well greetings brethren and welcome to another wednesday night bible study where we study the scriptures line upon

1:19

line we've been studying the eighth century prophets and this is the fourth of the four prophets the prophet hosea

1:27

this evening god willing i'd like to cover with you chapters six and seven

1:33

and certainly hope that your observance of the feast of weeks is going well and

1:38

you're just very mindful that we are heading now into this third of seven sabbaths that we're counting towards

1:45

the feast of pentecost so looking forward to celebrating that with you when it comes god willing and also

1:52

willing looking forward to observing the sabbath with you uh this coming sabbath and hopefully you

1:58

caught um the message that i gave last sabbath which was really reinforcing 2:04

a great message that pastor murray gave us on the last day of unleavened bread 2:10

and immediately after his message deacon jan gave a message which i want to reinforce

on this coming sabbath so if you haven't had a chance if you could review deacon jan's message which is entitled

2:22

uh is it new brand new or renewed covenant new or renewed covenant i think just uh

pulling these messages together just to reinforce them these two great messages that we received hopefully god willing

2:35

you'll be able to join us on sabbath for that let's um open with the word of prayer and then i'll check the chat just

2:40

to make sure that i'm coming through loudly and clearly our loving father we

come before you as we always do lord to acknowledge you to praise you to thank you 2:52

and to ask you to be with us to deepen our understanding and to deepen our faith 2:58

and we just thank you god for the light of your word as we descend into a darker and darker 3:06

world a confused world we just thank you for the clarity of your word and the steadfastness 3:13

of your faith and of your promises we thank you father and we thank you for jesus christ 3:20

in whose name we pray and ask these things amen amen

3:26

and yes pastor murray thank you very much uh video and audio are good so let's uh 3:32

jump into the scripture we want to cover as i said god willing hoseas chapters 3:39

six and seven and let's jump in first of all as i like to do let's just

3:46

back up a little bit and just remind ourselves where we were in chapter five so 3:53

you know i don't know how to describe how they it's a i can only describe it as a 3:59

difficult book hosea is a difficult book um you know what we opened with the first 4:05

three chapters and the metaphor that god uses he asks his prophet to go

4:11

and marry a woman of organs and have children with her and and this is to reflect 4:17

the whoredom of his people but not just the whoredom of his people because that's pretty intense

4:23

what is more intense is the love that god has for his

4:29

covenant people and so we have to be very very very careful

4:34

if our theology if our doctrine is teaching that god has done away with his people when he's 4:41

trying to demonstrate through this marital covenant the depth of his love and ongoing 4:48

eternal commitment to the people of israel so we need to keep that in mind as we go through 4:55

these scriptures and in hosea 5 just pick up a couple of verses at the tail end 5:00

of chapter 5. he he makes it clear how he is

5:05

determined to be faithful to the covenant and to punish israel according to

5:13

the covenant that they entered into willingly hosea 5 and verse 2 12 he says

5:18

therefore because of all of this idolatry adultery which is idolatry because of

5:25

all of this he says therefore will i be unto ephraim as a moth meaning he's

5:30

going to just devour her and to the house of judah as rottenness

5:36

so he's just fed up with these people when ephraim saw his sickness

5:42

and judah saw his wound so what did they do then went ephraim to the assyrian

5:48

instead of coming to god god is punishing them driving them to their knees so that he'll turn to them

5:54

they turn to the assyrian and sent to king jerob yet could he not heal you

6:00

nor cure you of your wound not unlike our situation today

6:07

when they put the frighteners on us with this pandemic and we all freaked out and

6:12

became panic stricken and instead of turning to god and acknowledging him as our healer we 6:19

ran we ran to the pagans and yet our situation is no better you

6:26

know they were gonna you know i will crush the pandemic vote for me i will crush i will i will crush the pandemic

6:33

for you okay and it's just getting worse so

6:38

you know by an act of mercy this omicron variant has uh acted really as a as

6.43

immunization that it's much milder everybody seems to be coming down with it and allowing the the natural immunity

6:50

to build up but god god doesn't like this he doesn't like when his people

6.57

refuse his help and turn to pagans and that's what ephraim did

7:03

and god says yet he couldn't heal you nor cure you of your wound

for i will be to ephraim as a lion this is the relationship that god has

7:15

with his people he's going to tear them apart this is god's relationship with his 7:20

people i will be into ephraim as a lion and as a young lion to the house of

7:25

judah a young lion just full of you know full of uh beings and and wanting to 7:31

just really demonstrate its strength and vigor now this is the relationship that god has 7:36

with his people i even i will tear and go away i will take away and none

7:43

shall rescue him so when god turns on his people there is no one

7:48

that we can turn to to rescue us from god he will use our enemies against us

7:53

and again as it was anciently no surprise if we see today

7:59

8:06

our western nations who are built upon the ethic of the bible of the scriptures

who have now rejected the scriptures turning to our enemies and no surprise if our enemies or god

8:13

destroys us through our enemies i will go and return to my place

8:20

listen until they acknowledge their offense this is the point

8:26

of the punishment this is how the covenant was set up it was not set up that if you disobey me 8:35

if you violate the covenant i will completely destroy you and take you completely out of existence and the name

8:41

of jacob will never be spoken of again that's not the way the covenant was set

8:47

up the covenant was set up in such a way that god is saying okay we are entering into an eternal 8:54

relationship that's what the covenant is it's an eternal relationship it is also a real estate 9:01

uh agreement that so so these people that god is entering into a relationship with he's 9:08

going to be in relationship with them forever and they're going to occupy

a special piece of real estate and they're going to have that real estate forever that's the covenant now god says

9:21

in that covenant agreement if you violate it i'm going to violate you

9:27

until you get down on your knees and repent and

9:32

turn to me so that we can have this relationship so there's no way out they cannot get out of the relationship

