

T-2 - The Father

DOCTRINAL STATEMENT

Scripture reveals that God is a family, currently consisting of Father and Son. The Father is revealed to mankind as the perfect, Holy, Supreme Sovereign who inhabits eternity. Most references to "God" in the New Testament are references to Him. Jesus introduces and declares the Father to be greater than the Son and teaches us to pray to the Father, knowing the Father hears and answers our prayers.



T-4 - Jesus Christ

DOCTRINAL STATEMENT

Jesus of Nazareth is the Christ, the Son of God, and the Son of Man. He was the prophesied Messiah of the Old Testament and is described in the New Testament as being fully human and fully divine. As the second member of the God family, He has existed throughout eternity as the "Word." He divested Himself of this power and His majesty, and became a human being to die for the sins of all mankind as our loving and merciful Savior. After three days and three nights, He was resurrected to immortality. He ascended to heaven to become our High Priest and will, at some undisclosed date, return to establish the Kingdom of God on earth and rule as King of Kings with His saints forever.

P-Php 2:5-11 Let this mind be in you which was also in Christ Jesus, who, being in the form of God, did not consider it robbery to be equal with God, but made Himself of no reputation, taking the form of a bondservant, and coming in the likeness of men. And being found in appearance as a man, He humbled Himself and became obedient to the point of death, even the death of the cross. Therefore God also has highly exalted Him and given Him the name which is above every name, that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, of those in heaven, and of those on earth, and of those under the earth, and that every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

P- Hebrews 4:14-15 Seeing then that we have a great High Priest who has passed through the heavens, Jesus the Son of God, let us hold fast our confession. For we do not have a High Priest who cannot sympathize with our weaknesses, but was in all points tempted as we are, yet without sin.

DOCTRINAL STATEMENT

The Holy Spirit is the essence, power, mind, and spiritual extension and presence of God. God begets Christians as His sons and daughters through this Spirit. It strengthens a Christian spiritually, converts his mind, and serves as an earnest or guarantee of eternal life. The Spirit is the power by which God will raise His people from the dead and transform them into immortal spirit beings, thus completing the process of conversion.

T-6 - Mankind

DOCTRINAL STATEMENT

The greatest truth of the Bible is that God is reproducing Himself through mankind. Hence, humanity's goal and purpose for existence is, ultimately, to enter God's family and become literal sons of God. Human beings are physical beings with no inherent immortality, but they can receive eternal life as a free gift from God. Man was created by God to be wholly flesh and blood, yet in God's image and with a spiritual component—the "spirit in man"—included in his brain, which together compose the human mind.

P- Psa 8:4 What is man that You are mindful of him, & the son of man that You visit him? For You have made him a little lower than the angels, & You have crowned him with glory & honor...

List of character vices -

- **addiction** a state of physiological or psychological dependence on a potentially harmful drug
- adultery voluntary sexual relations between a married person and somebody other than his or her spouse
- **aggression** threatening behavior or actions
- **alcoholism** dependence on alcohol consumption to an extent that adversely affects social and work-related functioning and produces withdrawal symptoms when intake is stopped or greatly reduced
- anger a strong feeling of grievance and displeasure
- antagonism hostility or hatred causing opposition and ill will
- **arrogance** the act of feeling or showing self-importance and contempt or disregard for others
- avarice an unreasonably strong desire to obtain and keep money
- bias an unfair preference for or dislike of something
- **bigotry** when somebody with strong opinions, especially on politics, religion, or ethnicity, who refuses to accept different views
- **boastfulness** to refer immodestly to possessions or achievements
- bragging to talk with excessive pride about an achievement or possession
- brutality unrelentingly harsh and severe; extremely ruthless or cruel
- callousness showing no concern that other people are or might be hurt or upset
- **chauvinism** unreasoning, overenthusiastic, or aggressive loyalty to a particular gender, group, or cause
- **cheating** to deceive or mislead somebody, especially for personal advantage
- **conceit** a high opinion of your own qualities or abilities, especially one that is not justified
- **condescension** behavior that implies that somebody is graciously lowering himself or herself to the level of people less important or intelligent
- **corruption** dishonest exploitation of power for personal gain; extreme immorality or depravity
- covetousness to have a strong desire to possess something that belongs to somebody else
- cowardice an absence of courage
- **crabbiness** a disposition to be ill-tempered; irritable in character
- crankiness disagreeable and easily irritated or annoyed
- craziness not showing good sense or practicality; one affected by a psychiatric disorder
- cruelty deliberately and remorselessly causing pain or anguish; bringing about pain and distress
- **cupidity** greed, especially for money or possessions
- decadence a state of uninhibited immoral self-indulgence
- deceitfulness intentionally misleading or fraudulent
- **dementedness** completely unreasonable or lacking any sense of the consequences of actions taken; affected by the loss of intellectual functions

