THE ATONEMENT - signicant for Christians?

The Day of Atonement is a very important day on the Christian calendar. Yes, the Christian calendar. It's also important for Jews as well, better known as Yom Kippur.

But for Christians who might not see the connection, and most of them don't, here's the first question to ask yourself: Who made the atoning sacrifice for the sins of humanity? Well, it's none other than Jesus, the Christ. It wasn't any other person than the Son of God, whose mission was to come to Earth to die for the sins of every human being ever born.

The Day of Atonement is one of God's seven annual festivals or "appointed times," outlined in Lev. 23. He calls them "my feasts," or "feasts of the LORD," NOT a feast of the Jews as many Christians believe in error. It does not say that!

As our worldly activities came under the grips of the COVID-19 pandemic, as was the case at the start of 2020, each day we faced the uncertainty of when the nightmare would ever end. There was talk it could be around for many years, based on the experience dealing with similar pandemics. No one knew for sure. In many countries, it was no longer regarded as a pandemic but rather an endemic.

The world needs hope, the real one, not the false ones which we set our minds on – money, prosperity, power, and happiness, all of which are temporary and will end at some point in human history. What better day to look to for hope than the Day of Atonement, which will be celebrated this year on October 12. It projects us into the future when the world will be at one with God, and there will be no pandemics, endemics, wars, famines, pestilences, crimes, death, or sorrow to confront daily.

In the coming days, we are not going to stop hearing of wars and rumours of wars; neither will we see any ease in earthquakes, natural disasters, pestilences, increasing famines, acts of terrorism, increasing poverty, crime, corruption, failing governments, and changing weather systems. All of these have been prophesied to happen. Before the Kingdom of God is established, the Bible warns these are the beginning of sorrows or the "birth pangs." They will just be the beginning or warming up to a time when humans will regret they were ever born; the wrath of God against evil and wickedness will be so unbearable that many will seek death and will not find it.

The journey we call life is all about choices. There's hardly a day that goes by that does not involve making a choice. It could be a choice about what to eat, or wear; a choice between going to work or not, buying a house, or a car, getting married, staying single, opening a new bank account, saving, or spending. It's rather interesting that the choices we make determine how we live our lives; what we get and what we receive, be they defeats or triumphs. Many of us have lived long enough to learn lessons from the wrong choices and to gain wisdom from the right ones. Ultimately, it's our choices, which will determine our destiny as human beings, yet many pay scant regard to this reality of life.

The choices can vary between two extremes, a negative or positive, yes or no, indecision or indifference, but for the most part, any decision taken still boils down to a choice. In other words, if you stay neutral on a particular position or choose to remain indifferent on a matter, it is still a choice. There's no escape from making a choice about which road you will take in this life. The Day of Atonement reminds us of who died for our sins. Who is it now affords us mercy and forgiveness when we make wrong choices and sin against him?

Our maker and Creator of the Universe, in His wisdom, offers us the right choices to make in every facet of life. He is our Maker, and being the one who puts us on this Earth, and gave us intelligence to make choices, wouldn't you say He has all the authority to tell you what are the right choices in life? The secular world believes this is debatable, but that belief is ludicrous given the fact that we did not create ourselves. Our carnal mind is always at enmity with the Creator (Romans 8:7), hence there's a tendency to be hostile to any advice He gives for our own good?

The child of God must use their troubling experiences to prepare them for what lies ahead. The picture ahead is not pretty. It will be terrible to say the least, nevertheless, for God's people who just celebrated the establishment of the coming Kingdom of God, they know true joy will come in the morning after going through the difficult times ahead. If you accept Jesus Christ as your ONLY true Saviour, and that of the world, it will be the MOST IMPORTANT decision YOU will ever make in your lifetime. Time will prove it!

WE ARE AT WAR!

Our twisted society is caught between two fires – deciding what is right from what is wrong. Deciding truth from error, and that prefers the things that go against God rather than for God. Society usually adopts practices and principles that try to appeal to everyone yet somehow some people will be marginalized, discriminated against, and oppressed.

What we are witnessing today is the never-ending cycle of arguments and counterarguments, protests and counter-protests, debates, rebuttals, and so on. Some subjects will forever be argued and debated; some issues cannot be resolved through human means until the Kingdom of God is established.

One day we are bracing for an attack of some sort, whether it's through terrorists, gangs, freedom fighters, militiamen or what have you. Another day it's severe bad weather or natural disaster; another day is an outbreak of some virus or terrible disease or that we are eating too much fat. Another day we are warned to brace for higher food prices, electricity bills, gasoline, or rent, and more racially motivated or hate crimes. We continue to change governments and yet isn't it the same warnings we are getting?

