


Making faces



Materials:

- · Lunch bags
- · colored construction paper
 - Crayons, markers,
 or colored pencils
 - · Tape or glue
 - · Scissors
 - · Yarn


Directions:

Using the patterns or make your own facial parts and accessories or use construction paper. Cut them out and glue them onto lunch bag. Glue on some yarn for the hair. Enjoy the puppet!

Use your imagination! You can make animal faces too!



Don't Rock the Boat



Directions: Using construction paper and tongue depressors let your students make boats and fishermen:

- Make a pattern for the boat—or precut a "boat" for each student
- •Give each student two tongue depressors
- one sheet of dark blue construction paper for the water

Let children draw faces on tongue depressors (surprised, happy, scared, etc.).

Glue depressors to dark blue construction paper.


Cut out the boat from a different color of construction paper. Glue over the wooden "fishermen"

A Taste of Passover





Materials:

1 Cup of whole wheat flour
1/4 teaspoon of salt
1/4 teaspoon of cumin or coriander
1/2 Cup of water

Directions:

Have child(ren) help mix this bread. Let each ingredient be added. Mix well and turn onto a lightly floured board. Knead for five minutes. Divide the dough into three balls and flatten each into a circle.

Place on a hot griddle, turn when lightly browned. Cool on paper towels.

Shaped with Milk



Materials:


1 Cup of milk (240 ml)
5 Tablespoons of vinegar
A small pan

Directions:

Warm the milk in a saucepan. Stir in the vinegar. The liquid will become a rubbery blob. Wash off the blob and shape as you wish. It will harden in a few hours. (Plastics were originally made from milk and plants). They were biodegradable, unlike the petroleum plastics of today which do not decompose.



Sad to Happy fella



Materials:

paper plates
wooden depressors or paint stirrers
colored yarn (red or yellow)

·water based colored markers

Directions: Have students use colored markers to make a happy face on one plate and a sad face on the other. Cut yarn and glue in position for hair on both plates. Glue the tongue depressor on the back and bottom of "face." Run a bead of white glue around the outside edge of paper plate; press second paper plate into the corresponding position on the back side with tongue depressor attached.
