[Music] [Music] well greetings brethren hopefully you can hear me clearly maybe you could just go ahead and type in the chat that i am coming through clearly i have to say that i have mixed feelings about this study this evening uh on the one hand i'm always uh rejoicing whenever we can dive into god's word together and on the other hand i have to acknowledge a bit of sadness as we come to the end of our study of the book of isaiah oh thank you seeing i'm coming through loud and clear thank you so much i as i said i'm just feeling a tinge of sadness can you believe that we began to study this book together three years ago almost to the day it was october 2018 that we began the study of the book of isaiah and we've been studying it together for now three years isaiah feels like a friend that feels like just a comfort to us as he's given us so much understanding of what is going on in the world around us and nevertheless we want to continue our study we do want to conclude uh the book this evening uh covering chapters 38 and 39 the book has 66 chapters for those of you maybe who are just joining us we actually began in what's called second

isaiah with chapter 40 to chapter 66 so that's already in the archive if you missed that i would certainly encourage you to go into the archives and study those chapters and now this brings to conclusion first isaiah which we'll also add to the archives and we'll also add to the line upon line bible academy we're taking all of these studies these different books that we're studying where we're going through a line up online and converting it into more or less an online bible

correspondence or bible video course for people to take it in small chunks test their understanding and grow in grace and knowledge of our lord jesus christ so hopefully you can support our initiative there the website is lineuponlinebibleacademy.com very easy site to share with your friends and family and colleagues let's open with a word of prayer then we'll conclude isaiah this evening our heavenly father we come before you lord god almighty

just ever so grateful because we know that you provide what we need as we need it and certainly father this pivotal book

of isaiah especially when we combine it with

genesis and the book of revelation and everything in between we really come to understand your will and your zeal and we pray father that we would be conformed to your will to your zeal and to the mind of your son and our savior jesus christ we pray father that you'll bless

tonight's study and that you will just help us pray god almighty to act upon our understanding we praise you and thank you we ask this in jesus name amen

so thank you very much brethren and what we'll do here

is um

we will

go back just to pick up the tail end

of chapter 37

let me share my screen here and just just the gist of it in fact even before we go here let's just maybe just do a quick review

of

first isaiah

the first six chapters

are really the introduction of the book and really stating the case

that god has against his people it's a vision that he's given to isaiah against

his own people

judah and specifically jerusalem and we come to understand that these people the covenant people

suffer from the sin of pride and they're stubborn and rebellious even though

they're his covenant people

and that culminates then in the calling of isaiah and the beginning of his

ministry

which he begins with his people being under a curse

that despite his ministry they're not going to understand until the

abomination that makes judah desolate

then we go from chapter 7

all the way to chapter 35

where we are seeing the playing out of this lack of trust in god and this

pride

not only in judah and jerusalem but also

samaria the kingdom to the north and also in the gentiles

that this this sin of pride which is the sin of satan plagues all mankind and then we see the fruit of that with these judgments these terrible judgments again not only upon his people for their pride of judah and jews and samaria but also upon all the gentiles so we see these terrible judgments pronounced on the gentile nations as well all because of pride that takes us up to chapter 35.

last couple of weeks now last week we looked at chapter 36 and 37 and this week 38-39 in 36-37

we see a contrast in chapter 7 we saw the behavior of king ahaz and in chapter

36 last week

we see the behavior of his son hezekiah total contrast

king ahaz did not trust god at all and he preferred to turn to assyria for help and and and to rely on the syria against the uh

northern kingdom and their partnership with syria

so we saw that in chapter seven even though

the offer of god's help was there god was willing to show him a sign that he would support him he didn't want god now we see hezekiah his son behaving in the exact opposite way he actually trusts god so we see we see this trust uh that i that

hezekiah has

in god in the god of judah and just sets a wonderful wonderful example and and because of that now we'll come to uh chapter

