<ol style="list-style-type: none"> To write to you and exhort you (v3) Contend for the faith (v3) God destroyed forefathers (v5) Turn grace into lasciviousness (v4) To execute judgment on all (v15) These separate themselves (v19) Others save with fear (v23) To Him able to keep you from falling (v24) 	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> Suffer the word of exhortation (13:22) Draw near in full assurance of faith (10:22) Forefathers shall not enter His rest (4:3) Lest there be any fornicator (12:16) Our God is a consuming fire (12:29) Not forsaking the assembly (10:25) Consider one another (10:24) We have such a High Priest (8:1)
