening all right well this is serious according to torah because that now now you're you're in you're you're in danger zone you're in the zone of being eliminated so according to torah i need two witnesses two or three witnesses so now we're coming back we're going to revisit this but now we're going to revisit it with two or three witnesses so that every word may be established this is not going to be a false accusation when this goes to the next level we've got two or three witnesses that can say yes this is what happened and this is what was said and this is what this was the response SO now it's clear this person is incredible they don't care about the harm that they've caused they just don't care about god's word now we take it to the final stage we take it to the church and god says where two or three are gathered in my name i'm going to be there and whatever judgment you come to i'm going to back it up and so now it's clear this person just does not care now they're like a heathen to us and now we now all of that pain this is dealing with sin this is not somebody stubbed your toe this is sin agree of an egregious nature

somebody has done something extremely harmful in breaking god's commandments to harm you and instead of retaliating you've seen that okay yes i am harmed but this is not about me there's a bigger picture here and this is my brother in christ my sister in christ i got to explain to them the danger they're in what they've done to me the anger that this is causing god the pain it's causing me the anger it's causing god i've got to share this with them because they're in dangerous territory they're not listening okay i'm gonna go back but i'm gonna go back with witnesses they're still not listening okay now i'm bringing them i'm bringing this before the church and they're still not listening all right psalm 109. i will greatly praise thee lord with my mouth yes i will praise him among the multitude so he knows his outcome because of cassette for he shall stand at the right hand of the poor to save him from those that condemn his soul so no doubt uh brethren we're going to just face this the scripture says brother shall betray brother so we're going to be in this situation like you know don't be too hard on david we don't know the particulars of his situation don't be too hard on jeremiah we don't know the particulars of his situation but it was great evil and god tells us

we're going to face matthew 24 again we're going to face great evil great betrayal that great betrayal with consequences that are you know orders of magnitude greater than anything we've suffered so far and when we're in that type of suffering because of betraval first matthew 18. but when it comes to light okay these people really don't care these scriptures are are recorded and preserved for a reason so brethren this was a very very difficult uh psalm i think very hard for me when i was reading this to get my head around it but david was a man after god's own heart this scripture was written refined preserved and set to music or i should say set to music and preserved and it's here in the canon for a reason so there is going to be great evil in the covenant community first we seek reconciliation but if that's not there we don't take matters into our own hand we just appeal to god understanding that vengeance is his and we turn everything over to god knowing that he is faithful that he's a god of covenant and he will act so brethren thank you so much for joining me this evening we pray that you'll be able to join us on sabbath it's going to be at 1 30

eastern time uh just it's what a refreshing joy we have in this time of great confusion and darkness to spend time together in the word of god to educate ourselves in the word of god while most men are completely illiterate as to what's in god's word let's you and i go through the scriptures line upon line and come to understand god's word the wicked will not understand but the wise shall understand jesus is lord god bless you brethren you