- **depressive** to make somebody feel very sad or hopeless
- **despairing** somebody that makes somebody else feel hopeless or exasperated; to feel there is no hope
- discourtesy behavior or an action that is bad-mannered or impolite
- **dishonesty** the use of lies or deceit, or the tendency to be deceitful
- disloyalty a lack of loyalty to a person, vow, organization, or state
- **disrespect** total contempt; to treat another with disregard
- **doubt** to feel unconvinced or uncertain about something, or think that something is unlikely
- **egoism** the practice of making personal welfare and interests a primary or sole concern, sometimes at the expense of others
- **envy** the resentful or unhappy feeling of wanting somebody else's success, good fortune, qualities, or possessions
- **erratic** not predictable, regular, or consistent, especially in being likely to depart from expected standards at any time
- **extremism** the holding of radical political or religious views or the taking of extreme actions on the basis of those views
- faithlessness not believing in a religious faith; not to be trusted or relied on
- **falseness** done with or having the intention of deceiving somebody; treacherous
- **fanaticism** a holder of extreme or irrational enthusiasms or beliefs, especially in religion or politics
- **fearfulness** nervous and easily frightened
- foolishness showing, or resulting from, a lack of good sense or judgment
- fussiness an irritable petulant feeling; unnecessary elaborateness in details
- glumness quietly melancholic or miserable; gloomy ill-tempered

- hastiness to do things or act in a hurry because of impetuosity or lack of time
- **hatred** a feeling of intense hostility towards somebody or something
- haughtiness behaving in a superior, condescending, or arrogant way
- heartlessness having or showing no pity or kindness
- **hedonism** a devotion, especially a self-indulgent one, to pleasure and happiness as a way of life
- hubris excessive pride or arrogance
- **hypocrite** somebody who pretends to have admirable principles, beliefs, or feelings but behaves otherwise
- hysteria being impossible to hold back or control; to be afflicted with a state of extreme
 or exaggerated emotion such as excitement or panic, especially among large numbers of
 people

- idiocy extreme lack of intelligence or foresight
- **idleness** lazy and unwilling to work
- **inanity** meaninglessness or senselessness that suggests a lack of understanding or intelligence
- incompetence lacking the skills, qualities, or ability to do something properly
- indolence lethargic and not showing any interest or making any effort
- infidelity unfaithfulness or disloyalty, especially to a sexual partner
- **inflexibility** firmly established and impossible to change; adhering firmly and stubbornly to a viewpoint or principle
- injustice unfair or unjust treatment of somebody, or an instance of this
- insanity extreme foolishness, or an act that demonstrates such foolishness
- **impatience** tending to be annoyed at being kept waiting or by being delayed; unable to tolerate a particular thing and easily annoyed by it
- impetuosity to act on the spur of the moment, without considering the consequences
- insolence showing a malicious or aggressive lack of deference in speech or behavior
- **intemperance** having or showing a lack of self-control, especially in expressing feelings or satisfying physical desires
- **irritability** easily annoyed or exasperated; extremely sensitive, especially to aggravation
- **jealousy** to feel bitter and unhappy because of another's advantages, possessions, or luck; to feel suspicious about a rival's or competitor's influence, especially in regard to a loved one
- **languor** a pleasant feeling of weariness or weakness; listlessness and indifference in speech or behavior
- lavishness given or produced in abundance or to excess
- laziness unwilling to do any work or make an effort
- **lethargy** a state of physical slowness and mental dullness resulting from tiredness, disease, or drugs
- liar someone who does not tell the truth
- **licentiousness** pursuing desires aggressively and selfishly, unchecked by morality, especially in sexual matters
- **lunacy** behavior that is regarded as unintelligent, inconsiderate, or misguided, or an example of it
- **lust** the strong physical desire to have sex with somebody, usually without associated feelings of love or affection
- madness rash or thoughtless behavior
- malice the intention or desire to cause harm or pain to somebody; or to wish for someone to feel pain
- manipulative using clever, devious ways to control or influence somebody or something
- melancholic feeling or tending to feel a thoughtful or gentle sadness
- mercilessness very harsh in the judgment and treatment of others; showing no compassion toward somebody or something; to continue at a high level of violence or unpleasantness without pause or relief