9:39

it's going to be painful they're going to be destroyed then they're going to be resurrected and 9:45

they just they're in this covenant that they have to come to repentance or they'll be destroyed 9:51

and they'll be ashes under the feet of the righteous but there will be god will have 9:58

this this harvest of the descendants of jacob forever as a kingdom of priests

10:05

uh to him and i'll talk about this a bit more on sabbath but that's a very

10:10

important verse phrase here in hosea 5 15 that he's going to tear them

10:17

and it doesn't end there it's not that i'm going to tear them apart until they go out of existence i'm going to tear them apart and i'm

10:23

going to go and return to my place and i'm going to watch them and i'm going to watch them suffer

10:29

until they acknowledge their offense and seek my face in their affliction

10:35

they will seek me early that's what that's what the covenant that's how the covenant was designed

10:41

they cannot escape it so the covenant is designed in such a way to drive them back into a faithful

10:48

relationship with god now normally i quote deuteronomy but moses makes it clear 10:54

in leviticus as well of this dynamic of the relationship the covenantal relationship they have with

11:01

god and he says this in leviticus 26 and verse 36

11:07

and upon them that are left alive of you i will send a faintness into their

hearts in the land of their enemies so this this correction is going to be

11:20

brutal and all there's going to be a lot of shed blood a lot of lost lives there

11:25

will be a remnant left through all of this and that remnant that's left god says

11:31

of you that are remain i will send a faintness into their hearts in the lands of their enemies 11:37

and the sound of a shaken leaf shall chase them you know we're we could kind of see that today 11:44

we have no courage we have no courage in our society

11:49

courage is like the principle virtue without courage all of the other virtues

11:54

collapse and we have no courage so it doesn't matter what else we have

12:00

without courage satan will will cause us to compromise and we will lose everything and today even christians

12:08

lack backbone even christians today lack courage though we have the holy spirit because 12:15

we're just it's just what seemed to be in a different era our forefathers

12:22

came to uh the new world and they suffered they died on the way

12:29

uh many of my my ancestors as who were captured as slaves and were taken to in my case the 12:35

caribbean many of them died along the way and then met with brutal conditions

12:42

and they faced it they faced it and they got up and they faced the next day

12:48

today we're just we i guess we're just so used to comfort

12:54

that we we just i've never i don't maybe you guys can tell me in the chat if you know 12:59

i don't know if there's ever been a society that sacrifices its children for its own 13:06

well-being uh and i know that the you know pagan society sacrificed their children out of 13:12

worship of the devil and the pagan gods but in a society that says

13:17

in order for me to be comfortable i'm willing to wipe out the next generation

that's what we're doing and it's quite phenomenal that we have no regard for the for the 13:28

value of the next generation we'll completely wipe them out we will force even newborns to be vaccinated

13:35

just in case we might get sick this this is uh absolutely crazy

13:40

but god says this is this is what he will do he will remove courage from his people 13:47

so much so that the sound of a shaken leaf shall chase them they just heard a leap shake and they ran

13:53

and they shall flee as fleeing from a sword it's just it was just a breeze on a leaf

13:59

and they panicked and they shall fall when none pursues

14:04

there's there's no nothing happening here but you're terrified and they shall fall upon and one upon

14:11

another as it were before a sword so they're gonna collapse as if somebody was slaying them with a sword when none

14:18

pursues and you shall have no power to stand before your enemies and boy oh boy when 14.24

i if i didn't live in this era i would never believe it but the united states of america

14:31

is the most powerful empire nation that has ever existed

14:38

and i am witnessing firsthand the utter destruction

14:43

of this empire you and i are witnessing it firsthand i would say that this is a nation that i 14:50

couldn't see how any nation could go to war against this nation

14:55

but it's going to war against itself and and we have put people in power who hate 15:02

the idea of america when you when you remove free speech america is gone america no longer exists

15:10

once you remove free speech and that's what's happening and so now we're seeing an america that

15:18

can have no power to stand before its enemies and with america then the rest of the western 15:23

world you shall have no power to stand before your enemy so god is the one who's actually behind this and you

15:30

shall perish among the heathen people who do not have the

15:35

the technological brilliance the the intellect the

15:41

the uh the legacy the the morality that you had

15:46

these people are gonna come and just wipe us out and you shall perish among the heathen 15:51

and the land of your enemies shall eat you up this is the curse of the covenant and they that are left of you shall pine

15:59

away so the number just keeps whittling down they shall pine away in their iniquity in your enemy's land so we

16:06

brought this upon ourselves i think we're all comfortable now but we're losing control of our countries enemies

16:12

are going to come in and remove us and also in the iniquities of their fathers

16:18

shall they pine away with them if they shall confess their iniquity

16:24

and the iniquity of their fathers with their trespass which they trespassed against me 16:31

and that also they have walked contrary unto me and that i also have walked contrary

unto them so this was the and i'm going to show up to them like a young lion and tear them apart and and god and his

16:43

people are contrary to each other and and when god is through punishing

16:48

them if they will confess that they have walked contrary to him

16:53

and he has walked contrary to them and they will confess their iniquities and and that i brought them into the

17:00

land of their enemies if then their uncircumcised hearts be humbled

17:06

and they then accept of the punishment of their iniquity that they will acknowledge that we brought

17:12

this upon ourselves then will i remember my covenant with jacob

and god doesn't mean you know he's going to remember his covenant with jacob he doesn't mean

17:25

oh yeah i forgot oh yeah that's right i made a promise to

17:31

jacob i clean for god that's not what god means god means that he will now act 17:39

according to the promise that he made to jacob that that he will establish jacob's seed

