well good evening and welcome to chapter 4 of the book of Philippians and that clip that I just opened with you could hear some laughter in the background I didn't think it was funny at all I thought it was quite disturbing and quite tragic that we would see these two women I don't know what the context is I don't know why they were fighting but we see these two mature women engaged in this this brawl these fisticuffs and how unfortunate especially if they are church members and that really is the subject today in chapter 4 chapter 8 chapter 4 begins with a conflict between two women in this congregation at Philippi yo dia and Sint Ikki and the question then becomes if we were in that congregation what would we do would we just observe what would we actually intervene and so let's let's get into the study of chapter 4 I'll just say a quick prayer and then we'll begin our Heavenly Father we come before you we just thank you so much Lord for your word your word of truth we thank you for this wonderful letter that Paul wrote to the a beautiful congregation of Philippi and we thank you for what we can learn from this letter and pray Lord that this evening as we go through the final chapter of the book of Philippians that you would help us to grasp as much as we can from it and that what we learn we would actually put into practice that it would transform us and make us better children better Christians that are followers of our Lord Jesus Christ we praise you lord and ask your blessing now in Jesus name Amen so I mentioned that we're going to be looking at the last chapter of the book of Philippians

before we do that I just want to remind you of the the central scripture in this book are the central verse and that's verse 27 where he is asking the congregation in Philippi to ensure that their conduct is fitting for their knowledge of the gospel that this good news that Jesus Christ brought us is so profound that it should change completely the way we behave and that's what Paul was requesting from the church at Philippi that even though he couldn't get to them he wanted to hear that their conduct matches the gospel of Christ now there were some risks that the congregation was facing and just to remind you about those risks the first one was in Chapter 1 there was external persecution that that Paul warned them that they shouldn't be terrified of their adversaries and so that was we saw that in chapter 1 this external persecution on the church and and he showed them how to how to handle that then in chapter 2 we saw another risk or another threat and that was internal strife and he showed them that the way to handle that is to put on the mind of Christ and to ensure that everybody is esteeming others better than themselves and they're willing to humble themselves and sacrifice themselves for the welfare and benefit of others if they do that that will eliminate the risk that comes from internal strife which is actually the greater risk it's a greater risk than external persecution external persecution tends to bind the church and strengthen the church whereas internal strife is what destroys the church and then the third risk was an approaching risk and that was the threat of the Judaizers people who were

going around there were Christians there were Jewish Christians and they were basically going around saying that the sacrifice of Christ was not enough that in addition to the sacrifice of Christ to really obtain salvation they had to observe the law and specifically they had to be circumcised and and Paul was basically inoculating the congregation against this threat and telling them that there is there these are enemies of the cross of Christ that that we must really understand how profound the sacrifice of our Creator was and not to attach anything to that that bet enables us to have this free gift of salvation so he's covered these three risks and of the three the second one is is really the the big one and and now he's wrapping up the letter in chapter 4 and it actually is going to address this second risk of internal strife more specifically in chapter 2 he's addressing it generally now in chapter 4 he's going to be very specific and again appeal to them to fulfill his instruction in verse 27 which is to ensure that their conduct becomes the gospel of Jesus Christ so let's begin then in verse 1 of chapter 4 where we see he says therefore as he concluded now my brethren dearly beloved he really loved this congregation the brethren here and not just that he loves them they are longed for he longs to be with them again he really misses them and misses the support and love that they enjoyed that mutual support that they had for one another so their beloved and longed for and again that goes back to the beginning of the chapter or the beginning of the book chapter 1 where the letter is to all the saints at Philippi with the Deacons and the

bishops

so he's communicating to everybody my joy and Crown so this is just there there is so much joy whenever he thinks of this congregation but not just joy there are also his crown that he is just so excited about presenting this congregation to Jesus Christ on the the final day of the Day of Judgment Christ returns and and he just knows this is his reward this is his fruit this is the fruit of his labor and so he asked them in this way stand fast in the Lord what which way so stand fast well everything that we covered in Chapter 1 how to deal with external threats of persecution everything he covered in chapter 2 how to deal with internal strife everything he covered in chapter 3 how to deal with those Judaizers with false doctrine enemies of the cross of Christ everything that he taught them of how to address all of these threats that could destroy them in this way stand fast in the Lord my dearly beloved verse 2 I am baking I beseech yo dia and I beseech Cintiq II so he's requesting each one specifically this is really interesting we we go from a letter that he's speaking to everyone where now he is targeting specifically to individuals in the congregation calling them out by name