There would be some people in society who would prefer you not to know of these realities of life. They are consumed with getting your money for all its worth, your votes, your attention, your support, your time, and for you to eat and be merry because all is well. All is not well. It seems our society is suffering from cognitive dissonance. You can't have your cake and eat it and expect to still have your cake.

There is much food for thought as we reflect on the many shortcomings in our troubled world. Why? We are at war, a never-ending war until...

Bob Marley sings, "War in the east, war in the west, war up north war down south....war, war, rumours of war." The rumours have come true. Today, we have war in Ukraine, war in Israel, war in Syria, Yemen, Ethiopia, Congo, and many more.

The war we are in is different for the followers of Jesus Christ. To be in a war, we must have an enemy. Our war is above all wars; it's unlike any other war because we have the same enemy. Imagine that, all of us had the same enemy yet we can't just win the battle against that enemy. War is ugly. Sin is ugly.

We are at war against ourselves, against our carnality. It's spiritual warfare, it's a spiritual battle, it's spiritual war. There's no two-way against it. Just one way. It's either you are for God, or you are not. Unlike society, you cannot be caught between two fires. You are either for God or for man. We are warring against ourselves to keep us from falling to that common enemy, which is sin.

The Bible tells us, Jesus will return on a white horse with millions of angels to fight the war to end all wars. More people will die in that battle—more than any other battle in the history of warfare.

Matt. 6:22 says, "The light of the body is the eye: if therefore thine eye be single, thy whole body shall be full of light. 23 But if thine eye be evil, thy whole body shall be full of darkness. If therefore the light that is in thee be darkness, how great is that darkness! 24 No man can serve two masters: for either he will hate the one, and love the other; or else he will hold to the one, and despise the other. Ye cannot serve God and mammon."

We must choose between good and evil, God or mammon. There is no grey area as society often takes that stand. It's either you stand for God, or you don't; it's either you are in the Body of Christ or you are not. When we continue to sin, we are at war with ourselves. We are also at war with God.

When you are at war, you study the enemy. Know his strategies, tactics, and devices," 1 Peter chapter 5: 8, says, "The devil prowls around like a roaring lion, seeking [whom he may] devour."

When you are fighting a war, you see the enemy most of the time. In this war, you don't see him directly. But if you have eyes that you can see, unlike the world that has eyes but cannot see, then you can discern who you are fighting the battle against.

In 2 Corinthians 11:14, the Bible says that he disguises himself as an angel of light. . . For such are false apostles, deceitful workers, transforming themselves into the apostles of Christ. 14 And no marvel; for Satan himself is transformed into an angel of light. 15 Therefore it is no great thing if his ministers also be transformed as the ministers of righteousness; whose end shall be according to their works. Be aware!

How are we going to win this battle?

When we go to war, we have certain safety rules and protective gear. The Bible tells us about: Wearing the SHIELD of FAITH.... breastplate of righteousness... the HELMET of SALVATION... the SWORD of the SPIRIT... SANDALS of READINESS... the BELT of TRUTH. Ω

Do we really understand what true repentance is? What does it mean to repent? Is real repentance just an emotional experience? Is it simply being remorseful and upset over past mistakes we have made in life? There is much more to godly repentance than most realize. It is only from God's word that we will find the answer to these questions and come to an understanding of God's definition of "True Repentance."

True Repentance signals the start of a changed and godly life. It involves a fully conscious recognition of one's sinful lawless way of life that is antagonistic toward God and His law, accompanied by a firm conviction to make a total change and to begin to live in full accord with God's way of life as described in the Bible.

Sin in God's eyes it too serious to just forget or be swept under the rug so to speak. God's perfection and holiness is so great, sin or sinners cannot approach Him and live, or be in His presence. The debt of sin must be settled and the books balanced. Once we understand the immensity of His righteousness, and holiness, we can then understand the immensity and awfulness of sin and the necessity for our repentance from the dead works of sin.

It was so important to God for the debt of sin to be expunged, and because He loved us so much, God was willing to allow the life of His own son to be sacrificed to pay the debt that no human being could ever afford to pay. Christ died because God's Character is so consistent that there could be no other way for Him to extend mercy to us.

The Biblical definition of True Repentance is to turn from your chosen way of life and begin living according to every word in the Bible instead of according to the ways of society or the desires of the flesh and vanity. Adam and Eve, because they had a carnal nature, and so do we, partook of the forbidden tree of the knowledge of both good and evil.

They did that which was natural for them to do. They gave into their evil pulls, their nature of rebelliousness, selfishness, and vanity against their creator (Genesis 2:17; 3:6). They lusted for what was not theirs (lust of the flesh), what was desirable (lust of the eyes) and what would make them wise (pride of life).

