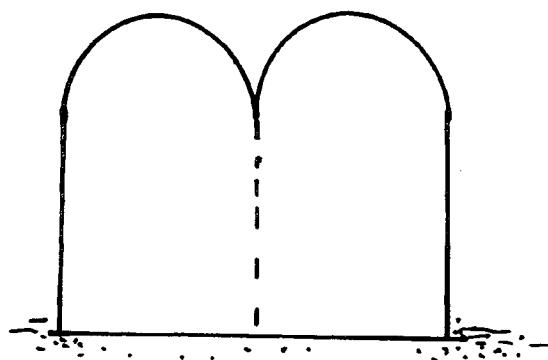
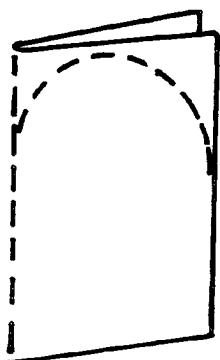


# Crafty Ideas

## The Law in Stone



### Materials To Use:

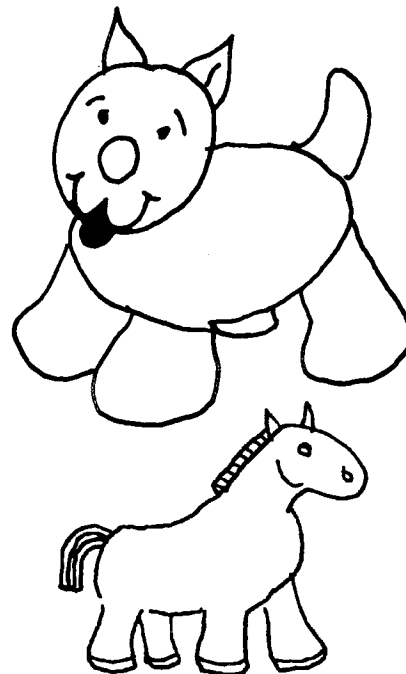
- Brown Grocery Bag or construction paper
- scissors
- markers or crayons

### Directions:

Cut a panel out of the bag. Fold in half. Cut out "tablet."

On the outside let the student decorate. Inside let the student write the Ten Commandments.

## The Potter's Clay



### Materials To Use:

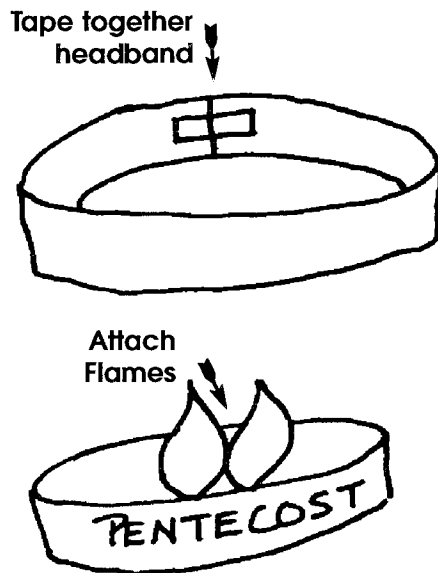
- 2 Cups water
- 2 Cups all-purpose flour
- 1 Cup salt
- 4 Tablespoons Vegetable Oil
- 2 packages of Kool-Aid

**Directions:** Combine ingredients in a pan and heat over medium heat until mixture starts to thicken. Pour into a bowl to cool. When mixture can be handled with comfort seal in airtight containers or storage bags. The Kool-Aid makes the dough smell nice and the different flavors add nice color.

Reconstitute dough with a few drops of water if dough begins to dry out.

# Crafty Ideas

## Tongues of Fire



### Materials:

- construction paper—blue, yellow, and red
- tape, or glue
- colored markers
- gold or red glitter (optional)

### Directions:

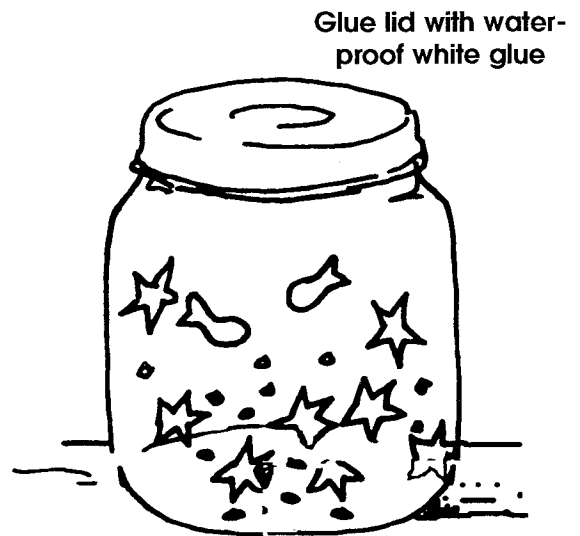
Have students cut a headband two inches wide and long enough to reach around their head. Write "On the Day of Pentecost on the head band. Tape the ends together.