37 which we covered last week but just sort of the gist of chapter 37 let me just share my screen here that the gist of it

we see here uh so if we can just culminate what do we get from from the chapter he says and this verse 30 shall be the sign unto

you which again he he was given this sign this now is the sign you shall eat this year such as grows of itself so you just survive on the land and the second year that which springs of the same and in the third year

you will sow and reap and plant vineyards and eat the fruit thereof so this is all you really you'll be freed in the third year of this threat and the remnant that is escaped of the house of judah shall again take root downward and bear fruit upward this is fascinating

these people this tribe has been on the earth for thousands of years with tremendous forces of evil against them right against them trying to eliminate them and all these nations come and go they disappear we can't find traces of them anywhere but this tribe remains

and here we see god acting supernaturally to ensure that they escape from assyria and that they take root downward and bear fruit upward and and still to this day despite even the recent holocaust

despite even the recent holocaust we still have these people on the earth and now we see this uh growing islamic anti-semitism

gaining tremendous momentum and with a great will and desire to destroy and remove these people from earth

god won't allow it they are his elect and then he says for out of jerusalem shall go forth a remnant and they that escape out of mount zion the zeal of the lord of hosts shall do this

so if we want to understand what is god's excitement what is his zeal what is he pulling off

you know

we talk about the zeal or he talks about the zeal of the lord as well in isaiah 9 what is that all about

because if we're his people we should be excited about what he's excited about so this is the zeal of the lord of hosts that shall do this

therefore thus says the lord concerning the king of assyria

and then when we trust god he looks after us and he looks after our enemies according to his will

hezekiah trusted god and now god is acting on behalf of hezekiah therefore thus says the lord concerning the king of assyria he shall not come into this city

nor shoot an arrow there nor come before it with shields nor cast a bank against it by the way that he came

by the same shall he return and shall not come

into this city says the lord for i will defend this city to save it

for my own sake and for my servant david's sake and we see in matthew 24 that

these servants of god

sort of the

representatives of the prophecies of isaiah in the end time these servants of god

god says to them you will be persecuted and hated by all nations for my name's sake

and here we see the zeal of the lord is based on saving these people for his

own sake

and for his servant david's sake there's there's a a promise that he's made that he's going to fulfill and this is still true to this day there's no escaping from the plan of the lord from the council of the lord so so with that is sort of the backdrop from chapters 36 and 37 where there's this incredible existential threat

and hezekiah

instead of panicking and running to egypt or running to any other gentile nation he took all these letters and he just spread them before the the lord of israel the god of israel and he appealed to him and god says yes i will defend you so this is king hezekiah tremendous king and sort of we sort of these opening bracket closing bracket on this uh chapters 37 architecture chapter

we open with the faithlessness of king ahaz and we close with the faithfulness of his son hezekiah

now

7 to 37

hezekiah was such a remarkable figure such a faithful king

that

one could begin to believe maybe this is messiah maybe this is the promised king

and so isaiah is going to make this very clear

don't think that for a minute no matter how remarkable a human being may be no matter how faithful a human being may be

is still a human being

and so here we have this remarkable man with remarkable understanding and

insight and faithfulness and and a great example and and and turning the the rebellious nation back to god after the rule of king ahaz now isaiah is going to show us it's still just a human being we're

dealing with so what happens here

in chapter 38

verse 1

in those days

was hezekiah sick unto death so we all get sick because sickness and in fact right now we're quite familiar with this with this pandemic of the covet

19 virus

which initially had a 99.9 recovery rate was like a bad cold or a bad flu

now it's

we're seeing

variants

that are becoming very deadly

however

when people get coveted it's really not stick on to death necessarily a lot of people get it bounce back and move on somehow it's turned into this

major

initiative

for the various governments of the world but i think we're all familiar with this concept of being sick versus being sick unto death so so he had something we don't know what it is

had something we don't know what it is we're going to learn later on there are boils on his skin

but he's some kind of sickness that he knows he's going to die and isaiah the prophet the son of amaz came unto him and said to him thus says jehovah this is a thus saith the lord

set your house in order for you shall die and not live so this is it this is the sickness that's going to take you take you down and out

then hezekiah turned his face toward the wall

and prayed unto the lord so far so good

SO

this you know assyria came and this is an existential threat he turned to the lord

now personally he's being challenged with this

deadly illness

and he turns to the lord and prays

and he said this

remember now oh lord i beg you

how i have walked before you in truth

and with a perfect heart

hopefully

if we are stricken with an illness to death that we could turn to god and say the same thing say god remember me how i've walked before you in truth with a perfect heart

and i've done that which is good in your sight amazing that's quite some level of confidence this man could have because a lot of the kings certainly all the kings of israel

and some half of the kings of judah the evaluation of their reign was that they did evil in the sight of the lord here has a kind of nose i did what was pleasing to you god with a perfect heart i did which was good in your sight and then