- **misogyny** a hatred of women, as a sexually defined group
- moroseness deep sadness; showing a brooding ill humor
- **moodiness** having temperamental and changeable moods; tending to change mood unpredictably from cheerful to bad-tempered
- murderous capable of, guilty of, or likely to commit murder
- **narcissism** excessive self-admiration and self-centeredness; overestimation of one's own appearance and abilities and an excessive need for admiration
- **obduracy** stubbornly persistent in wrongdoing; not repentant
- **obsessive** a particular action or thing occupies one's thoughts constantly and exclusively; worrying compulsively about something or things generally
- **obstinacy** stubbornly adhering to an opinion, purpose, or course, usually with implied unreasonableness
- **offensiveness** causing anger, resentment, or moral outrage, sometimes to the point of physical repugnance
- **perversion** deviating greatly from what is accepted as right, normal, or proper, relating specifically to sexual activities considered unusual or unacceptable
- **petulance** ill-tempered or sulky in a peevish manner
- pitilessness showing no mercy or compassion for the suffering of others
- **pomposity** an excessive sense of self-importance, usually displayed through exaggerated seriousness or stateliness in speech and manner
- **pride** a haughty attitude shown by somebody who believes, often unjustifiably, that he or she is better than others
- **prejudice** an unfounded hatred, fear, or mistrust of a person or group, especially one of a particular religion, ethnicity, nationality, sexual preference, or social status
- preposterousness going very much against what is thought to be sensible or reasonable
- **pretentiousness** acting as though more important or special than is warranted, or appearing to have an unrealistically high self-image
- **profligacy** extremely extravagant or wasteful
- **promiscuity** behavior characterized by casual and indiscriminate sexual intercourse, often with many people
- rage sudden and extreme anger
- **rashness** acting with, resulting from, or characteristic of thoughtless, impetuous behavior
- **recklessness** marked by a lack of thought about danger or other possible undesirable consequences
- **resentfulness** annoyed or bitter about having been badly treated, or characterized by such a feeling of annoyance
- rowdiness a rough and noisy person who often causes disturbances
- **rudeness** disagreeable or discourteous in manner or action; offensive to accepted standards of decency
- ruthlessness having or showing no pity or mercy
- **secrecy** unwillingness to reveal information
- self-importance an unrealistically high evaluation of your own importance or worth
- self-indulgence lack of self-control in pursuing your own pleasure or satisfaction


- self-pity the self-indulgent belief that your life is harder and sadder than everyone else's
- selfishness concerned with your own interests, needs, and wishes while ignoring those
 of others
- **senselessness** apparently or really without purpose or meaning; demonstrating a lack of reason and intelligence

- **sloth** a dislike of work or any kind of physical exertion
- snobbishness displaying an offensively superior condescending manner
- spite a malicious, usually small-minded desire to harm or humiliate somebody

- **sulkiness** a sullen moody resentful disposition; in a bad mood and refusing to communicate because of resentment for a real or imagined grievance