and pleading with them is not just IBC geo dia and center key it's I beseech yo dia and I beseech cinta key that they be of the same mind in the Lord the same mind that he said so stand fast in the Lord that same mind that of the mind of Christ who came down from heaven and put others ahead of himself who didn't think it was robbery to be equal with God but instead took on the form of a servant and was obedient unto death and not just

any death with the death of the cross that kind of mind that's the mind that he wants both of these to have obviously there's some sort of vainglory that these women are concerned about and he's asking them please let it go let it go but he doesn't stop there again this is a letter to everybody to the whole congregation and suddenly here in chapter 4 takes a sharp turn and it's pinpointing and targeting specific individuals so first the idea and sin segi and now in verse 3 very interesting I entreat you also true yoke fellow who is this who is this true fellow servant I'm asking you as well so I'm asking them but I'm also asking you and remember this is the blueprint for a healthy congregation so when you see people fighting in your congregation what do you do you there there's brethren that are fighting you know maybe they're not fighting physically but they're fighting mentally emotionally spiritually you've got brethren who are not speaking to one another they're disrupting the congregation did we just sit idly by and watch or do we see ourselves striving together working together working our salvation out together as a congregation and do we realize this is unacceptable there's something that has to be done here and so what Paul is doing here is he's calling each individual as I believe what he's doing here he's calling each individual in the congregation to account anything don't don't sit by and think that this has nothing to do with you you are working out your salvation together and here these two women by the way and we'll see here these women are prominent women in the congregation I'm going to say this over and over again we cannot oppress our women and a lot of men have this mistaken view that women must be seen but not heard and women aren't must be subjugated and only men matter clearly here when you read this he says I'm intrigued in treating you also through fellow-servant help those women which labored with me in the gospel they were my partners in this labor with Clement also and with other my fellow laborers whose names are in the book of life so these women obviously were prominent women in the congregation women of some level of leadership and influence and now they're in conflict and he's calling them out specifically but if we were in the congregation he's calling us out specifically as well and and this actually when you see this I entreat you also true yoke fellow it actually puts me in mind of a poem which you've probably heard but let's let's read it in this context where he says everybody somebody anybody in nobody a team let's say a congregation had four members called Everybody Somebody Anybody and nobody there was an important job to be done that is to end the conflict between yo dia and sin Tiki everyone was sure that somebody would do it anybody could have done it but nobody did it somebody got angry about that because it was everybody's job everybody thought anybody could do it nobody realized that's everybody's job everybody wouldn't do it it ended up that everybody blames somebody when nobody did what anybody could have done and I think this reality of how human beings work is what Paul has in mind when he calls out the true yoke fellow and I think that that true yoke fellow

is anyone who is a true servant of God in that congregation it's like you know in project management when you want and when a task has to be done you don't say you know who's accountable everybody because then nobody's gonna do it you have to make one person accountable call that person up by name and say you're responsible for getting this done you may not have to do it but you're accountable for getting it done and here he's putting the accountability on every individual in the congregation don't sit idly by while these women mess up and then this this term or this phrase at the end that these women along with the other fellow servants their names are in the book of life or in the book of the living this is quite scary that he's saying help these women why because their names are in the book of life what what does that mean well let's go to Revelation where it shows us that he that overcomes the same person that overcomes shall be clothed in white raiment and Christ says and I will not blot out his name out of the book of life but I will confess his name before my father and before the angels in the Greek that I will not blot out his name out of the book of life it says here okay MA excellent so excel it's all to anima of two acctaste the blue tastes OS this word excel itself which translates wipeout in the Greek what it means is that there's something there and you completely remove it you completely exit out scratch it out wipe it out so that when you're done there's no evidence that it was there that's what ex illipe soul means and Christ is saying I personally will Excel each soul or or well not in this case if you overcome