True Repentance means we have come to a full realization that we have rebelled against our Creator, just as Adam and Eve did, and we are

willing to turn from our rebelliousness and begin to obey our Creator in all things.

The Apostle Paul revealed much about the doctrine of True Repentance to the Corinthian Assembly. He stressed that sorrow is not repentance. In fact, only godly sorrow works toward repentance. It is from God, produced by the Holy Spirit. It is also directed toward Him for having offended Him through sin. "For Godly sorrow works repentance to salvation not to be repented of: but the sorrow of the world works death" (2 Corinthians 7:10).

King Saul experienced worldly sorrow at his rejection by the Lord God. It was loss of respect in the eyes of the army he commanded that worried him the most, not his unfaithful service to God. When the prophet Samuel refused to help him keep up appearances, Saul sought to physically restrain the man of God. In the end he fell on his sword taking his own life. Saul took matters into his own hands without thinking of God or asking for His guidance.

Many people are sorry only for the effects of their sins or for being caught (sorrow of the world). Compare Peter's remorse and repentance with Judas' bitterness and suicide. Both denied Christ. Peter repented and was restored to faith and service. Judas on the other hand, took his own life.

Is a true Christian a new creation mentally? In the beginning, God created man a perfect physical specimen. A true Christian is a New Creation created to perform Good Works. "For we are His workmanship, created in Christ Jesus unto good works, which God has ordained that we should walk in them" (Ephesians 2:10).

This is a spiritual matter that involves God's Holy Spirit. "This great change takes place in the mind, we might call the heart." "Therefore, if any man be in Christ, he is a new creature: old things are passed away; behold, all things are become new" (2 Corinthians 5:17) (continued on next page)

TRUE repentance

STEP ONE - The very first step is Repentance, and "True Repentance means a change of "Mind."

STEP TWO - The second step, is the acceptance and faith in Jesus Christ as your personal Savior, this also takes place in the heart and mind.

STEP THREE - The third step, is something God does—placing within us the gift of His Holy Spirit. When we receive the Gift of the Spirit, a Renewing of the mind takes place. "And be not conformed to this world: but be you transformed by the Renewing of your mind, that you may prove what is that good, and acceptable, and perfect, will of God" (Romans 12:1-2). Therefore, the Spirit of God is the Spirit of a sound mind. "For God has not given us the spirit of fear; but of power, and of love, and of a sound mind" (2 Timothy 1:7).

The apostle Paul mentions three characteristics of the effective Christian. "Power, Love, and a sound mind (wisdom)." These are available to us because the Holy Spirit lives in us. Conversion miraculously puts within us the Mind of Jesus Christ. "Let this mind be in you, which was also in Christ Jesus" (Philippians 2:5).

If we say we follow Christ, we must also say we want to live as He lived. We should develop His attitude of humility as we serve, even when we are not likely to get recognition for our efforts. We cannot perform good works and break God's commandments with impunity. God ordained that we should walk in the footsteps of Christ for we are His workmanship.

We must repent receive God's Spirit, and do the good works that God commands us in His Bible to do. There is "doing" to be done.

If we believe God's word, we will be living within His law. This is a demonstration of our Faith in Christ Jesus. If we fail to obey our Savior, we will be outlaws, saying by our "lack of action, we are faithless."

Jesus holds in high esteem those who obey Him and keep His Father's commandments. "True Repentance," is an ongoing, life-time effort. It is time for all men to come to True Repentance. Ω

10 Facts About Repentance

- 1. Repentance is a change of mind and behavior. Negatively, repentance means turning from sin, which is defined in 1 John 3:4 as "the transgression of the law" (KJV). On the positive side, repentance means turning to righteousness through a life of faith and obedience, the opposite of sin and disobedience.
- 2. The call to repentance is at the heart of the Kingdom message. *Matthew* 4:17
- 3. The message of repentance is essential to the great commission. *Matthew* 28:18-20
- 4. God commands repentance. Acts 17:30
- 5. Repentance is a gift of God. God doesn't force anyone to repent; He simply makes the opportunity to repent available. Acts 5:31, Acts 11:18, 2 Timothy 2:25
- 6. Repentance is the fruit of Godly sorrow. 2 *Corinthians* 7:10
- 7. Repentance is the fruit of God's goodness. *Romans 2:4*, *2 Peter 3:9*
- 8. Repentance is necessary for salvation. *Luke* 13:2, 5, 2 Peter 3:9
- 9. Repentance is inseparable from "Saving Faith." Ephesians 2:8-9, Hebrews 6:1
- 10. Repentance doesn't end with initial conversion. Repentance is a process. It involves continuous introspection, frequent exposure to the Word of God, regular prayer, and perhaps occasional fasting. James 4:7-10