- **tetchiness** oversensitive and easily upset or annoyed
- thieving to steal something, or steal things
- **thoughtlessness** showing a lack of planning or forethought; showing a lack of consideration for other people or for consequences
- **treasonous** one willing to betray the allegiance owed by somebody to his or her own country
- **triteness** one who overuses common phrases or conversation topics and consequently makes them lack in interest or originality
- tricky likely to cheat or outwit somebody
- **twisted** morally unacceptable; badly affected by unpleasant experiences or constant disappointment
- **unfaithfulness** engaging in sexual relations with somebody other than a spouse or partner; untrue to commitments, duties, beliefs, or ideals
- unloving not giving or reciprocating affection
- untrustworthiness the trait of not deserving trust or confidence
- vainglory excessive pride in or boastfulness about personal abilities or achievements
- vanity excessive pride, especially in personal appearance
- vengeful having or showing a strong desire for revenge
- voracity unusually eager or enthusiastic about an activity
- wastefulness using resources unwisely
- weakness lack of strength, power, or determination






DOCTRINAL STATEMENT

DOCTRINAL STATEMENT

Mankind's hope and the promise to the Christian is the resurrection from the dead. The Bible refers to

- (1) the resurrection of Jesus Christ, the firstborn from the dead and the pioneer of our salvation;
- (2) the resurrection of the saints—called the "first resurrection"—at the return of Christ when the true believers shall become spirit-composed members of God's family;
- (3) the resurrection back to physical life of all who have ever died without having understood God's way, for their first opportunity for salvation;
- (4) the resurrection of the incorrigibly wicked—those who have refused to repent and have rejected God's way—to be consumed in the lake of fire (called the "second death").

The fellowship of the brethren builds spiritual strength into both the individual and the Church as a whole. Conversely, the Church may exercise its right to disfellowship one who, by obvious attitude or action, opposes the gospel or causes disruption among the membership.

DOCTRINAL STATEMENT

Many of the teachings and practices of traditional Christian churches are incompatible with biblically based doctrine. While the sincerity or motives of those who hold these beliefs is not questioned, it is essential this systematic theology plainly states the teachings on these traditional Christian subjects contrasted with what the Church of God International teaches as original biblical truth.

sT-35a - x-The Fall of Man

DOCTRINAL STATEMENT

The Augustinian view—that man fell from the height of glory/perfection to the lowest depths of depravity (with total inability to choose God's way) is clearly unbiblical. Adam and Eve did not fall from any state of moral or spiritual perfection. Neither has the sin they committed been inherited by all mankind from birth (the so-called "original sin"). Rather, Adam and Eve were created morally and spiritually neutral, not yet having developed character or having done any evil.

Human beings are not born with an evil nature; they become sinful, to one degree or another, through allowing the evil forces that permeate the world to influence their thoughts and their choices in life.

It was actually Satan who had fallen from his position of glory and committed the "original sin." It was Satan who then influenced Eve, Adam, and thereafter all mankind to follow the same path.

sT-35b - x-The Immortal Soul

DOCTRINAL STATEMENT

Man neither is nor has an immortal soul. The traditional concept of an immortal soul, a spiritual entity or substance with fully independent existence and consciousness, which is so fundamental to various religious systems, is a myth. Man is a totally mortal, finite, living-

breathing creature who has no consciousness, no awareness, and no existence after death. In this regard humans and animals are alike—the same death befalls them both. The one element that sets man apart from animals is not an "immortal soul" but a spiritual essence—a "spiritin—man"—which transforms the human brain into the human mind. Man indeed has the potential for immortality, but this will occur only in the future at the resurrection from the dead when immortal life will be freely gifted from God through the Holy Spirit.

sT-35c - x-Heaven

DOCTRINAL STATEMENT

The reward of the saved is not "going to heaven" at death. No conscious human beings have ever ascended into the heavens after death (except Jesus Christ). Man's destiny is to enter God's Family as His sons and daughters and to rule in His Kingdom, which will be set up on earth. The dead in Christ "rest" in their graves until the resurrection when God will bring them into His Family. Eventually, when the new heaven and new earth of Revelation 21 comes, which also brings New Jerusalem to earth from God out of heaven, God the Father's dwelling and throne will be forever with man. In this light, the question of "going to heaven" becomes meaningless, for heaven will then be on earth, which will be the final home of both God the Father and Christ the Son.