I will not excel Eve so your name out of the book of life

I won't take your name out of the book of life what that says to us is there's going to be a lot of names in the book book of life and Christ for those who overcome he will not take our names out of the book of life which clearly by implication that there are going to be names in the book of life that Jesus Christ Himself will personally take out and when he takes them out there'll be no evidence that they were ever there I mean that is absolutely terrifying here in chapter 20 of Revelation the book of Revelation he says and whosoever was not found written in the book of life was cast into the lake of fire and they went into non-existence so the book of life the book of the living the book of the everliving is a book that it's the transition between this mortal life and eternity and and our names have to be in that book in order to transition into eternity and it appears very clearly that those of us who are baptized and who've repented and who received the Holy Spirit upon the reception of the Holy Spirit our names are written in the book of life but if we fail to overcome and and it looks to me like there are two ways we can fail or maybe three ways

one is personal

failure we just we do not overcome our personal character fail of flaws the second is that we deny Christ before men as Christ tells us of the kind of persecution that is going to come on those who are faithful to him he says if you confess me before men I will confess you before the Angels and and also he says in Revelation 3 and my father so he'll confess if we deny him before men he says he'll deny us so we must be faithful no matter what and the third is what yo dia and Sint iki are involved in and that is traumatizing the people of God that anyone who touches God's people must answer to God personally and so here in Matthew 18 he says but whoso shall offend one of these little ones which believe in me so any believer it were better for him that a millstone were hanged about his neck and that he were drowned in the depth of the sea

I think brethren that we take conflict in the church far too lightly I think we take our you take each other for granted and we need to get to a place where we realize that God loves Christ Christ loves the church and as the father loves Christ that's how Christ instructed us to love each other so we are the Bride of Christ we are the body of Christ and we cannot develop the the the man doesn't hate his own body and and I think we think we can get away

body of Christ and we cannot develop the the the man doesn't hate his own body and and I think we think we can get away with hating each other which which the scripture refers to as murder and think that Wilf will still be in the kingdom when the scripture makes it very clear he that does not love his brother is a liar and the only way we know that we've passed from death into life is that we love the Brethren and so these are the three things moral fatal failure to overcome personal flaws deny if denying the faith and

persecuting traumatizing the body of Christ and that's why Paul says to the Philippians work out your salvation together work it out together with fear and trembling with phobia and trauma like you're dealing with the people of God so you need to be very very careful

here and so here he's telling yo dia and Sint icky to get over it whatever it is get over it put on the mind of Christ and it won't be a problem and everyone else who's standing by and watching this don't watch as these two women who have labored with Paul who have done a lot of good for the church and for the work of God don't stand by and watch why they just while they destroy themselves while they say they love God but they hate their brother intervene intervene and don't allow them to have their names scratched out of the book of life so that it appears as if it was never there continuing then he so that that's not he moves on so that was really the personal application of what he was talking about conceptually in Chapter 2 which was the biggest risk that the congregation faced and that was internal strife and division and then he says rejoice in the Lord always and again I say rejoice in this I haven't done the the count of it but if you analyze this letter to Philippians there are two things that really jump out one is how much joy is a part of this letter you need over and over and over again Paul is saying rejoice have joy in the Lord and he has joy and joy joy so constantly repeatedly he says rejoice in the Lord and then the other thing is Christ how much Christ is repeated in this letter so joy and Christ's joy in Christ and I think anybody who wants to say that Christ is not the center of the gospel you have to read Philippians and I think you'll have a wreath that God is doing all he can to bring everybody to Christ and then when everybody is has come to Christ Christ turns us all over to the Father and so