Cut the flames out of the red and yellow construction paper. Glue or tape to headband.

Outline flame in glitter (optional).

Discuss this special day.

## Weight For Me!



### Materials:

- clean baby food jars (or pimienta, etc.) with lids.
- white water-proof glue
- glitter, stars, plastic items, etc.

### Directions:

Collect empty baby food jars. Clean thoroughly and remove labels.

Place bright colorful sequins, glitter, confetti, or other items that you think will be colorful in the jar. Or use small plastic items, shells, fish, etc.

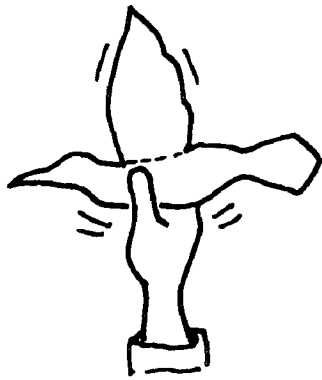
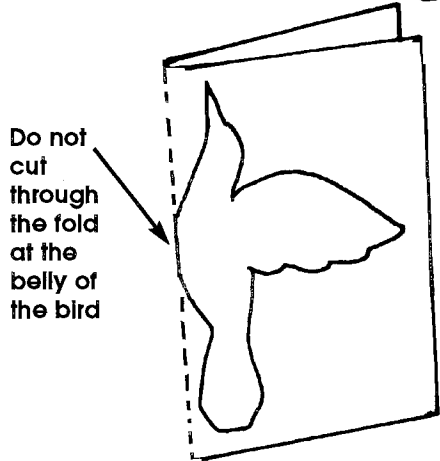
Fill within 1/2 inch of the top with water.

Secure lid with waterproof glue.

Tie a bright ribbon around the top and give to someone who loves you.

## Go Find Elijah



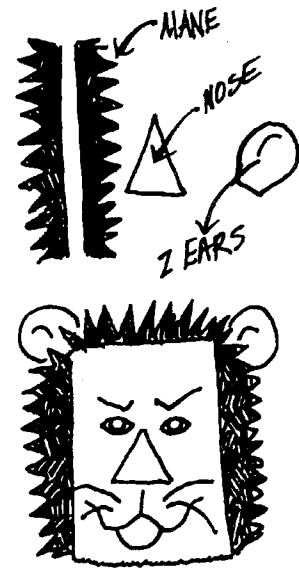
### Materials To Use:

- Black or dark blue construction paper
- scissors
- Glue

### Directions:

Fold the sheet in half and cut out the raven for each child (place the fold at the belly of the bird—do not cut along the bottom of the bird's body). Color an eye for the bird. Gently fold down the wings of the bird and, holding the bird by its belly, let the child move the bird up and down to move the wings.

## Lion Around



### Materials To Use:

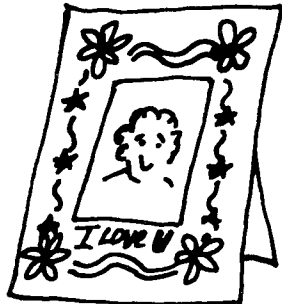
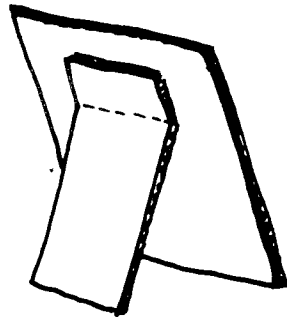
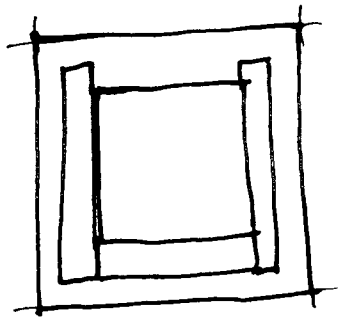
- small lunch bag for each student
- black and brown construction paper for ears, nose, and mane
- Crayons, felt-tip markers, or colored pencils
- white glue or paste
- scissors
- red or yellow Yarn for whiskers

### Directions:

Lay the paper bag flat to assemble. Glue the ears, nose, and the mane strips cut from the construction paper onto the bag. Use markers to create the facial features (eyes and mouth). Glue short pieces of brightly colored yarn around the muzzle for whiskers. When the puppet is dry you have a "fierce" lion!