*sT-35d – x-Hell*DOCTRINAL STATEMENT

The belief in an ever-burning hell, where sinners are tormented for eternity is not substantiated by the Bible. Such relentless anguish and eternal suffering is diametrically contrary to the character of a merciful, loving God. The punishment for rebellion against God will be a final destruction in the lake of fire, but this will produce death and nonexistence, not eternal torment. There is a clear difference between eternal punishment and eternal punishing. Except when used in a figurative sense, the Greek and Hebrew words translated "hell" in English versions of the Bible mean either the "grave" in which corpses are buried, a place of restraint for fallen angels, or a temporary fire that burned rubbish near Jerusalem. Christ used the last as an analogy of the lake of fire, which will ultimately consume the wicked.

sT-35e - x-Trinity

DOCTRINAL STATEMENT

The concept of a closed or restricted Godhead composed of three persons—the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit—is non-biblical. The Godhead is a Family, presently revealed as composed of only the Father and the Son, which will eventually include all those who have been given salvation through Christ. The Holy Spirit is not a distinct person or individual entity but the power, mind, and essence of God.

*sT-35f – x-Gospel*16*DOCTRINAL STATEMENT

The gospel is more than just a message about Jesus Christ. The true gospel involves an understanding of the person of Christ, but its main thrust is the "good news" that Jesus Christ brought. This includes the witness and warning announcement that mankind is about to self-destruct, but God will save humanity from this certain self-destruction by setting up His Kingdom on earth through Jesus Christ's return as King of kings. Also fundamental to the gospel that Jesus brought is the revelation of the way by which human beings may be part of that Kingdom and rule with Him—the revelation of how to obtain salvation. This process of salvation through Christ's death and resurrection begins with obedience to Jesus' command, "Repent, for the Kingdom of heaven is at hand."

DOCTRINAL STATEMENT

The Kingdom of God is not simply heaven, nor is it the Church on earth today, nor is it a spiritual kingdom within men's hearts. The Kingdom of God is a world-ruling government (with laws, a king and rulers, territory, and subjects) to be set up on earth at Christ's return and will continue thereafter, on out into eternity. The Kingdom of God is also the Family of God into which man can be born again. The Family of God constitutes that Kingdom.

sT-35h - x-Born Again

DOCTRINAL STATEMENT

The term "born again" (as used in John 3) is not synonymous with the immediate spiritual, mental, or emotional change (sometimes called "regeneration") one undergoes by accepting Christ or being baptized. What Jesus explained to Nicodemus using the term "born again" refers to the actual change from a physical body (and existence) to a spiritual body (and existence) that occurs at the resurrection to eternal life and not before. To avoid confusion of the point Jesus was making to Nicodemus, the Church of God uses terms (other than "born again") to describe a Christian being begotten with the Holy Spirit at baptism and the symbolic "new life" they lead.

sT-35i – x-Sunday DOCTRINAL STATEMENT No biblical justification exists for observing the first day of the week; Sunday is nowhere sanctified in the Bible, nor is any special honor or significance ascribed to it. The seventh-day Sabbath was God's holy day from Creation and was kept by the early apostolic Church, and is kept by God's Church today. After all, to remember the Sabbath day and keep it holy is to obey the Fourth of the Ten Commandments.

sT-35j – x-Christmas

DOCTRINAL STATEMENT

Christmas is neither Christ's birthday nor a celebration Christians should observe. It is not mentioned in the Bible and in no way is an original Christian practice. As any encyclopedia will confirm, Christmas is an ancient pagan celebration, which predated Christianity, but was renamed and given new meaning when it was adopted into the professing Roman Universal (Catholic) Christian Churches. The Church of God movement recognizes references such as Jeremiah 10 are specifically about "idol worship" (rather than a Christmas tree tradition), but the curious practices today of yule logs, wreaths, and decorating Christmas trees is foreign to Scripture and more akin to characteristics of ancient sun worship and tree worship via evergreens.

sT-35k - x-Easter

DOCTRINAL STATEMENT

As any encyclopedia will note, Easter is an adaptation of an ancient, pagan, pre-Christian festival for celebration, which was adopted by traditional Christianity in place of the biblical Passover. Easter is nowhere mentioned in the Bible as a Christian holiday. Instead, the Passover

should be properly observed on the correct date in accordance with Christ's example and Paul's instructions. The Church of God recognizes that references such as Ezekiel 8 are specifically about "sun worship" (rather than an Easter sunrise service tradition), but the curious practices today of eggs, bunnies, candles, and sunrise services are foreign to Scripture and more akin to characteristics of ancient sun worship and spring fertility festivals.