this is all about joy in Christ let your moderation be known unto all man the Lord is at hand be careful for nothing but in everything by prayer and supplication with Thanksgiving let your requests be known unto God and the peace of God which passes all understanding shall keep your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus very interesting here verse 5 moderation one of the fruits of the spirit self-control verse 6 faithfulness one of the fruits of the spirit verse 7 peace one of the fruits of the spirit in fact verse four joy one of the fruits of the spirit so here as we allow the Holy Spirit to work through us we see the fruits of the spirit emanating from us there is joy there's self-control especially as we realize the Lord is at hand and then we're careful for nothing so again there is this persecution that's on the church anything don't worry about it don't don't worry about it in everything by prayer and supplication so so gula in in John 15 Christ says I am The True Vine and my father is the husbandman and he wants it it's his will that we bear fruit much fruit and as we bear fruit he will prune us so that we bear even more fruit and then he says in that chapter ask what you will and you will receive because it's his father's will our father's will that we bear fruit so here he's saying don't don't worry God is with you and Christ Himself said I'll be with you till the end of

God's and God's will is that we bear fruit we

you'll receive as long as it's within

the age so with that knowledge as we're facing these different challenges we just go to God and we asked me to help he says anything that you need ask and

despite whatever persecution we may face so we asked with prayer and supplication with Thanksgiving so we acknowledge the blessings that we do have we're there the cup is half full not half empty and so we're constantly acknowledging how God is working in our lives and what we do have and what we are grateful for and we have joy it with what we have while we're asking that he opens the doors that we need in order to do this work and preach the gospel and bear fruit and that that fruit that we bear shall remain so we shall have converts all over the world and those converts will in fact make it into the kingdom that's the fruit that we must bear and as we do this and realize that we're operating in the will of God the peace of God which passes all understanding shall keep our hearts and minds through Christ Jesus and Paul is modeling this he's in Rome on trial maybe he's going to be persecuted he's not quite sure are not persecuted executed he's not quite sure and yet he has this great peace and there's great joy why because he's doing this he's asking for what he needs in fact he also said he was quite confident that because of the because of the fruit of his labor that he felt that he would be released and he would be able to return to Phillipi because he knew that he was useful to God and he was bearing good fruit so we must follow this same example finally brethren and so now he's sort of concluding and this this is the bit from verse 27 of chapter 1 right through to verse 9 of chapter 4 all of that is sort of one profound thought that that has to do with ensuring that their behavior matches the gospel of Christ and so now he's come finally coming to a conclusion of that

verse in verse 27 and that's why I was saying earlier I think was in Episode one that I said we've got to be careful of scriptural amnesia where we read a scripture and then we forget what it says as we go on to the next verse and and and we've got to keep the Scriptures in context especially when we're reading letters from the Apostle Paul he can go for a very long time where he has one train of thought but because of these different chapter breaks and burst breaks we think that he's on to another thought and so from verse 27 of chapter one right through to verse 9 of chapter four he's dealing with one train of thought so now he's concluding it finally brethren whatsoever things are true whatsoever things are honest whatsoever things are just whatsoever things are pure whatsoever things are lovely whatsoever things are of good report if there be any virtue and if there be any praise think on these things and really what he's saying here again it's in the context going back to chip verse 28 of chapter 1 it's in the context of this persecution that is on the church and it could be a very depressing time if you were to look at the persecution for what it is

rather than looking at it for what it is enabling and it's enabling them to come together in unity it's enabling them to bear fruit and so what Paul is really telling them here is think of the big picture think of the gospel think of the good news of Jesus Christ and as you meditate on that good news and the ultimate outcome of all of this it puts everything into context and this is where that that peace of God just it just didn't braces us and just enables

us to face anything calmly and faithfully so think of the big picture really meditate on the gospel of Christ it's not saying just again just randomly oh just think of good things you know don't don't try to think of anything that that's bad but we have to think about the things that are bad but we have to put them in the context of Christ being the king and the kingdom coming and ultimate the ultimate good news of the kingdom of God those things so think on these things and then those things which you have both learned and received and heard and seen in me do again this goes back to verse 27 of chapter 1 that your conduct must match the gospel of the kingdom so in verse 8 think of the good news think of the gospel and then in verse 9 do it and you actually have a model Paul is saying and you've learned from me and you've actually seen me do this follow my example and in this way you can fulfill my instruction to ensure that your behavior is becoming of the gospel of Christ and the God of peace shall be with you this is just so encouraging and so finally now we conclude the instruction from Paul to the Philippians the the blueprint on how to build this model congregation and work together to strive together to work out their salvation now he switches topic and now that introduces a new topic which is sort of really the reason for the for writing in the first place so the reason for writing was they had the the congregation that sent him a care package and it was just filled with everything that he needed and he was writing to say thank you and so now he finally gets around to saying thank you but but not before giving them this