he wept sore

now

why did this affect him so much as a man of god

uh it's kind of surprising to me today actually to see

how panicked

christians are over death

like

isn't that the whole point of following

christ that we

take hold lay hold on eternal life

and yet this whole um pandemic and the

hysteria

that goes along with it and the death

count constantly in front of us

and and constant news of more cases more

deaths

we've seen hysteria

in the

christian community

which is surprising

we of all people on earth

should be should have a sense of

calmness and resolve

around our mortality because the whole

point of us turning to christ is we want

to live with him eternally and yet many

christians panic

and so something with hezekiah

despite his understanding

caused him to panic over his death now

we're going to learn

actually it's not here it's in um the

corresponding

uh narrative

in first kings 20 and 21 but there we

see

that when hezekiah finally died he was

he's going to be given an extra 15 years

but we see when he finally died and his

son takes over that his son was just 12

years old

when he began to reign this is manasseh

so his son manasseh takes over the

throne at 12 years old

hezekiah was given an extra 15 years

that means it was another three years

from this point when he's his life is

spared that he went another three years

before he had an heir to the throne so so maybe part of his heartache was the fact that he had no air and that these promises of the loyalty to king the day the house of david maybe this was part of his grief not sure but he certainly took this in a way to me that it's a bit questionable why would such a a faithful man of god be so afflicted by the concept of his mortality mind you maybe there's a lot now that we understand that they didn't understand at this time then came the word of the lord to isaiah saying so based on hezekiah's prayer and

comes to isaiah saying go

and say to hezekiah

thus says the lord so the lord said one thing

reaching out to god now this revelation

now the lord is changing his mind now this is not to be confused with what we see

i believe it's in

lord change not

amos i might be mistaken there but he says

um

[Music]

and actually maybe it's malachi sorry he says

that i the lord change not therefore you sons of jacob are not destroyed so on the one hand he says through malachi i don't change and yet here we can read very plainly in isaiah that he changed his mind so how do we resolve this a lot of people when they read the passage in malachi that i am the i the

especially the greek philosophers they get into this sort of metaphysical the unchangeable god and the the first mover the unchangeable mover and get into this deep philosophy but that's not at all what god was saying through malachi what he was saying through malachi and what he's been saying from genesis all the way to revelation and certainly we see it all the way through isaiah is that he's faithful to his promises he's faithful to his covenant because he's entered into a covenant an eternal covenant with jacob their evil they will not be destroyed because once he covenants he doesn't change his mind he's not like us i'm going to marry you then i'm going to divorce you i'm going to marry somebody else i just change my mind this is not the way the lord behaves once he covenants that's it. so the covenant is forever that's why the sons of jacob despite their debauchery and evil that's why they're not destroyed so the fact here similar to abraham when moses when they pleaded with god god changed his mind god can change his mind and he can respond to our prayers so first thus says the lord you're going to die now based on hezekiah's prayer thus says the lord the god of david your father i've heard your prayer and i've seen your tears behold i will add unto your days 15 years so this is a direct response this is the god who answers prayer and and sometimes we may be praying and

feel that our prayers are not answered in fact pastor murray has a habit actually of always saying to us god answers prayer it may not be the answer that we're looking for but he always answers so we need to have this confidence in this relationship with god knowing he hears our prayers and he answers our prayers so here he says i heard your prayer i've seen your tears behold i will add on to your days 15 years and i will deliver you and this city out of the hand of the king of assyria and i will defend this city and this shall be a sign unto you from the lord that the lord will do this thing as he has spoken so now god wants to give him this confidence the same way he wanted to do to his father king ahaz i wanted to give him a sign that he'd know here he's giving king hezekiah a sign behold i will bring again the shadow of the degrees which has gone down in the sundial of ahaz or the sundial that king has made i will bring it 10 degrees backward so the sun returned 10 degrees by which degrees it was gone down now that's something that we know god is doing so no man can do this so hezekiah would see this and know that wow i'm going to live another 15 years similarly in matthew 24 when christ tells us when he's asked by his disciples well what's the sign of your coming and he basically says don't

be deceived by people who are trying to tell you i'm here or i'm returning and they don't know what they're talking about they're false prophets and false teachers he basically says this when you see signs in the heavens the stars and the moon and the sun things that man cannot orchestrate that's when you know that's the sign i'm doing this so here this is something that only god can do and hezekiah can now have confidence now because of this answer we now see a psalm from king hezekiah and so i