17:46

in the earth forever but they have to come to acknowledge their

17:52

violation of the agreement so so baked into the covenant

17:59

is the punishment for sin but also baked into the covenant is the

18:05

restoration of these people who violated the covenant back into the covenant as soon as they 18:11

back into the covenant because they were never out of it even when god is tearing them apart like a lion that's part of

18:16

the covenant so they can never leave the covenant but what god is saying is

18:22

they will not be wiped out that he made a promise to jacob he made a promise to isaac made a promise to abraham and even

18:30

though their descendants are wicked like a hosea says or god says

18:35

through hosea even though there is as wicked as a that that really i don't say it doesn't 18:42

matter because it matters but it doesn't remove them from the agreement that god has entered 18:49

into with abraham he says then will i remember my covenant with jacob and also my covenant with

18:55

isaac and also my covenant with abraham will i remember and

19:01

and i will remember the land we must never forget the land because

19:07

because the land is very much a part of this government the land not any land the land 19:13

the land so with that then as backdrop normally we go to deuteronomy but it's there in 19:19

leviticus it's in the torah that that god has made provision for this whoredom

it's awful i know it's not nice to read some of these scriptures

19:33

but i think as we read them we have to read them in the context of this hope

19:42

we are the first fruits of this hope there is going to be a fall harvest a

19:48

massive second exodus where he will gather his people from the

19:53

four corners of the earth and then after a thousand years he will resurrect his people

19:58

and they will be restored to this covenantal position

20:03

and this we must never forget despite their order so with that as context let's come now

to hose achapter six and verse one he says come or the prophet is saying

20:14

come and let us return unto the lord for he has torn like the lion he has

20:21

torn and he will heal us he has smitten

20:27

and he will bind us up this is an amazing uh ray of light

20:34

in a very dark book and this is like all the prophets are the same way they will they will 20:39

pronounce some some horrendous judgments and immediately after the horrendous judgment 20:45

they'll speak of this kind of millennial beautiful setting for god's people and we will never understand this what

20:51

were the prophets talking about we will never understand unless we have the torah as the foundation

20:57

unless we have the original prophecies laid down by moses as the foundation once we have that then

21:05

we can understand what these prophets are saying so despite the whoredom

21:10

of these people and god's destruction of these people there is still the hope that god will 21:17

return and that he will heal his people now let's just go to isaiah we spent a lot

21:23

of time years actually studying isaiah together let's review isaiah 30 beginning in verse 19 21:30

where the prophet declares categorically for the people

21:35

and in this case he's speaking of the jewish people but ultimately israel will be grafted back in the two sticks

21:43

judah and ephraim will become one stick and and israel will be brought back into covenant 21:48

but the people the covenant people shall dwell in zion at jerusalem

21:55

notwithstanding all of the effort of the heathen notwithstanding the hatred

22:01

the pathological murderous hatred of the of the heathen

22:07

that with not notwithstanding the people the covenant people shall dwell in zion at jerusalem believe it or

22:14

not as much as the heathen tried to eradicate them completely down to every

22:20

the last one man woman and child wanted to completely what is the same from the river to the sea palestine must be free

22:27

i.e they must remove and eliminate every jew from jerusalem that

22:34

desire notwithstanding these people shall dwell in zion at jerusalem believe

22:40

it or not god says so you shall weep no more

22:46

meaning when god tears them apart like a lion doing that through the heathen there's going to be a lot of tears

22:52

but god is saying through the prophet those tears will come to an end he will be very gracious unto you at the

22:59

voice of your cry when he shall hear it he will answer you isaiah is echoing moses what we just 23:07

read in leviticus god says i'm going to wait for them to acknowledge their sin

23.13

and then i'll return to them and though the lord give you the bread of adversity and oh yes 23:20

they're going to have some adversity and the water of affliction oh yeah they're going to have affliction

23:26

yet shall not your teachers be removed into a corner anymore

but your eyes shall see your teachers the you are we're speaking of the physical 23:39

descendants of judah that are going to face such pathological

23:44

hatred and and desire to be to be completely eliminated

23:51

yet god says despite all of that i will restore you and you will have teachers 23:58

this is why he has us his first fruits god could do it all himself but he chooses not to 24:03

he's recruited us to help him and we have to remember the plot line

24:10

we can't make up our own gospel we can't make up our own plans

24:15

we're recruited to participate in the plan of god

24:20

we're recruited to help god execute his plan so we need to know what the plan is 24:26

and we need to be preparing for this and so the teachers will be there to 24:31

help with this massive fall harvest and your ears shall hear a word behind 24:38

you saying this is the way walk you in it so somebody has learned the way of the 24:46

lord and can now teach others somebody and many of these somebodies 24:51

are actually gentiles who have come to him fully embrace the god of judah 24:58

and can now teach judah about their god this is the way walk you in it 25:04

when you turn to the right hand and when you turn to the left so what this is saying 25:10

is god has chosen these people to be the priest nation of the earth

25:18

and therefore they need to be schooled and protected and nurtured so that they can fulfill 25:25

that role so this is why god is recruiting first fruits now

25:30

so that we can assist in the establishment of this kingdom of priests on the earth 25:38

he says you shall defile also the covering of your graven images of silver 25:44

and the ornament of your molten images of gold in other words you're going to repent of your idolatry and get rid of

all of these things that you are worshiping and you shall cast them away as a minstress cloth 25:55

you're just like you'll just realize how vile this is and you shall say unto get your hands get away from me i i want to

26:01

be with god that's what these people will say while the first fruits will be there to assist 26:07

in this conversion process then shall he give you the rain of your

26:12

seed that you shall sow the ground with it and the bread of the increase of the

26:18

earth and it shall be fat and plenteous in that day shall your cattle feed in

26:26

large pastures so this is now this millennial setting that we often speak about and can envision 26:32

is going to be very special for these people the ox likewise and the young donkeys 26:37

that that ear the ground shall eat clean provender which shall be winnowed with 26:43

the shovel and with the fans again just a lot of abundance and there shall be upon every high mountain and upon every high hill rivers