wonderful instruction which we can really benefit from right through to verse 9 of chapter 4 so now he comes back to the the it comes to the reason for the letter but I rejoiced and again that word joy is just so much joy here from the Apostle and an instruction for them to have joy

them to have joy well I rejoiced in the Lord greatly I reach out I was really happy to receive this care package from you and I rejoiced in the Lord the this this physical package that I received from you had huge spiritual implications and spiritual meaning and I rejoiced in the Lord when I received this package that now at the last your care of me has flourished again so the Philippians were always careful and caring for Paul and really showing him that care but then it stopped for a while and they weren't able to show the care and now the care returned and so and and and it's flourished it's not just like grudgingly it flourished for them we're in you were also careful what you lacked opportunity so there was this period where you couldn't care for me and you were you were still very caring in that period you just weren't able to get your you express your care to me now that period when you weren't able to care for me he says in verse 11 not that I speak in respect of want don't get me wrong don't give me head I don't want to make you feel guilty that you weren't able to care for me you know I'm just saying that there was a period where I didn't receive any care from you now during that period when I didn't receive any care from you

I'm not making any point here about the fact that I was in kiddin want or need why it wasn't an issue why because I've

learned in whatsoever state I'm in in that state to be content I have figured this out I I'm telling you that when vou're in the Lord and you think on whatever things are true and lovely if there's any virtue when you think like this and you think of the ultimate good news then whatever state you're in you learn to be content because you just understand you're in God's will and this is this is where this is the the season that you're in right now and it's okay so so there was a period where you couldn't care me and I don't I'm not calling attention to the fact that I was in need because I wasn't why because I've learned to be in contempt in whatever state I'm in I figured out how to be abased Wow and I've also figured out how to abound so some people can't do either some people if they don't have anything they just moan and complain and they just so negative and just horror it's terrible but worse some people who do allowed who have lots they're horrible as well they become arrogant and puffed up and and and they lack care and concern for others and often this is the the curse of the Christian that when Christians are blessed they forget God and they don't pray as much they don't study as much and the thing they don't need God so sometimes it's actually better to be abased than to abound and Paul the same in either case whether I'm humiliated and I have nothing or whether I'm honored and I have everything I need I have figured out how to keep my Christian head on my shoulders how to keep my spiritual wits

am instructed both to be full and to be hungry it's fine either way both to abound and to suffer need so that period when you couldn't care for me and I had nothing I figured it out and I still had joy I hadn't I had no physical things but I had the joy in the Lord and now I've received this package from you and I've got everything I need and I've still figured out how to conduct myself in such a way that I don't shipwrecked myself and then he says here in verse 13 I can do all things through Christ which strengthens me this is such a beautiful scripture I think anybody who knows the Bible knows this scripture and we get a lot of inspiration from it in fact I think this is a to take a little moment to get some inspiration from this scripture let's take a look at this so I hope you found that inspiring I certainly did when I saw it this young man Stephen Curry in the NBA I think a couple of years ago he was the most valuable player and just really hard worker clearly a Christian and was inspired by this text he can do all things through christ with strengthens me and then certainly one of the high scorers in the NBA now is that what this scripture is talking about i think this is one of the most abused scriptures that we can do anything through Christ that strengthens me and you get a lot of inspiration from this and that's not at all what Paul was saying and I think what again we have to be careful of scriptural amnesia where we just take a verse of it you know these dualities chopping up these letters into chapters and verses is what enables us to just scoop in and scoop out just go in and grab a little