a psalm from king hezekiah and so i should have mentioned at the beginning as well so we'll conclude tonight with the book of hezekiah next week god willing pastor murray is going to join me and we're just going to have a live q a so we'll just extend the study of isaiah another week so any questions that you've had as

this this wonderful amazing scroll of isaiah please uh share them with us you can email us ahead of time or even on the night we'll take your questions live

we've gone through over the past three

years

just feel feel free to share your questions with us and we'll have a very hopefully robust discussion uh to finally bring to the conclusion the book but the formal study of isaiah will then this evening we'll do a q a next week and pastor murray god willing will join me there so now and as i mentioned that to say then after that we will return to the book of psalms so i believe we have one more book to get through in the book of psalms book

five we'll go through that and i also want to look at the contemporaries of isaiah during the feast we looked at micah who was a contemporary in the south but also the prophets amos and hosea were also contemporaries with isaiah focused more on the northern tribes and so god willing will take a look at those books as well i would love to get into ezekiel another big book could take us a few years to get through but for now i'll hold off on that god willing psalms and then amos and hosea so here's a psalm now from king hezekiah the writing of hezekiah king of judah when he had been sick and was recovered of his sickness so this is islam i said in the cutting off of my days i shall go to the gates of the grave i am deprived of the residue of my year so just coming to terms with his mortality as we all must death is an enemy death is an enemy our dear sister uh mary bradar recently lost her battle with cancer and now she sleeps and we await her resurrection and please pray for her husband who survives her brother joe very faithful man but death is an enemy this is a painful thing couples who've been together for decades close close together and one is torn away please remember him in your prayers and his family death is an enemy and so here hezekiah is coming to terms with his mortality he said

i shall not see the lord and again he wept bitterly and and why well maybe here's part of it he said i shall not see the lord even jehovah in the land of the living so he understood isaiah's prophecies he was very faithful he behaved based on the teachings of isaiah very faithful to these teachings of the lord and he fully expected to see the messiah come into the land a

to see the messiah come into the land as as

isaiah prophesied so this was his expectation and now he's kind of caught off guard that he's going to be cut off and he's not going to see the messiah in the land of the living

i shall behold man no more with the inhabitants of the world okay i'm out i'm not going to participate in terms of what's going on on the earth anymore

my age is departed and is removed from me as a shepherd's tent

so they would understand as a shepherd sets up tent when it's time to take it down it's all taken down i have cut off like a weaver my life he will cut me off with pining sickness from day even tonight will you make an end of me so he realizes this sickness is not going away he's going into the grave and there's no more counting of days it's over i reckoned till morning that as a lion so will he break all my bones so that whatever this sickness is he's just seeing he's falling apart he's processing this it's amazing you know

it's uh it's like aging sometimes you might see a very old man or a very old woman especially those of you who might be very young and you see a very aged person

but that person doesn't feel like an aged person in in their mind they feel the same they're just much older maybe their body's a bit weaker but they feel like the same person here

he is realizing his body's falling apart but he's still able to think clearly and and like he's still hezekiah just that his body is collapsing on him and he's he's meditating on this all through the night

and seeing how the sickness is going to destroy him

he says like a crane or a swallow so did i chatter i did mourn as a dove my eyes fail with looking upward o lord i am oppressed

undertake for me so he was in real real grief

over this deathly illness what shall i say he has both spoken unto me and himself has done it so this is seen that this is a judgment from god that he is going to die i shall go softly all my years in the bitterness of my soul so this seems like uh as he's coming to terms with this he's going to be very careful in how he

on this

great illness

oh lord

by these things men live and in all these things is the life of my spirit so will you recover me