# Crafty Ideas

## I've Been Framed!



### Materials:

- 12 inch-square of corrugated cardboard
- pencil and ruler
- craft knife
- Glue or rubber cement
- paints, markers, buttons shells, small trinkets, glitter, puff paint, etc.

### Directions:

Cut from the cardboard the following: (2) 6"x8" pieces; (2) 1"x6" pieces; (1) 2"x5" piece. In the center of one of the 6"x8" pieces, mark off a 3 3/4"x5 3/4" opening for the photo and cut it out with a craft knife (*Cutting done by adults only. To find the center lightly mark a line from corner to opposite corner. Where the lines cross center your measurement.*)

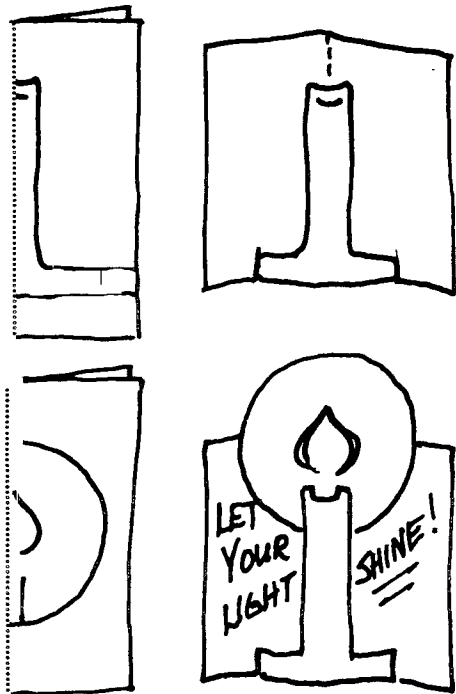
With the frame face down glue the 1"x6" strips 1/8" from frame opening (on the right, left, and bottom of the picture opening), to form a pocket for the photo.

Bend the 2"x5" piece of cardboard about an inch from one end. Glue to the second 6"x8" rectangle approximately 1" from the top (see example).

Decorate the front of the frame and when completed glue the back to the pocket strips. Slip the photo in and give to someone special.

# Crafty Ideas

## Shine Your Light



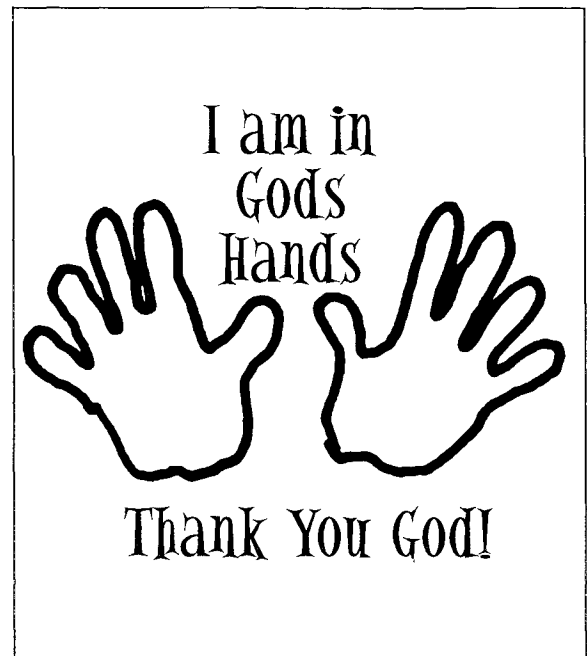
### Materials To Use:

- Yellow, dark Blue, & red construction paper
- felt-tip pens
- Scissors
- gold glitter (optional)

### Directions:

Fold the blue paper in half and cut out the candlestick (note: slits). 2. Fold and cut the flame out of the yellow paper;. 3. Use the red paper for the background: fold in half; cut a 1/2 inch-long slit at the bottom about 3 inches from the fold. Have the children write the memory verse onto the sheet. The flame can be decorated with glitter if desired. Assemble the candlestick to the flame, and attach to the background.

## A Good Place



### Materials To Use:

- Lightweight 6 x 7 poster board for each student
- washable finger paint (or trace outlines of hands)
- Colored markers or crayons

### Directions:

With the poster board laying flat, have student place each hand that has been dipped into the finger paint with hands on the cardboard with thumbs touching in the middle. Or trace each hand with colored pens or crayons.

Within the hands have the student write—or write for them—"I Am in God's Hands," or their name.