scripture and run away with it if we didn't have this weed after actually we would actually have to stop and read the whole passage to see what it's actually talking about and then again if we look here at the context and what we show actually go back to verse 10 we can pick up the context in verse 12 where he says I know both how to be abased and I know how to abound everywhere notice this and in all things in all things I'm instructed both to be full and to be hungry both to abound and to suffer need I can do all things the same all things through Christ with strengthens me in other words everywhere and in all circumstances I'm instructed how to manage myself financially and in verse 13 in all financial situations I will be successful through Christ that strengthens me so verse 13 is not about taking tall leaps and making three-pointers and verse 13 is not about you know being able to run a hundred meters in under 10 seconds and verse 13 is not about anything that we think it's about unless we take it in the context of verse 12 verse 13 is about financial responsibility but if I have a little bit I can get I can cut back my expenses and I can figure out how to manage with that and I have if I have a lot I don't let that go to my head I know how to manage that as well so in in all circumstances I can manage how through by keeping my spiritual head on my shoulders through Christ which strengthens me so this is what he's telling them I didn't suffer Nate when you couldn't care for me I didn't suffer need because I learned how to do how to do all things how to manage in all circumstances through Christ who strengthens me now not

withstanding so even though I I suffered me and I knew how to manage through that notwithstanding you've done well well done congratulations this is why I rejoiced in the Lord when I received your care package you've done well that you did communicate or you did participate with my affliction so you heard of my affliction you knew that I was in poverty and you participated you helped well done now you Philippians know also that in the beginning of the gospel when I departed from Macedonia so he Macedonia was the first place he went to outside of Judea and that's where his uh ministry to the Gentiles really began and from there he then launched into the Gentile world and he's saying you got you you know the flu all of you know that when I departed from Macedonia Macedonia no church no congregation participated with me as concerning giving and receiving except you Wow so the Philippians got it and they participated in this work of preaching the gospel Noah as he was starting up all these other churches they basically were taken from him but they weren't helping but the Philippians they were helping him reach all of these different nations or our cities for even in Thessalonica Thessalonica you sent once and again unto my necessity so even when he was in Thessalonica they were supporting him and sending him care packages and making sure that he had what he needed so that he could preach the gospel quite amazing this congregation and he says not because I desire a gift so you've done really well and I congratulate you for supporting me and I rejoiced in the Lord when I received your care package

not because I desire a gift from you it's not like oh great you thought of me thanks for the gift I appreciate the money or or whatever support you've given to me that's not why but I desire fruit that may abound to your account you are my joy and my crown when I stand before Christ I want to present you to Christ as a chaste virgin without spot and without wrinkle and having borne fruit and so for you to participate in this work with me then you are bearing fruit the same fruit that I bear is to your account so that I desire fruit that may abound to your account but for me I have all and I abound so thank you so much you everything that you've sent everything that I need and III now if I was in a state of a basement I was in a state of penury and poverty now I have everything I'm full thanks so much having received of a preferred itis the things which were sent from you fantastic an odour of sweet smell a sacrifice acceptable well pleasing to God so he now lightens this care package to incense and to a sacrifice to God so it's the he's seeing everything he's seeing through spiritual eyes and this is how he manages to abate to be abased and to abound that he looks at everything through spiritual eyes and and what he sees when he receives this care package is not so much of things that are in the package but the people and the hearts and the minds of the people behind it and the rewards of those people that are participating with him in preaching the gospel but my God shall supply all your need according to his riches in glory by Jesus Christ so here and again this is another scripture that can be abused where you'll have