goes forward just meditating

and make me to live so now he's realizing god is intervening and is going to

save his life

behold for peace i had great bitterness

but you have in love to my soul

delivered it from the pit of corruption

so this illness was corruption it's just

his body's

decaying

and yet god in his love for him has

delivered him from this pit of decay

for you have cast all my sins

behind your back so this he whatever he

did he sees god has forgiven him and

it's put behind him and is restoring his

life

and then he says this and this is a

quite an understanding

you know hezekiah wasn't expecting to go

to heaven and sit on a cloud and praise

god forever

he understood he was dying and he

understood exactly

what death meant and he was a king he so

always

constantly following the teachings of

the great prophet isaiah

no doubt the prophet micah

and

had access to the scriptures

and he understood death you knew what it

meant you're going to die for the grave

cannot praise you

death

cannot celebrate you so there's nobody

in the grave praising you lord

they that go down into the pit

cannot hope

for your truth

so very very clear understanding

that death

is the cessation of life

and every false religion

teaches

that when you die

just as satan taught eve

when you die you don't really die when you die you just keep on living in another form hezekiah understood the scriptures when you're dead life ceases that's what death is the cessation of life they that go down into the pit cannot hope for your truth the living the living he shall praise you as i do this day the father to the children shall make known your truth so the praise comes from a living man and as he had children he's like i'm going to teach them to praise you now unfortunately his son manasseh turns out to be a wicked king who turns back to the ways of ahaz but nevertheless it's clear hezekiah is going to spend his time praising god the lord was ready to save me therefore we will sing my songs to the stringed instruments all the days of our life in the house of the lord and so much in this way of god involves singing we saw i believe it was last week how god himself is going to sing over his people and here we see hezekiah this righteous king is saved by god and he's going to put this this joy that he has in the lord to music with stringed instruments very i mentioned this because we want to be very very clear the god of the bible and the god of the quran have nothing to do with each other except that they're adversarial to each other the god of the guran is a is an adversary to the god of the bible and the god of the quran hates music

the prophet muhammad suffered from epilepsy and therefore he couldn't have dogs near him because if they just suddenly started barking that could trigger an epileptic seizure so he hated dogs dogs were evil and had to be killed and he hated music for the same reason music could trigger an epileptic seizure and so this god of the quran bans music the god of the bible loves music it's not the same god verse 21 for isaiah had said let them take a lump of figs and lay it for a plaster upon the boil and he shall recover so this is how we see this sickness maybe it's something like what happened to job but it certainly was some kind of affliction in his body and his body was decaying but this is what isaiah said he should do to get a lump of figs and lay it for a plaster on the boil and miraculously he'll recover hezekiah also had said what is the sign that i shall go up to the house of the lord so hezekiah wanted some evidence that his prayer was in fact going to be answered there's more detail of this event in second kings 20 but i just want to read a part of second kings 20 just to bring out a little bit more detail around this sign it says here in 2nd kings 20 and verse 7 and isaiah said take a lump of figs and they took and laid it on the boil and he recovered so hezekiah would have had attendance and they're the ones taking the lump of figs and putting it on the boil and he recovered and hezekiah had said unto isaiah what shall be the sign that the lord will

heal me and that i shall go up into the house of the lord the third day and isaiah said this sign shall you have of the lord that the lord will do the thing that he has spoken shall the shadow go forward 10 degrees or go back 10 degrees you choose and hezekiah answered and said it's a light thing for the shadow to go forward 10 degrees no but let the shadow return backward 10 degrees a little bit more detail than what we see in the scroll of isaiah SO

god actually offered him a choice and he chose the more difficult thing just so that he could be absolutely sure he was going to escape this illness and isaiah the prophet cried unto the lord

and he brought the shadow 10 degrees backward

by which it had gone down into the dial of ahaz

at that time baradak baladan the son of balladan king of babylon sent letters and a present unto hezekiah now it's important for us to understand that at this time

babylon is really nothing

the superpower on the earth at this time is assyria

and babylon is not something much to worry about

and so now babylon is starting to emerge but this

distant

uistaii

nation

heard

of the king's sickness

and he sent letters and a present unto hezekiah for he had heard that hezekiah

had been sick so let's go back now to the scroll of isaiah where we just saw that little bit of extra detail in second kings the historical record but let's go back to isaiah where we're going to see the same passage verse 1 of now chapter 39 at that time muradak baladan the son of baladan king of babylon sent letters and a present to hezekiah for he had heard that he had been sick and was recovered and hezekiah he was thrilled about this letter these letters and this gift and he showed and so the people came and he showed them the house of his precious things so they're coming with this gift in these letters and he's just over the moon remember the whole problem we're seeing in the book of isaiah is this problem of pride that we saw that with that's the root cause of the problem with israel it's the root cause of the problem with judah it was the root cause of the problem with king has is the root cause of the problem with all of the gentile nations and despite this righteous king despite his faithfulness we're seeing pride again and so we almost got caught up with a human being but thanks to the way isaiah is structured now he's going to end first isaiah showing us that even this faithful human being is afflicted by pride therefore he's not the answer and therefore we go into second isaiah beginning in chapter 40

through to chapter 66 where we come to learn of the true answer

the true

messiah

the one who is the opposite of pride and because of that the one who is able to come as the