sT-35l – x-The Rapture

DOCTRINAL STATEMENT

The doctrine of a secret rapture during which Christ will clandestinely return to catch away the saints from the earth, protecting them from the great tribulation, is not biblical. It is neither taught nor mentioned in the New Testament. Christ will indeed come back to this earth, but it will be only once, with power and full glory, and will be totally visible to all human beings. This will occur at the final trumpet blast, concomitant with the first resurrection, which is after the great tribulation, and just after the seventh and last plague.

sT-35m – x-The Lord's Prayer

DOCTRINAL STATEMENT

Repetitious recitations of the Lord's Prayer are not practiced as a Christian custom. Jesus admonished His disciples not to repeat ritualistic prayers over and over again to God, but rather pray from a fully active mind and heart. His sample prayer in Matthew 6:9–15 was given as an outline for prayer, showing His disciples how to pray and what to pray for and about. It's a template and is not intended to be repeated repetitiously like some superstitious mantra.

sT-35n - x-Predestination

DOCTRINAL STATEMENT

God has not predetermined, nor can He even know in advance, whether or not a person will yield himself to God, strive for perfection, and succeed in entering into His Kingdom. God has predestined that He will give human beings the opportunity to conform to the image of His Son if they decide to do so. God has also predestined that He would choose a certain group in this end time to fulfill His commission and qualify for His Kingdom now. Thus predestination refers solely to the time of one's calling, when God decides to open a person's mind to His truth, thereby giving him an opportunity for salvation.

sT-35o - x-Speaking in Tongues

DOCTRINAL STATEMENT

The biblical occurrences of "speaking in tongues" are neither the phenomenon often seen in charismatic circles nor a sign by which one judges whether God has begotten a person by His Holy Spirit. In complete contrast to the unintelligible verbal utterances of certain groups, for one to biblically "speak in tongues" means God has supernaturally given the gift of speaking in an actual foreign language to that person as a sign.

Mark 16:17; Acts 2:7–11; 1 Corinthians 12:28, 30

sT-35p - x-Law & Grace

DOCTRINAL STATEMENT

To be "under grace" does not mean a person may disregard or disobey God's law by assuming Christ has "fulfilled" the law for him or that Christ must always forgive him. Grace is "favor" from God, unmerited pardon for sins that are past, granted because of His mercy and forgiveness. Grace in no way gives one license to disobey God. Man must keep God's commandments to be a true Christian. Salvation cannot be earned. It is a free gift that requires law (which defines sin), grace (which is the forgiveness of sin), and faith in God. Good works are a consequence of that living faith.

sT-35q - x-Infant Baptism

DOCTRINAL STATEMENT

The practice of infant baptism is not supported by biblical principle. Since persons are not born with "original sin" there is no need for them to be baptized in childhood. For one to be truly ready for the baptism described in the New Testament, one must be sufficiently mature to understand the Bible, believe in Jesus Christ, and be capable of real repentance.

DOCTRINAL STATEMENT

The traditional Christian practices of baptism by any method other than immersion—such as sprinkling, pouring, etc.—is not in accord with the teachings of the New Testament, indeed the symbolism likening baptism to the death of the "old" man, being buried with Christ, can be fully expressed only by total immersion in water.

sT-35s - x-Penance

DOCTRINAL STATEMENT

God does not require penance, an imposed system of physical works, undertaken as punishment in token of penitence for sin. God totally forgives the sinner upon true repentance and acceptance of Christ's sacrifice as full payment for the penalty of sin. True repentance is toward God alone, and He demands no external manifestation before men. To repent is to reform both disposition (qualities of one's mind and character) and behavior. Scripture is also clear that repentance to God is not complete until a sinner does all he or she can to make things right with those impacted.