false ministers basically saying if you give money to me God will give money to you so you've got a kind of a soul so your riches so for every every hundred dollars you give me God will give you a thousand dollars and there's a lot of churches that are becoming mega churches and becoming mega rich by abusing this scripture and Paul doesn't say that what he says is when you are participating with me in preaching the gospel then you are in the Father's will and it's the Father's will again going back to John 15 it's the Father's will that you bear much fruit so ask and you shall receive so once you're participating in this this path of preaching the gospel and bearing fruit for the No then God's going to supply your need and he knows what you need he knows what I need in some cases like Paul it might be a basement so Paul needed to be abased for a period of time and he learned in that a basement so in the same way the Philippians who are helping him they may come to a season where economically they're impoverished and God knows that they need that so this is not a guarantee of financial wealth it is a guarantee however of the Father and Jesus Christ supporting those who are operating in their will and preaching the gospel and bearing the fruit of the gospel so that we can be we can have this peace that whatever we face we know the hairs on our head are numbered and God is looking after us and I think some of you may actually be wondering how you can support us if you are appreciating the work that we're doing here I'll just take a moment to say that you know if you do want to support us in this work we would gladly receive that support there's a lot of work to be done and few

he says now unto God our Father be glory for ever and ever for unto God and our Father be glory for ever and ever amen salute every saint in Christ Jesus the brethren which are with me greet you and again Paul is under house arrest in Rome and there are brethren that are there with him and he sends their love and greetings to the Brethren there in Philippi all the saints salute you chiefly they that are of Caesars household and again Paul understands that it's God's will for him to bear fruit and so he's arrested he's there in Rome he's right in Caesars household and he's preaching the gospel and people are seeing that he is truly committed and Paul is seeing that oh this is an opportunity for me to take the gospel to Caesars household and he actually wins converts from the Roman guard and so he we now have brethren or email they have brethren there right in Caesars household and they sent their greetings to the Brethren in Philippi the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ be with you all amen

so such a beautiful letter and you know what I would encourage you now that

we've gone through these verses together is to go back and read the letter in one sitting just sit down and read the letter in one sitting understanding how all the verses tied together and again you know from from Chapter one how Paul is so confident that the Philippians are gonna figure it out he's praying for them he's seeing signs of progress and he thought the care package that he received from them he sees the spiritual intent and the character behind back the heart behind it and he's praying for them and he's saying always in every prayer of mine for you all making requests with joy this congregation was a source of joy most of the congregations that the Apostle looked after they were a source of grief for the Apostle but this congregation was a source of joy for your fellowship your partnership in the gospel from the first day until now that's what he's talking about these care packages that they were see that he was receiving from them he wasn't receiving this from any other congregation but he was receiving it from from the Philippians and they were constant there was a period of time with it for some reason they couldn't get to him but they finally sent through a preferred itis and they were able to get there resumed their care for him and he just sees like wow they really understand they really get it they're really behind him and so he's confident of this very thing that he which has begun a good work in you you plural the congregation will perform it until the day of Jesus Christ and I think brethren this really is the blueprint for a model congregation that we do not think individualistically which is very hard

for us in North America especially coming out of the 60s and the 70s where it was all about me me me and you know if it feels good do it and it's just a real individualist individualism ethic in our society and it's hard for us actually to think congregationally collectively and and you see that when brethren are in a congregation and something upsets them and they just get up and walk out instead of working it out with fear and trembling and seeing your identity as part of a larger body and really loving that body and learning how to love each other that's that's really a big part of what we're involved in here and as we do that the Apostle is just again Philippians is all about joy rejoice and again I say rejoice and have this joy in Christ and Paul has this joy over the congregation and I think when we really understand the gospel of the kingdom of God we can't help but be filled with joy and we really understand Christ and his central role in the gospel and and his love for us again we can't help but be overjoyed so I certainly hope that you have enjoyed this study on the book of Philippians and again I will leave you with where we began with Paul began that let your conduct be as it becomes the gospel of Christ and I don't know if I'll get to visit you and your congregation but whether I come and see you or I'm absent that I may hear of your affairs that you stand fast in one spirit with one mind striving together for the faith of the gospel what a wonderful letter I leave you with these parting words and I'm looking forward next week we're going to start another book and I'm not going to say right now I just want to make sure that this is

the book but I think you're gonna be really really fascinated especially today with what we're facing in society our civilization collapsing around us I'm gonna pick a book that is going to strengthen you inspire you and educate and inform you as to how to navigate in in a world that is just it's it's doing the 180 it's collapsing around us but we need not fear and if anything we should rejoice because the Lord is at hand god bless you I look forward to seeing you again next week