26:50

and streams of waters in the day of the great slaughter when the towers fall so 26:55

obviously there's going to be a great slaughter of israel's enemies of judah's enemies moreover 27:01

the light of the moon shall be like the light of the sun you know we go out on a bright sunny day and

27:07

it's so bright that's how the moon is going to perform and the light of the sun shall be sevenfold 27:13

it's going to be bright bright as the light of seven days in the day that the lord binds up 27:21

the breach of his people there has been a breach they broke the covenant 27:27

but that does not end the covenant again i point you to deacon jan's 27:33

sermon about brand new or renewed that god is going to pull this off 27:40

despite the wickedness of his people and so here he's binding up the breach of his 27:45

people and healing the stroke of their wound and all the prophets speak about this 27:52

and so here coming back to hosea 6 and verse 2

27:58

he says after two days god will revive us so there's hope here it's not all lost

28:04

after two days he will revive us in the third day he will raise us up

28:10

and we shall live in his sight now i don't know about you

28:17

but i don't think there's any way to interpret hosea 6 and verse 2

28:24

except as a messianic prophecy how on earth

28:29

are these wicked people going to live in the sight of god without messiah

28:36

and and so it says after two days he will revive us in the third day he will raise us up so you know after two days

28:43

but in the third day these prepositions are supplied by the translators

28:49

the hebrew simply implies that it's after two days there'll be a revival

28:55

third day raising up so so i could equally say after two days

29:00

he will revive us after the third day he will raise us up and then we shall live

29:06

in his sight who is the we the we is this wicked this wicked wicked

29:14

that's the we can't just say oh this is the church no that's out of context

29:20

the context is this is a this is a wicked faithless

29:26

that has turned from god and through this process that god has

29:32

hosea go through we see god's commitment to his marriage

29:37

to the marriage covenant and so after two days we're waiting it's not

29:43

quite there but after the third day this is when it's going to happen there is a resurrection after the third day and

29:49

then we shall live in his sight why because christ came as the representative of israel

29:57

he came to represent israel israel could not abide by the terms and conditions of the covenant 30:03

and therefore they by law they must be destroyed they must be written off 30:08

they cannot come into the land by law because of their violation of the covenant

30:14

so what does christ do christ says i will go to earth i will become human

30:20

i will become an israelite more specifically i will come in through the tribe of judah

30:26

and i as a representative of israel will live perfectly according to the torah i

30:32

will be 100 torah compliant and in so doing

30:37

legally and lawfully i will inherit all the promises of the covenant

30:44

now comes the crisscross instead of me actually now

30:50

taking the reward of the covenant i will instead take all of the

30:56

punishments of the covenant as a representative of israel i will take all of the punishments of the covenant upon

31:03

my innocent self so even though i i did nothing to deserve these punishments in fact i did 31:10

everything to deserve the rewards of the covenant i will now take upon myself these punishments

31:16

and israel whom i represent can now lawfully enjoy the land

31:23

and the benefits of the covenant if and only if they accept me as their personal 31:28

savior so i will take their punishment and they can take my reward and as the 31:33

innocent lamb of israel i can do this and so this is why after three days

31:41

when christ is resurrected in a very real sense all of the 12 tribes are

31:48

lifted up with him in a very real sense israel comes back to life

31:53

with the resurrection of christ and i believe this is why the apostle paul rabbi paul 32:01

says in first corinthians

32:06

15 and verse 4 that christ was buried and that he rose again the third day

according to the scriptures so certainly we know uh jonah was one of

32:18

those scriptures because christ himself quoted jonah now the lord prepared a great fish to swallow up jonah and jonah

32:25

was in the belly of the fish three days and three nights and then christ himself said as jonah was three days and three

32:31

nights in the whale's belly so shall the son of man be three days and three nights in the heart of the earth

32:38

but then luke also shows us that when christ was resurrected he went through all the scriptures 32:44

and showed his disciples how all the scriptures spoke of him

32:49

and he taught paul directly so certainly when paul says that he rose again the third day according to the scriptures

32:56

for me there's no doubt according to the scriptures one of these scriptures being hosea 6 2 that israel

33:02

comes back to life after the third day that that's how he will raise he will

33:07

raise israel back up despite her whoredoms and her faithlessness

33:14

isaiah 6 and verse 3 then shall we know if we follow unto

33:19

know the lord his going forth is prepared as the morning and he shall come unto us as the 33:25

rain as the latter and former rain unto the earth how do we read this

33:31

and not be amazed at god's faithfulness like oh

33:37

another question is how do we read this and embrace replacement theology how do 33:42

we read this and say yeah god is done with israel physical israel he's done with the jews we now replace them

33:49

you can't go to a you know according to the muslims according to muhammad 33:54

uh the jews um they fished they went fishing on the sabbath day and for that 34:00

reason god was so upset they were very hungry he had not given them any food for the week and so on on the sabbath he

tested them they were starving starving to death and on the sabbath he tested them by putting fish in the water and

34:12

they went and they fished for their children to feed their children but they did it on the sabbath and because of

34:18

that allah was so furious that he turned them into apes and pigs

34:23

for breaking the sabbath and from that point arabs rejoice that god has rejected the jews they're now

34:30

apes and pigs and when they actually go to the zoo and see monkeys there they believe they're looking at the children

34:36

of jews that that jews literally allah turned them into apes and pigs

34:41

and instead transferred the covenant to arabs because they went fishing on the sabbath

34:47

because they were starving to death obviously this is a prophet that didn't

34:53

read the book of hosea that didn't read the bible because throughout the bible and