lamb

to save his people so here we see this righteous king who's performed so well now

we see his

his seduction by flattery we all want to feel important we all want to be appreciated and we can if we're not careful we can succumb to flattery as did hezekiah

so he was happy of their visit and their gifts and he showed them the house of his precious things the silver and the gold and the spices and the precious ointment and all the house of his armor and all that was found in his treasures is like hey look at me i really am wonderful and thank you so much for this attention

there was nothing in his house nor in all his dominion that hezekiah showed them not

like they're just they're taking notes okay really what else do you have here and uh he was just really enjoying the praise and the attention then same issish the prophet unto king

then came isaiah the prophet unto king hezekiah

and said unto him

what said these men these foreigners that came to you what did they say and and from where did they come to you and hezekiah said

they came

from a far country

unto me

all the way from babylon they came to see me

because they heard i was sick

and they brought gifts and a really kind

letter

they came from a far country unto me

even from babylon

then said he

what did they see in your house

and hezekiah answered

all that is in my house have they seen

there is nothing among my treasures that

i didn't show them

i was just so happy that they came i

showed them everything

then said isaiah to hezekiah

hear the word of the lord of hosts

behold

the days come

that all that is in your house

and that which your fathers have laid up

in store until this day so this entire

wealth

that you as a nation

have accumulated

all of it

shall be carried to babylon

this next emerging

world empire

you're going to be a victim of babylon

so yes i saved you from assyria

but it's not the sort of one saved

always saved

yes i saved you from assyria

but if you depart from me that's okay i

can raise up babylon and deal with this

unfaithfulness

and that which your fathers have laid up

in store until this day shall be carried

to babylon

nothing shall be left says the lord

and of your sons that shall issue from

you

which you shall beget

shall they take away and they shall be eunuchs in the palace of the king of babylon so they're going to take and castrate your sons and and just have them as slaves serving the king of babylon then listen to hezekiah's response listen to listen to this response from hezekiah he says then said hezekiah to isaiah and it's almost like he's saying the quiet part out loud here he says good is the word of the lord which you have spoken it's almost like eli when he heard the word of the lord and just accepted it he says good is the word of the lord which you have spoken and then he says the quiet part out loud he said moreover for there shall be peace and truth in my days so it's like okay this calamity although it's going to come upon my people upon my nation upon my issue at least it's not going to come upon me so there really was again wonderful wonderful man remarkable king a tremendous king so we have a lot that we are grateful to hezekiah for at the same time a human being and that's really why we have to go through line upon line so we can just see and understand what is this message that isaiah is bringing to us and here what we see very clearly is there's a root

problem in man and it's pride

and despite this incredible performance and of faithfulness of hezekiah these babylonians came and flattered him and because of his pride

he was just easily seduced the same thing is happening today so we've got to ask ourselves as christians

are we easily seduced can people come along and tell us things like our lives matter and we're just easily seduced

do we have this same problem of pride because just like hezekiah god means to stamp it out

and either we can fast and pray and and and work on getting this out ourselves going through annually the days of unleavened bread and really taking to heart

this this unleavened approach to life or we can be crushed by the babylonians by the assyrians and so when god now moves we there's one narrative in the bible

and so when god now moves to crush his people judah and israel in this end time

we are on this earth and as we go about doing god's work

we can very much be caught up in all of this

and the question is are we all about exalting christ

no matter what do your worst we're just going to do our best to exalt christ or

are we going to be easily seduced are we going to be offended easily offended and turn away from god because of pride in fact pastor murray

gave a fantastic sermon just this past sabbath where he actually talks about this the tool of the devil to speak into our self-interest and seduce us this way that the battle is really a game star self-interest because that's the that's the device that satan uses so next week pastor murray will join me and hopefully uh brethren you have enjoyed this study as much as i have as i say really it's i just got used to being in isaiah and now it comes to a close but no no worry we can take all of these lessons from this great prophet and take them into the next book that we study we're going to return to psalms and then god willing after returning to psalms we're going to look at the prophets amos and hosea god willing and then we'll see where we go from there so brethren uh thank you so much for joining me and those of you who i know have been with us for over three vears now studying this book thank you so much hope that you have been edified by it and i look forward next week for you to interact with us live sharing with us your questions and your comments and thoughts on this wonderful book god is faithful and that's what we see that it doesn't matter what men do god doesn't change in his faithfulness so we can trust him we can rely on him that's the fundamental lesson that we take from this wonderful wonderful
