When I asked "the Internet" What is the **most relevant** verse in the Bible?

<u>2 Timothy 3:14-15</u> You, however, continue in the things you have **learned** & become **convinced** of, knowing from **whom** you have learned them, and that **from childhood** you have known the <u>sacred writings</u> which are able to give you the **wisdom** that leads to **salvation** through **faith** which is in **Christ Jesus**.

Interesting Facts ...

- The Bible has been a massive influence on literature and history, especially in the Western World, where the Gutenberg Bible was the first book printed using movable type.
- According to the March 2007 edition of <u>Time Magazine</u>, the Bible "has done more to shape literature, history, entertainment, and culture than any book ever written. Its influence on world history is unparalleled, and shows no signs of abating."
- With estimated total sales of over 5 billion copies, it is widely considered to be the most influential and bestselling book of all time.
- As of the 2000s, it sells approximately 100 million copies annually.—Wikipedia

Did Jesus (& others) emphasize the importance of written scripture vs Oral tradition?

- 127 verses in the New Testament reference "it is written"
 - Mat_4:4 But He answered and said, "It is written, 'MAN SHALL NOT LIVE BY BREAD ALONE, BUT BY EVERY WORD THAT PROCEEDS FROM THE MOUTH OF GOD.' "
- Jesus also referred to tiny WRITTEN punctuation marks when establishing truth it is too easy for mankind to lie (or be sincerely mistaken with oral tradition) writing has permanence hence the 10 Commandments were written with the finger of God!


<u>Mat_5:18</u> For assuredly, I say to you, till heaven and earth pass away, one <u>jot</u> or one <u>tittle</u> will by no means pass from the law till all is fulfilled.

Clearly, there is a **difference** between **reading** the Bible and **studying** the Scriptures.

- **Reading** the Bible (or listening to an audiobook) is no different to reading a novel if you are only interested in the story and is also good for "reminder oriented" review
- When you **study** the Scriptures, you are not just interested in the stories but also in the divine teachings, promises and messages it carries.

I Knew That!

- The Holy Bible has been translated into **2,018 languages**, with countless more partial translations, and audio translations (for unwritten languages). (This is an enormous amount of translations. In comparison, Shakespeare, considered by many to be the master writer of the English language, has only been translated into **50** languages.) In 2023 there are 195 countries in the world
- It was written over a period of some 1,500 years, from around 1450 B.C. (the time of Moses) to about 100 A.D. (following the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ).
- The Bible was written under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit by over 40 different authors from all walks of life: shepherds, farmers, tent-makers, physicians, fishermen, priests, philosophers and kings. Despite these differences in occupation and the span of years it took to write it, the Bible is an extremely cohesive and unified book.





7 Important Reasons Why We Should Study The Scriptures

1. To Truly Know God

Isa 45:15 Truly You are God, who hide Yourself, O God of Israel, the Savior!

Jer 9:23-24 Thus says the LORD: "Let not the **wise** man glory in his wisdom, Let not the **mighty** man glory in his might, Nor let the **rich** man glory in his riches; But let him who glories glory in this,

That he <u>understands and knows</u> Me, That I am the LORD, exercising **lovingkindness**, **judgment**, and **righteousness** in the earth. For in these I delight," says the LORD.

Joe 2:13 So rend your heart, and not your garments; Return to the LORD your God, For He is **gracious** and **merciful**, **Slow to anger**, and of great **kindness**; And He **relents** from doing harm.

2. To Teach And Defend Our Christian Doctrine

Act_17:11 These (*Bereans*) were more fair-minded than those in Thessalonica, in that they received the (*preached*) word with all readiness, and searched the Scriptures daily to find out whether these things were so.

2Ti 2:15 Study to shew thyself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth.

2Ti 3:16-17 All Scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness, that the man of God may be complete, **thoroughly equipped** for every good work.

Eph 6:17 And take the helmet of salvation, and the **sword of the Spirit**, which is the **word of God**;



3. It Helps us Fight Temptation

Psa 119:11 Your word I have hidden in my heart, That I might not sin against You.

Mat 4:10 Then Jesus said to him, "Away with you, Satan! For it is written, 'YOU SHALL WORSHIP THE LORD YOUR GOD, AND HIM ONLY YOU SHALL SERVE.' "

4. It Gives us Direction

Psa_119:105 Your word is a lamp to my feet And a light to my path.

Jer_10:23 O LORD, I know the way of man is not in himself; It is not in man who walks to direct his own steps.



Joh 5:39-40 You search the Scriptures, for in them you think you have eternal life; & these are they which testify of Me. But you are not willing to come to Me that you may have life.

5. Gives Wisdom

Psa 119:42 So shall I have an answer for him who reproaches me, For I trust in Your word.

Pro 9:9 Give **instruction** to a wise man, and he will be still **wiser**; Teach a just man, and he will **increase** in learning.

6. For Discernment

Heb 4:12 For the **word of God** is living and powerful, and sharper than any two-edged sword, piercing even to the division of soul and spirit, and of joints and marrow, and is a **discerner** of the **thoughts and intents of the heart**.

1Ki 3:9 Therefore give to Your servant an understanding heart to judge Your people, that I may <u>discern between good and evil</u>. For who is able to judge this great people of Yours?"

1Co 2:14 But the natural man does not receive **the things of the Spirit of God**, for they are foolishness to him; nor can he know them, because they are **spiritually discerned**.

7. Nourishes Us For Spiritual Growth

Rom 15:4 For whatever things were **written** before were written **for our learning**, that we through the **patience** & **comfort** of the Scriptures might have **hope**.

Col 1:9-10 For this reason we also, since the day we heard it, do not cease to pray for you, and to ask that you may be **filled** with the knowledge of His will in all wisdom and **spiritual understanding**; that you may walk worthy of the Lord, fully pleasing Him, being **fruitful** in every good work and **increasing** in the **knowledge of God**;

It is important (& Motivating) to understand <u>WHY</u> Bible fluency is important...
... But <u>HAVING</u> Bible fluency is the target of this "Critical Success Factor"









• Theme of The Covenant God & His Relationship with Israel



Eze 16:62 And I will establish My covenant with you. Then you shall know that I am the LORD.


• Theme of Sin, it's Consequences, & Christian Virtue ... as ways of living