34:58

especially hosea we see how incredibly wicked these covenant people are

35:05

but we also see how incredibly faithful god is to his covenant

35:10

that that his faithfulness to the covenant is not a function of whether or not israel will 35:16

be faithful in fact hosea tells us very clearly israel is unfaithful but god is faithful 35:23

and so here we read this the prophet sees this incredible relationship that

35:28

israel will ultimately have with god despite her faithlessness

35:36

then he goes on verse 4 oh ephraim what shall i do unto you

35:42

oh judah what shall i do until you can feel the pain like i'm trying to work

35:47

with you here i've made a promise to your forefathers can you help me out i'm trying to do something here and you

35:54

have no regard for your goodness is as a morning cloud

and as the early do it goes away so it's like if they're they're so fickle

36:07

that in the morning you might see a cloud and by the afternoon it's gone the sun has burned it off it's like blue

36:14

skies everywhere the cloud is gone or the the dew in the morning it's like hey the grass has a bit of dew on

36:19

it by midday it's completely dry it's gone that's the goodness of ephraim that's that's the goodness of judah

36:28

so so god is steady but they are not therefore i have hewed them by the

36:33

prophets i have slain them by the words of my mouth and again if we don't understand moses it's confusing is god

36:42

for these people or against them it keeps going back and forth well the original prophecy by moses said

36:48

this is the way it would be so god has destroyed them by the prophets that that by the words of his mouth he's

36:54

saying this is what the covenant says and you violated it this is the destruction that's coming down upon you

37:01

your judgments are as the light that goes forth it's like it's plain as day and we're 37:08

gonna open the scriptures we're gonna open what moses wrote and we're gonna read from it and that's your

37:15

judgment why because i desired mercy and not

37:20

sacrifice and the knowledge of god more than burnt offerings and pastor

37:26

murray this reminds me of your entry into the slack channel as you're helping us 37:32

go through the count and going through the apostolic writings of peter and god desires the knowledge of god

37:39

not not just knowledge there's a lot of knowledge in the world today in fact it's quite impressive uh that the knowledge that's available

37:46

to men today but look at the state that we're so so knowledge is not really the

antidote to man's ills the knowledge of god

37:57

is our antidote and for some reason israel didn't get that they thought that it was okay 38:04

just to go through the rituals so they were still having sacrifices

38:09

so they'd have the morning and the evening sacrifice but before in between and after they were 38:16

committing adultery you know let's let's go through the ritual of worshiping jehovah 38:22

and then let's go and worship ba'all and let's go to the temple prostitutes and let's have sexual relations with them so

38:29

that we can invoke rain from baal oh and then let's go and do the evening sacrifice with jehovah

38:36

and we need to be very careful brethren if we're just going through a ritual and not actually building a trusting

38:42

relationship with god because god doesn't want it he's saying to israel you you missed the 38:48

point the point of going through these rituals was for you to understand me 38:56

to understand what it means to be in a relationship with me completely missed the plot he says he

39:01

wanted mercy not sacrifice so sacrificing the animals was not what he wanted he wanted you to understand

39:09

the power of sin and the consequences of sin and he wanted you to to obtain the 39:15

knowledge of god more than burnt offerings and in fact christ himself

39:21

quoted this passage in matthew 12 and verse 1

39:26

at that time jesus went on the sabbath day through the corn on the sabbath through the corn 39:33

and his disciples were hungry and began to pluck the ears of corn if only muhammad 39:39

knew the scriptures that were available to him then he wouldn't write in the quran

that because the jews had went fishing on the sabbath day because their children were starving to death

because god withheld the fish and so they went to feed their children

39:55

and then allah just blew a gasket he just went ballistic

40:00

and and turned them into apes and pigs which nowhere is written in the torah but this was just he just lost he just

40:06

lost his mind and when it went ballistic and turned them into apes and pigs if only muhammad could read and could read

40:13

the scriptures and and the teachings of christ who he apparently says he followed 40:19

that the mind of god he's with his disciples and they were hungry

40:25

see they began to pluck the ears of the corn and to eat it under his direction but when the pharisees saw it they said

40:32

unto him behold your disciples are doing that which is not lawful to do upon the sabbath day so 40:38

the conflict goes on but in verse 6 christ then schools the

40:44

pharisees and he says i say unto you in this place is one greater than the

40:51

temple but if you had known what this means quoting hosea

40:56

i will have mercy and not sacrifice you would not have condemned the

41:01

guiltless so so right back at the time of hosea god was telling them i want you to

41:08

understand me you're doing all these rituals but you're missing the point

41:13

here at the time of christ on the earth god on the earth

41:19

he's saying you didn't understand you still don't understand had you understood you would know who i

41:25

am and you wouldn't be condemning me back to isaiah verse 7 chapter 6

41:32

but they like men have transgressed the covenant they've transgressed the covenant that 41:38

does not remove the covenant that does not eliminate the relationship these people have with the covenant

41:45

but they certainly have transgressed the covenant what that does is it activates the curse clauses

of the covenant which we saw the purpose for those clauses is not to completely eliminate the people but to drive them

41:58

to their knees and to drive them to repentance so curse clauses are now activated

42:03

but they like men have transgressed the covenant there have they dealt treacherously

42:10

against me that's what they've done they have worked treacherously against god gilead is a city of them that work

42:17

iniquity so just north of judah um you know this is a place you maybe it

42:23

had a reputation but god is inquiring and looking and saying no nothing but iniquity and it's 42:30

polluted with blood murder again uh just so much what we're reading here

42:37

about ancient israel we see today in our society you know the best of our cities

42:46

are our workers of iniquity the best of our our leaders are our

42:51

mayors our governors our uh premiers our prime minister our presidents

42:58

all of the leaders they're they're engaged in murder

43:04

uh listening today about uh ukraine and how we must you know we must

43:12

arm ukraine because it's good for the american economy it's good for the economy

43:17

wow do you realize people are being slaughtered and tortured and destroyed their lives upended 43:24

yeah well it's good it creates jobs so the best of our place cities are

43:30

polluted with blood actual murder and as troops of robbers wait for a man

43:38

so the company of priests murder in the way by consent

43:44

these are the religious leaders they're going along with it all good to them they they see the 43:49

benefit they're going to play the role of priests but corrupt priests because there's a benefit to them and so they're

