



Make a Joyful Noise









Use metal shakers with rice, beans, or small aquarium gravel inside

Wood blocks covered with strips
OF sandpaper; attach spools

Use your imagination (and some common-sense safety guidelines) as you turn everyday household items into musical instruments for your students enjoyment.


Either let the children help assemble the instruments or decorate them.

Directions:


Precut frogs from colored construction paper, Have students use felt pen to write "I will keep my eyes on Jesus" on the back of frog. Glue the wiggle eyes on the frog.

Attach each frog piece with glue to the clothespin (clip-end of clothespin to the top of the head). Affix the magnet on the backside with glue.

Directions:

On a piano or keyboard, number the notes C-A as 1-6. Let the children follow the numbers to play the song. Sing a second stanza to the song using the words "God is always near" for the third and fourth lines of the song.

To make a homemade xylophone, fill six drinking glass with varying amounts of water. Tap the glasses gently with a spoon to play them. Adjust the amounts of water to create a do-re-me-fa-so-la scale. Number the glasses 1-6.
