## JA Reflection of JESUS

s we teach our children about the things of God we can help them become aware of the foundations of godly behavior. We can prevent confusion and frustration by helping them understand what God requires of us; they need to know the rules.

Fortunately, God keeps the rules pretty simple—love Him, love others. He not only gives this code of conduct (the Ten Commandments), but will help the humble heart to understand that His commandments are genuinely holy, just, and good—just like Him.

And the second is like it: Love your neighbor as yourself." (Matthew 22:37–39). Jesus truly fulfilled the spirit of this great law of love by His life.

Applying these principles to our lives is a lifetime process. We need to "personalize" them—absorb them into our hearts and minds in order to introduce them into action. As a teacher of God's Word use the certificates to "Make it Personal."