43:56

involved in this murder as well and they commit lewdness the priests

so god wants knowledge he wants his people to have this knowledge malachi makes it clear or god

44:09

makes it clear through malachi that the people should seek knowledge from the priest slips but the priests are luke

44:17

i have seen a horrible thing in the house of israel there is whoredom of ephraim

44:24

israel is defiled this is a horrible thing and again if we don't understand torah

44:31

we would think this is the end there's no hope but because we understand torah because

44:36

we understand the writings of moses we can read this in the context of the eternal covenant 44:43

that somehow god is going to pull this off somehow the promises

44:48

that he made to abraham isaac and jacob and it's impossible for him to lie it's impossible for him to break a promise

44:55

it's impossible for him to go back on an oath so that is the backdrop that we have

45:01

while we're reading this so somehow as the chapter opened with this strong hope of no note of hope

45:08

we we continue to have this hope for ephraim we have this hope for israel

45:14

and we find that that hope is in judah because in ezekiel and in jeremiah

45:21

god says that he's written off israel because of their

45:26

whoredom and then immediately after that he says judah saw how wicked

45:33

israel was and instead of repenting judah was worse

45:38

than is in fact judah in a sense what's the word justified

45:45

judah's wickedness justified israel or exonerated israel because judah took 45:50

the wickedness to the extreme and yet despite that god did not divorce judah

45:57

god remained in covenant with judah why because of his promise to abraham he's

46:04

pulling something off here and he he's bound by his word he's bound by his covenant

and so ephraim is is full of whoredom israel is defined

46:15

and then the prophet says also o judah he has set a harvest for you

46:22

when i returned or when i ended the captivity of my people so we know

46:28

from moses the captivity was to drive the people to repentance

46:34

the captivity will do that and when they turn to god god will turn

46:39

to them and he will end the captivity so this word return to hebrew shiv it means

46:45

to end to turn it around so there's a harvest

46:52

set for judah when the slavery of god's people comes to an

46:59

end there will be a harvest in judah this is the fall harvest

47:04

now this word uh turned or shiv we see it in job

47:10

42 that the lord ended the captivity of job

47:16

when he prayed for his friends also the lord gave job twice as much as he had before and i did a study on job

47:25

and showed how really the life of job was symbolic of god's relationship with

47:31

israel just as the life of hosea is symbolic of god's marriage

47:37

to israel but in any case what i wanted to point out there is the the notion of ending the captivity 47:44

so in deuteronomy 30 and verse 2 and this is our sort of go-to passage

47:50

so let's go there about ending the captivity there's going to be a harvest in judah when god ends 47:56

the captivity of his people remember he has divorced the northern tribes so now the relationship is in judah

48:04

gentiles are being grafted in to judah becoming spiritual jews

48:09

ultimately though god will take ephraim the stick of ephraim and the stick of judah and bring them together and

48:17

ephraim or israel will be grafted back in but it is all centering and we saw

this in isaiah and in micah it's all centering around the covenant relationship that remains in judah

48:28

despite the fact that judah is cursed with blindness that they will be driven to repentance 48:34

and everything will turn around so here in moses in deuteronomy torah and he 48:40

shall when you shall return unto the lord your god and you shall obey his voice

48:46

according to all that i command you this day so everything that's in torah they're going to 48:51

listen to him at this point and then he says

48:57

because of the the curses that come upon them you not just you but you and your 49:03

children with all your heart let's stop the

49:08

ritual but stop the hypocrisy now you really mean it so when that

49:13

happens when you really repent with all your heart and with all your soul that then the lord will end your captivity so

49:21

hosea is making a call back to torah that this is when there will be a

49:26

harvest in judah the remaining covenant people that the lord your god will end your

49:32 captivity and have compassion upon you and he will return shove and gather you

from all the nations where the lord your god has scattered you so we saw that in leviticus we see it here in deuteronomy

49:44

49:38

we continually see it in all the prophets we just have to understand it

49:49

back to hose a continue in chapter 7 verse 1 he says

49:57

when i would have healed israel i was ready to heal israel

50:02

that's when the iniquity of ephraim was discovered and the wickedness of samaria samaria 50:09

being the capital of uh israel and that's sort of their worship center

50:15

for they commit falsehood and the thief comes in

and the troop of robbers spoils without again it's just like a perfect description

50:26

of our society today they're just drunk on theft they're drunk on wickedness

50:31

and they discovered not in their hearts that i remember all their wickedness

50:38

now their own doings have beset them about so there are consequences it's a cause and effect world and there are

50:44

consequences to how we live their own doings now their own doings

50:51

have beset them about or have surrounded them and they are before my face so god

50:57

is not forgetting their wickedness they make the king glad with their

51:02

wickedness and the princes with their lies so they're willing to

51:07

violate common decency and morality in order to

51:13

please the leaders they are all adulterers all of them

51:19

that that that's this is not new what what we're facing today in our society the

51:25

the sexual immorality that is just flagrant

51:30

and it's just openly out there it's everywhere it's either even going after the children

51:36

this is not new this is you know maybe the extent to which they're going after the children is due

51:42

but the the egregious immorality it's not new and the fact that it it just seeps into

51:48

every aspect of society it's not new even the covenant people when they

51:53

started to play with uh ba'al and the pagan nations and allow some of that immorality to creep in it takes