sT-35t - x-Eternal Security

DOCTRINAL STATEMENT

The belief that a person, once converted, can never lose out on salvation is biblically unfounded. God wants us to grow in grace, knowledge, and character, and He gives us the free moral agency necessary. Christians are thereby not saved in the ultimate sense until they have been finally born into God's Kingdom at the resurrection. While still living, Christians can have confidence and assurance of their salvation, with the understanding they can choose to lose their salvation by willfully rejecting God's way. Only at the resurrection or at death (whichever comes first), is the true Christian eternally secure.

sT-35u - x-Universalism

DOCTRINAL STATEMENT

It is possible for human beings to reject God's truth, salvation, and thus be denied entry into God's Kingdom. The ultimate reconciliation of all humans and creatures to God is not taught in the Bible. If it were impossible to cast aside and renounce God, this would destroy the free moral agency crucially essential for building the character of God. God's will is that all men come to the knowledge of the truth and be saved. However, all will not choose to follow God and be granted salvation, though biblical indications are that the vast majority will joyously do so. Those who remain unrepentant will be consumed in the lake of fire.

sT-35v - x-The Church*

DOCTRINAL STATEMENT

A church is not, except in extended usage, a building or an edifice. It is rather the people who comprise the congregation, the collective "body of Christ," the group of called out believing Christians in whom God's Holy Spirit dwells. It can be applied to Christians as a whole or to an individual congregation.

sT-35w - x-The Cross

The use of crosses, crucifixes, or the "sign of the cross" in prayer or worship is non-biblical and non-efficacious in a Christian's relationship with God and Christ. The image of a cross has no intrinsic spiritual value and apparently originated in non- Christian religions; for these reasons it is avoided. God instructs His people to worship Him without such external devices. Furthermore, a case can be made that He was crucified on a stake, tree, or pole (Greek: stauros), not a crux, meaning cross, which was used in the Latin Vulgate to describe the instrument used to crucify Christ. The cross was an ancient Chaldean pagan symbol.

sT-35x-x-Pictures of Jesus

DOCTRINAL STATEMENT

We do not know what Jesus looked like, and we should not make worshipful use of His pictures if we did. The pictures most often purporting to represent His face are mythical, inaccurate, and unbiblical, and are the product of mere human imagination. The use of any picture as a religious crutch breaks the spirit of the second commandment.

sT-35y - x-Religious Medals/Statues

DOCTRINAL STATEMENT

For man to make, venerate or use as reminders in worship such things as medals, statues, or images of "God" is forbidden by the second commandment. Man has direct access to God through Christ and needs no other intercessor or aid—no "holy" object or "holy" person—in personal worship.

Exodus 20:4-6; 2 Kings 17:15; Exodus 32:5-6, 20

sT-35z - x-Ministerial/Religious Titles

DOCTRINAL STATEMENT

The use of religious titles that rightfully belong only to God, such as "Reverend" or "Father," are avoided for ministers. Respect for a person's office does not depend upon what title he uses. The Bible says, "Holy and Reverend is His [God's] name," not the name of any man.

sT-35aa - x-Faith Healing

DOCTRINAL STATEMENT

The attempt to promote faith healing as a public spectacle in a carnival-like atmosphere is contrary to both the example and intent of Scripture. Christ and the apostles healed as a witness to their preaching of the gospel, but today miraculous healings usually take place in a private and personal way.

James 4:15; 5:14-15; Luke 8:52-56; 2 Kings 5:10-14

sT-35ab - x-Abstinence/Asceticism

DOCTRINAL STATEMENT

The ascetic way of life is not taught as the biblical ideal. The total avoidance of certain physical pleasures such as drinking alcoholic beverages or having sexual relations within marriage is not biblically commanded. (Drinking alcohol in excess or participating in sexual behavior outside of marriage is strictly and forcibly condemned.) The Bible does allow, and even encourages, the proper moderate use of the many physical pleasures of life, which God created for man's enjoyment. Scripture also shows that a tool such as fasting can be used, not because God likes to see "suffering," but because it can help promote a humble attitude in us, to see how great God is, and how comparatively weak and dependent mankind is, on simple things like food. This should also help us to recognize and appreciate the plan of salvation God is offering that affords us eternal life as embodied spirit beings in His Kingdom.