52:00

over a little eleven eleven is the entire lump they are all

52:05

adulterers as a as an oven heated by the baker

52:10

and we we saw this on sabbath here with us jeremiah 5. it says the same thing they're they're 52:17

they're like an oven they're hot and coveting other men's wives

the people of god they are all adulterers as a hove as an oven heated by the baker 52:30

who ceases from raising after he has needed the doll until it eleven so it

52:35

just gets to a point where the baker just knows the whole thing's gonna be leavened i can just leave it now

52:42

in the day of our king the princes have made him sick with bottles of wine he stretched out his hand with scorners

52:49

so again speaking of the extent of the corruption for they have made ready their heart 52:55

like an oven you know if you're going to be baking you might follow a recipe and they might 53:01

say you set the oven to 325 and let it sit there for 30 minutes we want the

53:07

oven to be nice and hot before we begin putting anything in it this is we're talking here about 53:12

israel's wickedness and it's just the oven is hot uh and that's where today

53:19

we have to be very careful about our entertainment about our access to the internet 53:25

about the books we read all this stuff that comes in through our eyes through our ears 53:32

through our five senses because it's what it's doing it's it's baking the society the society is like 53:38

an oven that's just hot hot with adultery and and fornication

53:44

and all kinds of immorality is just it's just baked into the society now

53:49

he says they've made ready their heart like an oven while they lie in white

53:55

their baker sleeps all the night in the morning it burns as a flaming

54:00

fire okay it's hot now it's like we're ready to go they are all hot as an oven this is the 54:07

creator looking at his covenant people and this is his assessment

54:14

it's gotten so much into their psyche and into their heart they are all hotter than oven 54.21

and have devoured their judges and again you look at us today you can judge 54:26

you can look look at uh this supreme court leak in america uh regarding abortion

wanting to push it back down to the states and there there's panic and freaking out everywhere this this gets

54:40

their attention and they want to fight back now so judges are now afraid

54:46

to give judgment because the people will just turn on them they've devoured their judges all their

54:52

kings have fallen there is none among them that calls unto me

54:58

boy does that describe our world there's not a leader now

55:03

that calls to god they've all given themselves over

55:08

ephraim he has mixed himself among the people meaning the pagans

55:16

ephraim is a cake not turned so he's continuing this

55:21

baking metaphor where might not be as uh hard easy for us to

55:27

appreciate this given the technology today where you have an oven and it's nice and sealed 55:32

and maybe it's got the the air is circulating in the oven so you can put your bread or your cake inside and all

55:39

the air circulates around and you bring it out and it's like wow it's just perfect golden everywhere and you cut

55:44

through it and it's perfectly timed and so it's just a beautiful cake that you've made or a loaf of bread

55:51

but anciently when you're dealing with real fire and maybe a bit of a

55:56

cave or a cavity that you're able to use as uh an oven

56:02

well they would have to turn the cake over or turn the bread over so it's gonna burn on or cook on bake on one

56:10

side and then you're gonna flip it over to get it to bake on the other side but if the oven is really really really

56:18

super hot and you put the cake in and then you don't turn it

well you're going to end up with one side that's totally burned and the other side that's not baked

56:29

all so it's just completely useless like whatever your intent was

56:34

when you put that that dough in the oven whatever you were hoping to get out of it

56:40

you didn't get it you got it's burnt to a cinder on one side and completely

56:46

uh doughy and wet and inedible on the other

56:52

strangers have devoured his strength it's just hard to read this ancient text

56:59

without seeing ourselves in it today to look at the open borders

57:05

where strangers are coming in and destroying our strength strangers have devoured his strength and

57:12

he doesn't know it politicians are up there saying this is a wonderful thing and we're watching the destruction

57:18

of western civilization and us with it strangers have devoured his strength

57:25

and he knows it not and by the way the strength of the west was the scripture

57:31

the moral code the work ethic that we got from scripture

57:37

that was our strength and we've abandoned it and we're allowing now anything goes

57:43

there's no civilization that's better than another there's no culture that's better than another it's all equal bring

57:50

your paganism we don't have any virtue we don't have any values why don't you teach us about your paganism and we will

57:56

bow down at your feet to learn about pagans and pagan worship and we will just you know 58:03

flog ourselves strangers have devoured his strength and he doesn't even realize it

58:08

yet gray hairs are here and there upon him yet he knows not

58:16

it's over you're getting old here you're dying and you don't even realize it

58:24

and the pride of israel testifies to his face

and they do not return to the lord their god nor seek him for all this

58:36

chilling chilling words why because we know that god is in covenant

58:43

with these people he's in covenant with their forefathers and because of that covenant 58:49

he has to fulfill that promise to them therefore the punishment on this people what does 58:56

uh jeremiah daniel say he says it's the time of jacob's trouble

59:02

and this is a time of trouble the likes of which the world has never seen this is why 59:09

this is why that when god tore them apart he thought that was enough that would 59:14

have caused them to repent it didn't therefore the punishment must be intensified 59:21

and so this tribulation this great tribulation i sometimes will refer to it as the 59:26

great restoration or you could say this is the true great reset the great tribulation 59:34

is about restoring israel restoring jacob and and god has to go to this extent of 59:40

punishing these people with a punishment the likes of which the world has never seen 59:46

in order for him to drive them to true repentance he says

59:52

that the pride of israel testifies to his face and they do not they still don't return 59:57

to the lord their god nor seek him for all this ephraim also is like a silly dove 1:00:03

without heart they call to egypt they go to assyria i

1:00:08

mean you know they they cut off their own energy independence

1:00:14

they they cease to produce their own energy when that's the source of all prosperity 1:00:19

from for modern civilization they cut it off and then they run to iran 1:00:26

and say iran could you can you sell us oil and saudi arabia and venezuela can 1:00:32

you sell us oil we you know we we've put ourselves in a totally dependent 1:00:37

state and now we're going to our enemies to say can you please help us how about

1:00:44

that's a silly dove then you just watch it dub flying around and knocking itself into the windows and just has no sense

1:00:51

without heart they call to their enemies these beast powers that want to destroy them

1:00:56

they call to egypt they go to assyria when they shall go

1:01:01

i will spread my net upon them i'm going to make this a snare i'm going to trap them with this 1:01:08

i will bring them down as the fowls of the heaven i will chastise them

1:01:13

as their congregation has heard so they they've heard that somebody has read moses to them 1:01:20

that the prophets have told the congregation here's the word of god and now it's going to happen according to

1:01:27

the word of god and they will know because they've been taught woe unto them for they have fled from me

1:01:34

destruction unto them because they have transgressed against me

1:01:39

though i have redeemed them yet they have spoken lies against me

1:01:45

and i would say that despite all of our prosperity when we start saying things like

1:01:51

a man can be a woman and a woman can be a man and this is how god made them

1:01:56

that when we say children and say you know we have to perform surgery on this child because god made them

1:02:04

opposite to how they were born you're telling lies on god they've spoke i tried to redeem them and

1:02:11

yet in fact i did redeem them and yet they've spoken like they found that the thanks i get is they speak lies against

1:02:18

me they have not cried unto me with their heart

1:02:24

this is calling back to torah the purpose of these punishments according to moses was to get them to

1:02:31

truly but hosea is saying it hasn't happened yet

1:02:37

ephraim is a cake not turned they have not cried unto me with their heart

1:02:43

when they held upon their beds so so they were suffering they didn't like the economy collapsing they didn't like

1:02:50

their enemy overpowering them they didn't like suffering so they were howling upon their beds but they weren't

1:02:57

repenting they didn't like when disease spread through the land

1:03:03

but they didn't repent they didn't turn to god they didn't even acknowledge him they tried to come up with some

1:03:08

concoction to avoid having to deal with god

1:03:13

they assemble themselves for corn and wine and they rebel against me

1:03:18

though i have bound and strengthened their arms yet

1:03:24

do they imagine mischief against me so you could imagine if somebody was injured and say their arm was broken

1:03:30

and and you put it in a cast i can speak this from my own experience uh and then after

it comes out of the cast it's a bit weak so it's some physiotherapy to get it strong again god has done this for them

1:03:42

you know they they were weak and god strengthened yet

1:03:48

do they imagine mischief against me they return but not to the most high

1:03:55

they really don't have this understanding of what this was all about they are like a deceitful bow 1:04:02

very important here a deceitful bow so you you going into battle and you want to depend 1:04:09

upon your weapons and this is a bow you can't trust it's gonna it's gonna fail when you need 1:04:15

it brethren we can't be like this beloved brethren we cannot be like this we we

1:04:21

have to return to the most high we cannot get swept up with society

1:04:28

that sins upon sins upon sins and then wants to avoid the consequences

1:04:34

no no no we we understand we can observe and understand and we turn to god with our whole heart we realize we are the

1:04:40

first fruits but we need to educate these people when they come up in the resurrection god wants them educated

1:04:47

they return but not to the most high they are like a deceitful bow their princes shall fall by the sword

1:04:54

for the rage of their tongue this shall be their derision in the land of egypt so they're going to suffer for

1:05:00

this now just we'll end here um just quoting this deceitful bow is a call back

1:05:06

actually or psalms is a call to this but let's just uh read psalm 78 just to finish up this evening 1:05:13

breaking at verse 51 that god smote all the firstborn in egypt he redeemed them this is the redemption that he spoke of

1:05:20

he redeemed them and yet they told lies against him he smote all the firstborn in egypt and 1:05:25

the chief of their strength in the tabernacles of ham but made his own people to go forth like 1:05:30

sheep and guided them in the wilderness like a flock and he led them unsafely so that they 1:05:36

feared not but the sea overwhelmed their enemies and he brought them to the border of his 1:05:42

sanctuary even to this mountain which is his which his right hand had

1:05:49

purchased he cast out the heathen also before them and divided them in inheritance by line 1:05:56

and made the tribes of israel to dwell in their tents yet after this redemption

1:06:02

they tempted and provoked the most high god and kept not his testimonies 1:06:09

but turned back and dealt unfaithfully like their fathers like there's just no

1:06:15

end to they were turned aside like a deceitful bow

1:06:22

you cannot depend on them when you're going into battle and you need your weapons and you need to trust

1:06:27

what you've got you can't depend on them for they provoked him to anger

1:06:33

with their high places and moved him to jealousy with their graven images

1:06:41

when god heard this he was angry and he greatly abhorred

1:06:47

israel so this is our situation with israel

1:06:53

that when we read hosea we cannot but feel a deep sadness

1:07:00

and a deep loathing for these people but this is the human condition

1:07:06

god chose these people uh you know i think we all know by now this is the human heart 1:07:12

and it's not like we can say well these people were wicked but if god chose me everything would have been fine no the

1:07:18

human heart is wicked and this is this is the human condition and yet what we're going to see as we

1:07:24

continue to study the scriptures is god is faithful despite the unfaithfulness

1:07:30

of his wife god is faithful and this is the great god that we serve we're going to really 1:07:36

uh i think as we go through this just we're going to trust god you know israel is a deceitful bow god is a bow that we

1:07:44

can trust we can go into spiritual battle knowing that we can trust god

1:07:49

that it's impossible for him to lie so god willing brethren you'll be able to join us again 1:07:54

when we gather on sabbath and if you can pastor murray's message

1:08:00

regarding the innocence project and deacon jan's message regarding is it

1:08:07

new or a renewed covenant those two messages i want to comment on

1:08:13

god willing as we come together on sabbath so wonderful for you to join us brethren 1:08:19
